

FROM THE RABBI

Steven C. Kane



As most of you are aware I have spent the last two and a half years studying with 28 other select colleagues throughout the United States at the Shalom Hartman Institute's Rabbinic Leadership Initiative (RLI). Next summer I will conclude the program and become a Senior Rabbinic Fellow of the Hartman Institute. There are many things that make the RLI the preeminent program for continuing education for ordained rabbis, but chief among them is the exposure we have received to some of the greatest scholars and teachers in the Jewish world. Each teacher is a leading thinker or author in their field, be it Bible, Rabbinics, philosophy or Israel. One of the goals of the Hartman Institute is to try and bridge the growing gap between Israeli and diaspora Jews, particularly American Jews. This is accomplished through the dissemination to our congregations of information we have been exposed to, and bringing the iEngage series to synagogues, as we did at CSI last spring.

One of my main teachers about both the history of modern Israel and an understanding of the current political situation is Tal Becker, who is also featured prominently in the videos from the iEngage series. For the past two years I have been attempting to get Tal to come to CSI, but it was only this December that his schedule was open enough to bring him here for our **Scholar in Residence Shabbat, December 7-8**.

We are very fortunate to have Tal Becker for three lectures. We neither view Israel as our parents or our grandparents generation did, nor do our children have the same views as we do. Friday night after services and *Shabbat* dinner, (see pages 2 & 8 for more information) he will address the important question of **"The Changing Place of Israel in American Jewish Identity"**. During *Shabbat*

morning services Tal will speak on **"Three Concepts of Justice: A Jewish View"**, looking at what it will mean in Jewish terms to have a just solution to the problems of the Middle East. Is peace a higher priority than retaining Biblical land? Will giving up land even bring peace? Finally after lunch (which is free and open to all) he will speak on **"Jewish Aspirations, Israeli Reality"**, a lecture that will tie together some of the ideas found in the earlier talks. The Friday night and *Shabbat* afternoon sessions will also feature opportunities for questions.

Dr. Tal Becker was born in Australia and immigrated to Israel in his early 20's. He studied at Columbia University where he received his PhD. While he is a Fellow at the Shalom Hartman Institute, most of his time is spent serving as the principal deputy legal adviser for the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He was a lead negotiator and drafter in the Annapolis peace talks and is a senior member of the current Israeli peace negotiating team. Among his many appointments he has served as Vice-Chairman of the United Nations General Assembly Legal Committee, the first Israeli to hold a position of this stature at the UN in over 40 years. One could not ask for a more "insider", who has a seat at the peace negotiations table and will be able to speak from the unique experiences he has had. I have no doubt you will find him as interesting and engaging as I have each time he has spoken to my RLI cohort.

I look forward to seeing you at what I know will be a fascinating *Shabbat*.

Save Saturday evening, December 15 at 8:30 pm for our annual concert. The concert, our 31st annual, will feature international singing star Joey Weisenberg. Joey is the creative and musical director of Hadar in New York City. This promises to be one of our best concerts EVER! We have had some of the biggest and best Jewish performers in the past including Theodore Bikel, Debbie Friedman, Safam, Shlock Rock, Craig Taubman, Andy Statman and the Klezmer Conservatory Band to name a few. This concert will not be your average sitting in the audience concert. It will not be your average passive concert. What it will be is an exciting interactive concert. You will not have to participate but I think you will want to.

My latest book, "*Shirah Chadasha: The Music of The Independent Minyan*," features 200 pages of music that is sung in synagogues and small *minyanim* throughout the Jewish world. It is filled with many settings of music that will uplift you spiritually. We sing some of this music in our own services. This is NOT your parent's synagogue music. I must say that I am somewhat cynical when it comes to new synagogue music. In the 38 years I have been a Cantor (31 here at CSI) I have heard thousands of new melodies. Some I like, many I am not so crazy about. However, from the time 5 years ago when I stumbled across the first melodies of Joey Weisenberg and the music of Hadar, I have been taken with it. I went from website to website to hear the music of the Independent *Minyan* movement. I was obsessed with the music. I wanted to learn and sing everything I could. The name that was a constant in so many of the songs was Joey! Finally, I called Joey and spoke for hours with him. He is the person who seems to make The Independent *Minyan* go round.

