Since the Hamas massacre in Israel on October 7th, there has been a 337 percent increase in antisemitic incidents in the United States. 73% of Jewish students on college campuses have experienced or witnessed some form of antisemitism since the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year and a plurality of students reported that they do not feel physically safe on campus and even fewer feel emotional safe. This antisemitism is present in our local schools and antisemitic statements have been graffitied on Jewish owned stores in Westchester County.

This terrifying pattern of antisemitic attacks has been relentless and unfortunately, we have seen this all before. Many in our CSI community have asked if there is more that we can do to support Israel and to respond to the increase in antisemitism in the world. To answer these challenging questions, we want to share with you a variety of initiatives and programs that CSI has been working on.

- 1. We are exploring the possibility of running a solidarity and volunteering mission to Israel for adults, and we want to determine if there is sufficient interest to run this program.
- The CSI Solidarity Mission would likely entail leaving New York on a Sunday, beginning the program on Monday evening in Israel, and concluding after dinner on Thursday night. While we don't yet have exact dates or costs, we anticipate that the ground cost, exclusive of airfare, would be between \$2,000 and \$2,500 per person, with each participant responsible for their own flights to and from Israel. Participants would have the option to arrive in advance of the group and/or extend their trip and remain in Israel. Please note that this experience will likely entail several hours per day of volunteering and thus may not be suitable for those who find physical exertion challenging.

- 2. On 2/5 we will welcome two survivors and heroes of the NOVA musical festival massacre to share their stories with the CSI community.
- 3. Our *shlicha*, Eden, will continue to teach a monthly seminar focusing on the origin of the Israeli/Palestinian conflict and will continue to offer monthly *divrei* Torah during *Shabbat* morning services.

- 4. In coordination with an Israeli organization, CSI will be offering a series of seminars for our teens and their parents to discuss the antisemitism on high school and college campuses and how to best respond and feel confident in their Judaism.
- 5. Families of victims massacred at the Nova music festival in Israel, gathered on *Tu B'shvat* to plant trees in Re'im, to honor their loved ones. CSI and our nursery school will be planting a memorial garden in the Spring to honor and remember these victims.
- 6. We are in the process of creating a new fund to focus on combating antisemitism through education.
- 7. The Men's Club and Sisterhood are cohosting World Wide Wrap in honor of the captives who are currently unable to wrap *Tefillin* and donations will be made to the IDF.
- 8. Funds have been collected and donated to numerous organizations in Israel.
- 9. Rabbi Rosenberg is in touch with the superintendents in local districts to consult with them on antisemitic incidents that arise.
- 10. We will be co-hosting a Northern Westchester gathering for *Yom Hazikaron* and *Yom HaAtzma'ut* on May 13th.

Remembering the massacre of October 7th and an awareness of the rise of antisemitism is constantly on the mind of the staff and volunteers in every program that is planned at CSI. We are constantly weighing the darkness of this period with the joy we want to infuse in Jewish life and ritual. As we continue this balancing act, we will stand in solidarity with the People of Israel and with Jews around the world.

Sandy Reisman's Reflection of Her Recent Volunteer Trip to Israel

"I recently returned from a volunteer trip to Israel with an organization called Lev Echad, a civil aid organization focused on assisting in times of crisis in Israel and across the world. The trip ran from December 24-29, during which we stayed in Tel Aviv and volunteered around the country on farms, cleaning up bomb shelters, visiting injured soldiers in the hospital, and witnessing the aftermath of October 7th.

I have been to Israel nearly 20 times in my life on all sorts of trips; to visit my extended family who lives there, with my class in 12th grade for two months to immerse myself in the country, on summer programs, with my immediate family for holidays, and more. In all the times I have been there, no trip has felt nearly like this one.

Five minutes after getting off the plane at Ben Gurion airport, we heard sirens in the airport and ran to the safe area; As soon as we made it to the safe area in the stairwell, we heard the booms overhead, and later learned 14 rockets had been fired at central Israel. We then made our way down the ramp where we witnessed the images of hostages. As we exited the airport and made our way to a nearby suburb of Tel Aviv where we were staying, it was amazing to see how many Israeli flags were hanging all around with signs written "together we will win" everywhere. The pride and unity in the country were immediately palpable.

Our trip continued with various experiences that were unforgettable and showed the true nature of Israel. We spoke to many people, including my family members, who are totally distraught, nervous about the future, and still mourning and grieving many losses - every single person has been, and is, affected. The amount of stories of people they know who were murdered, kidnapped, injured as a soldier, or are serving Gaza is hard to comprehend.

The hardest day of all was visiting Kfar Aza, a kibbutz destroyed on the border with Gaza, where many were murdered or taken hostage, and those who survived are deeply hurt by the losses. As we finished hearing from an eighteen-year-old who had driven down from the North on October 7th after hearing of an attack on the South and saved over 25 people while also evacuating dead bodies, a red alert went off - meaning a rocket was approaching from Gaza. As soon as our group ran into the nearby bomb shelter, within the allotted 15 seconds, we heard the loud "boom" overhead, peeked out, and witnessed the aftermath of the iron dome. It was quite chilling to end our time there like that.

Going to Israel this time was very different than others - never before had I felt such a mission to help our homeland and its people. The road to recovery will be a long one after this war ends, with many people traumatized and suffering from loss, a need to get back on with life after these tragedies. However, our people are resilient and united. Every time someone heard us speaking English and saw us wearing our volunteer shirts, they thanked us for being there and were amazed that we came all that way to help; Just showing up was enough to lighten their day. As one of the vendors at the Nachalat Binyamin art market in Israel put it "You being here is like a big hug, so thank you."

I implore everyone to go visit Israel, whether it be to volunteer or just to show up and show support. AM YISRAEL CHAI."
