FROM THE RABBI

Their are five (or six) holidays mentioned in the Torah. They are: *Rosh HaShanah*, *Yom Kippur*, *Sukkot*, *Pesach* and *Shavuot*. (The sixth one would be *Shabbat*, which although mentioned with the other holidays in the Torah is obviously different from them because it occurs weekly, not yearly.) Of these five holidays, the least known and understood is the one we will celebrate June 8-10, *Shavuot*. There are many reasons for this. The first is its length. While *Pesach* and *Sukkot* are a week long, *Shavuot* is only one day (two here in the diaspora). The other "one day holidays", *Rosh HaShanah* and *Yom Kippur* are called the High Holidays for a reason-because we take them so seriously as we look to both begin a new year and repent for actions in the past year. None of this is a part of *Shavuot*! Another reason are the symbols associated with *Shavuot*. While there is the *sukkah* and *lulav* on *Sukkot* and *matzah* on *Pesach*, there are no real symbols associated with *Shavuot* (while we may enjoy cheesecake or blintzes on *Shavuot*, unfortunately we are not **commanded** to eat them!). Finally, the Torah only gives an agricultural reason for *Shavuot* (the summer harvest), while other holidays also have historical celebrations, freedom from slavery and our wandering in the desert.

The rabbis of the Talmud tried to add meaning to *Shavuot* by tying the giving of the Torah and the Revelation on Mt. Sinai to *Shavuot*. They were able to do this because the Torah gives no date for the Revelation, but it clearly occurs soon after the splitting of the Sea of Reeds as the Israelites left Egypt. All the Torah says is that "On the third new moon after the Israelites had gone forth from the land of Egypt...they entered the wilderness of Sinai and encamped in the wilderness, in front of the mountain." (Ex. 19:1-2) Since the holiday of *Shavuot* occurs **exactly** seven weeks after the beginning of *Pesach* (the word *Shavuot* means "weeks"), the rabbis reasoned that the third new moon refers to the month of *Sivan*, and therefore Moses went up to Mt. Sinai to receive the Torah on *Shavuot*, the 6th day of that month.

The celebration of *Shavuot* was augmented in the 16th century by the Jewish Kabbalists (mystics) of Safed. A book was composed called ***Tikkun Leil Shavuot***. It is a fairly thin book that contained short passages from every book of the Bible and Talmud. They thought that by staying up all night and studying from both the written and oral traditions of Judaism (the Bible is considered our "written" tradition, while the Talmud, although written down today was once transmitted orally, and is still to this day known as the "oral tradition") they would reenact the Revelation that occurred on Mt. Sinai. This was also done to emphasize that unlike our ancestors, who according to tradition fell asleep while waiting all night for God's Revelation, we eagerly stay up all night awaiting it.

While the book ***Tikkun Leil Shavuot*** continues to be studied by some, today the term does not just refer to that one book, but rather the tradition of staying up all night (or at least late into the night) and studying something of significance in the Jewish tradition. At CSI we begin with services at 9:00 pm, followed by *Kiddush* and traditional *Shavuot* foods, which are dairy (hence the cheesecake tradition). We then embark on a study session that lasts until 11:30 or so. Although not an "all night" study, that tradition has become an important part of our own observance of *Shavuot*, and each year it is wonderful to see many people extending their normal bed time in order to study Torah in honor of this holiday.

There are two other ways we will be recognizing *Shavuot*. The first is the dedication of our beautiful new **parochet** (curtain) that will now cover the *Aron Kodesh* (Ark) in our sanctuary, on the first day of *havuot*, Sunday morning June 9. I remember visiting the artist last summer in Israel and seeing it in production, and I suspect your breath will be taken away the first time you see it, and on into the future. How appropriate to dedicate this beautiful work of art that will now add to the sanctity of our *Sfrei Torah* on the day we celebrate receiving the Torah. While our donors are thanked elsewhere in the bulletin (and will be again that morning) I want to give special recognition to Eric Wrubel whose idea this was and who saw it through every step of the way. We all are indebted to him.

