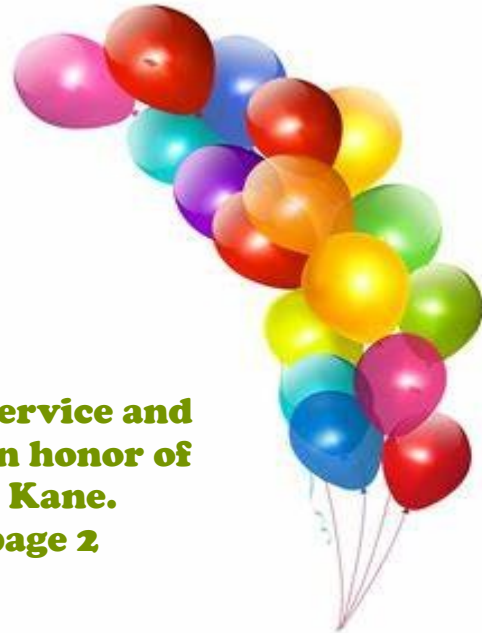

FROM THE RABBI

This marks the 300th article that I have written for the CSI bulletin! FROM THE PRESIDENT

Mark J. Rosenberg



This month marks the end of Rabbi Kane's tenure as CSI's Rabbi. For thirty years, Rabbi Kane has been CSI's spiritual leader and a vital member of our community. Through his weekly sermons, grief counseling, adult education classes, presiding at life cycle events, sitting in a dunk tank at the *Purim* Carnival, leading trips to Israel and the South, talking baseball and through many other interactions with CSI's members, Rabbi Kane has formed indelible relationships that will last long beyond his tenure.

Rabbi Kane has also been an innovator, bringing to CSI the annual Scholar in Residence, *B'nai Mitzvah* family classes, Torah on Tap, and Ten Minutes of Torah, among others. My favorite innovation is CSI's Organic Farm. When Fred Shulman approached Rabbi Kane about turning some of CSI's unused property into an organic farm, Rabbi Kane didn't tell Fred that CSI is a shul and shuls are not in the business of growing crops. Instead, he immediately grasped the ancient ties between Judaism and agriculture and the potential benefit of a farm to the CSI community, asked many questions and provided suggestions on how an organic farm on CSI's property might just work. Over many months, Rabbi Kane worked with Fred and the Farm Committee to bring the Organic Farm to fruition. But, it didn't end there. When members decided to grow grapes on the farm and turn the grapes into wine, Rabbi Kane learned how to certify wine as Kosher.

My first experience working with Rabbi Kane was during the summer of 2020, when COVID was temporarily waning. Rabbi Kane was one of the drivers working to have CSI reopen in time for the High Holidays. Through many Zoom meetings, Rabbi Kane, members of the Reopening Committee and I developed a plan that took advantage of our sanctuary's unique design and allowed High

Holiday services to take place in-person, something few shuls in the area were able to do. For those who attended, those services were especially meaningful, providing a small bit of normalcy during a very difficult time. I am confident that if not for Rabbi Kane, High Holiday services that year would have been held remotely.

Since I became President, I have found Rabbi Kane to be ready with suggestions, receptive to new ideas and a source of support and encouragement. For that, I am grateful.

On June 24th, CSI will be hosting a special *Shabbat* service and kiddush in which the CSI community will honor Rabbi Kane. You can register for and donate to the Rabbi Kane *Kiddush* via the link on Page 2. I encourage all members to attend the service and *kiddush* and help express our appreciation for his thirty years of dedicated service to CSI.

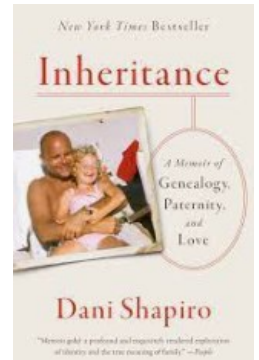


SISTERHOOD

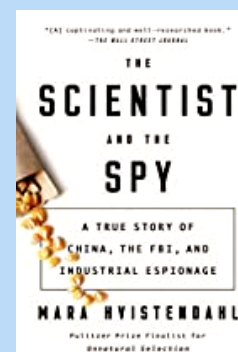

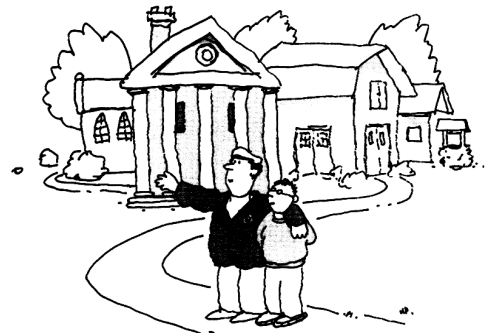