Joey Weisenberg is the Creative Director of Hadar's Rising Song Institute, and the author of "Building Singing Communities" and "The Torah of Music," a 2017 National Jewish Book Award. He is a multi-instrumentalist, singer and composer who has sung internationally with dozens of bands in a wide variety of styles. Having come to love the imperfectly beautiful music of regular people singing together, Joey works to empower communities around the world to unlock their musical and spiritual potential, and to make music a long lasting and fun filled force in shul and in Jewish life. His *nigunim* and music have become popular worldwide.

Please join me on December 15th for an incredible evening of music. I am looking forward to it. I think you will love it. I know I will!

December 2018/ CSI Community Organic Farm Update

The heat of the summer is long over and we now settle in to our winter months of planning and organizing. What should we plant next year? What did well, why and how should we make adjustments?

Can you believe that we harvested more than 2,000 pounds of food this season? This is actually double the amount from last year! And -- if the squirrels were not such fans of our tomatoes -- we would have had a great deal more. Approximately 10% of our produce was donated to the Ossining Food Pantry and the Croton Food Pantry. We delivered get well packages to some of our sick congregants, welcome packages to some of our new members, and made beautiful flower arrangements for our senior *HaMishpacha* luncheons.

We grew more than 20 different types of vegetables and fruit and approximately 10 different culinary herbs. Dozens and dozens of eggs were sold. The Community Garden was enjoyed by three generations of CSI members!

Last but certainly not least: our Farm Family of volunteers is loyal and reliable and absolutely dedicated. I want to thank them for all of their hard work and answering my unending emails and calls for help. We had a wonderful end of the season pot luck and barbecue on the farm with perfect fall weather and great food.

Coming up: we will be pruning the grape vines in February as per our resident wine expert, Aaron Stern. This might be the first year of wine making so stay tuned!

Interested in finding more about how you can help? Before you know it I will be rounding up the troops again. We can always use a few more people to harvest, weed, tie up plants, weigh and pack up the produce, sell, deliver, publicize, cook, bake, and more.

Finally, anyone have a hammock they can donate?

FROM THE PRESIDENT

This is the first time I am writing to our community since the horrible sabbath shooting, and murders, of Jews at the Tree of Life synagogue in Pittsburgh this past October. Perspective: almost 60 years to the day of the Tree of Life massacre, in Atlanta, on October 12, 1958, in the dark of early morning, another act of terrorism was directed against Jews: fifty sticks of dynamite exploded, ripping asunder a part of The Temple, Atlanta's prestigious center of Reform Judaism. Fortunately, only property was damaged. The story of the 1958 bombing, The Temple and its Rabbi, Jacob Rothschild, and the virulent strain of anti-Semitism that motivated the bombers, is grippingly captured in Melissa Fay Greene's *The Temple Bombing* (Fawcett Columbine 1996). More perspective: almost 120 years ago before the Tree of Life massacre, at the end of the nineteenth century, the political movement called populism had been established as a beneficial voice for the poor, the farmers, the factory wage earners against the large corporations, the wealthy, and the powerful federal government; women played a large part in establishing this movement, hoping to achieve the right to vote and equally participate in the political process with men. But as described by Jill Lepore in

her new book, *These Truths: A History of The United States* (W.W. Norton 2018), this ostensibly beneficial political movement contained a strain of virulent anti-Semitic, and racist, writings even by some its women leaders. It turns out that populism, according to some of its adherents, was only meant to benefit a certain type of factory or farm worker! Our history, unfortunately, has been marred by many instances of hatred toward Jews. If we are to eradicate it (we may never do this, given our history), we must, when we see it, identify it as such and speak out against it; and, fortunately, most everyone—Jews and non-Jews alike—do. And we must cherish CSI, our Jewish community, as a place where all are welcome, and Jewish history and culture are celebrated. Let us be proud of our Jewish institution and community, and strive to build a better more inclusive and embracing one, in the hope that by doing so, we join the rest of our national Jewish community in standing strong against anti-Semitic hate and violence. I do have hope.