The second additional way we recognize *Shavuot* is with the recitation of *Yizkor* prayers on the second day of the holiday, Monday morning June 10th. What is unique about that *Yizkor* is that when we recite those prayers that morning we are thanking our loved ones for their handing down Jewish traditions to us. The Revelation was given to Moses, who gave it to the Israelites, who eventually passed it down to our own ancestors, and they passed it down to us. At *Yizkor* we remember that.

Undoubtedly even with all that we will do, *Shavuot* will continue to be less understood and known than the other four (or five) holidays the Torah mentions to us. Yet as we celebrate it this year perhaps we will understand a bit better that without the Torah itself, those other holidays wouldn't exist. Now that's something worth celebrating!

CSI Community Organic Farm

Regenerative Agriculture Rooted in Jewish Tradition

Our Community Organic Farm's planting beds have been cultivated and weeded to prepare them for our transplants. Salad greens have been received and planted. Fence, irrigation system, and various other equipment repairs have been completed. General sprucing-up of the farm with new signage, garbage collection, and distribution of wood chips is underway.

The grape vines have all fully budded and the beginning of fruiting is apparent. The grapes will be managed very carefully this year to ensure proper pruning and netting as we expect our first harvest and bottling to be done this fall.

Horseradish root was harvested and distributed to all who expressed an interest for Passover. Stay tuned for another crop in time for the High Holidays! Our second harvest of the season yielded chives. Additional herbs will be ready for harvesting shortly.

Exciting things happening at the Community Garden end of the farm. This is an easy opportunity to try growing your own vegetables or flowers. There are still some garden beds available. If you are interested in your own bed, please contact Jill Greenstein at jillgreenstein9@gmail.com.

CANTORIAL NOTES

Hazzan Jeffrey Shiovitz



This is a season of anticipation. Immediately, *Shavuot* is coming. We've counted the *Omer* since the second day of *Pesach*, casting ourselves as a people who anticipate living again in God's revelation of commandments to all the Jewish People. Every day when we say *Sh'ma Yisrael*, in the *V'ahavta* prayer, we affirm that God commands us anew each day—*asher m'tzavcha bayom*—that You commanded us today. From this prayer we learn that revelation is not just an event, but more a constant process of understanding the ways in which God and God's Commandments are real in our lives. But like the wedding anniversary some of us will celebrate this month, or birthdays, or yahrzeits, we consecrate particular days to symbolize something that is ongoing. So it is with *Shavuot*. As we gather together in *shul*, we re-experience the Torah's description of Sinai, and we feel that we are standing there, feeling the power of that experience and saying with our ancestors, "*naaseh v'nishma*—we will do and we will hear."

This is a season of anticipation for students. The term is ending and the summer's relief is in sight. For graduates, this milestone launches them into the next phase of their life. Parents quell at the wonder of growing children, fear for their future well-being and start to speculate about their own future in this next phase of family life.

Gardeners get to realize a winter's anticipation as our hands let go of the seed catalogues and plunge into the soil. We hope that some of the harvest will be left by the marauding animals and insects to enable us to enjoy some of the fruits of our labors. Speaking of anticipation—this is the time to remember to grow a pumpkin for your *Sukkah* next fall!

Many anticipate summer vacations or camp. For many, so much planning and investment goes into such a short time. Leisure can be a wondrous time of recreation. There are books to read, friends to see and naps to take on the soft sand of quiet beaches. Some of us will be privileged to celebrate weddings. 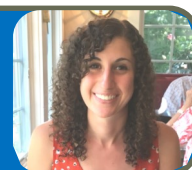

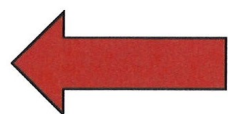

CSI DESTINATION EVENT - SUNDAY, JUNE 23—THE JEWISH MUSEUM (NYC)

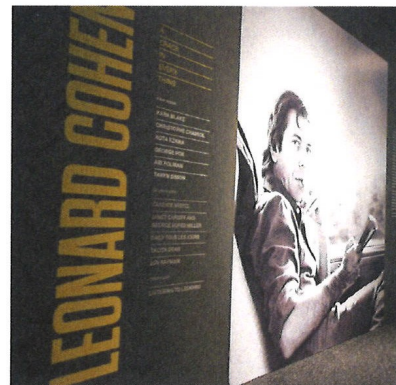
