FROM THE RABBI

Steven C. Kane



On a recent phone call with a congregant I was asked, "What are you and the Cantor doing *Shabbat* mornings? It must be very unusual not to go to *shul* and lead services!" I thought that was a very interesting question, more because what was behind the question than the question itself. If we weren't leading services, would we attend services? The answer to that for us both is an unequivocal yes, because we have bumped into each other attending services in Israel and not known the other would be there (one rabbi sitting near us asked us to please stop talking to each other so much)! So clearly we not only enjoy leading services, we enjoy participating in and attending services

There was however an even deeper part to this question. What they were I think really asking was, "if there isn't a community on *Shabbat*, what do you do"?

My friend, colleague and fellow Hartman Institute graduate, Rabbi David Schuck (Beth El Synagogue in New Rochelle) is on the Committee of Jewish Law and Standards with me. Recently we voted to allow live-streaming from the synagogue on *Shabbat* and *chagim* (holidays), something CSI has already begun. It was a very well thought out *teshuva* (responsa) based in Jewish sources, and I voted in favor of it. Rabbi Schuck however was opposed. While I disagreed with his vote, he explained to me his reason, which identifies one of the weaknesses of many of our congregations. We discussed the fact that many Conservative synagogues and their members are very good at communal Judaism. We pray together, discuss Torah together and perhaps most importantly we share *Shabbat kiddush* together. Yet, many Conservative Jews are not very comfortable with practicing Judaism in private. Our congregants generally do not pray when they stay home on *Shabbat* and few recite *havdalah*. "We have become",

Rabbi Schuck told me, "public Jews but not private Jews. We need to learn how to observe Judaism in private too. That is why I'm opposed to live-streaming. Just because we are sheltering at home doesn't mean we can't 'do *shabbat*'. We should, and will, one day gather together as a community in *shul* to pray. We know very well how to do that. Until then, we should be teaching how it is possible to also practice Judaism at home."

Since I voted in favor of the live-streaming *teshuvah* and it's something we have already begun at CSI, it is obvious I disagreed with Rabbi Schuck's conclusion.

However what I do agree with is the problem he has insightfully identified in our movement. We are very comfortable practicing Judaism together. We should get more comfortable practicing it on our own. That would be a tremendous goal for us to achieve during this coronavirus crises.

One of the small blessings of sheltering at home has been the ability to have a different view of life. One of those has been recognizing the need for us to practice our Judaism in both public and private ways. If, as we stay home we become more comfortable with private Jewish practices, that will have been a great accomplishment.

Ritual Committee Report on Live-streaming Services

The Committee on Jewish Law and Standards (CJLS) of the Conservative Movement passed a *teshuvah* (responsa) at their spring meeting allowing for the live-streaming of Shabbat and holiday services, including *Rosh HaShanah* and *Yom Kippur*, by Conservative synagogues. While this *teshuvah* had been in the works for a while, the CJLS moved up its consideration due to the coronavirus crises and the difficulties of synagogues holding in person services.

At the May Ritual Committee meeting, we voted unanimously to affirm our support of live-streaming CSI's *Shabbat* and holiday services. Live-streaming began on *Shabbat* morning May 30, and will continue to be made available for all future *Shabbat* and holiday services. A link to the live-stream can be found on our web-site, which can be logged onto at all times, including for those who wish, prior to *Shabbat*.



June is Pride month, born to honor the 1969 Stonewall riots in New York City and the struggle for recognition and rights in the LGBTQ+ community.

Jewish tradition teaches us that every person is created in God's image, and is therefore worthy of respect and dignity. CSI's Pride Committee was born to further these goals of inclusion and respect in our own community.

While we cannot come together this month to celebrate Pride *Shabbat* in the way we had hoped, we can all take a moment to reflect on the blessings of inclusion, equality, and the freedom to live our lives authentically--and what that has meant, and continues to mean, not just for LGBTQ+ Jews, but to all Jews and all peoples the world over. Happy Pride Month.

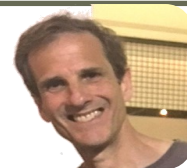

Jack Zinn and Marc Auslander have assisted Richard in this endeavor. Thanks to them and all dedicated CSI volunteers who enable us to meet all of our goals.

A High Holiday task force has been assembled to work with our professionals to create a diverse, creative, and engaging curriculum of programs over the course of our High Holidays. Through the creativity and talents of our members, the task force, and our professionals, our programming will be designed to engage our community and capture the spirit and beauty, as well as the solemnity, of the holidays.

In preparation of the coming school year, we welcome Naomi Elyachar as Nursery School Director, and Libby Sptizer, as Assistant Religious School Director, working with Rabbi Kane. A School Task Force has been formed to prepare for school in the fall in the age of COVID-19.

CSI Community Organic Farm

Regenerative Agriculture Rooted in Jewish Tradition

We purchased 14 new baby chicks for CSI's coop a couple of weeks ago! Right now they are living happily in the garage at the home of CSI member and Nursery School teacher Emma Schifrin. (Thanks so much, Emma!). They provide hours of entertainment to her and her family, eating ferociously and launching themselves into the air practicing their new flying skills.

We have 4 separate breeds- Buff Orpington's, the friendliest chicken with a beautiful apricot plumage and good layers of large brown eggs; Ameraucanas, with their blue legs and fluffy cheeks and beards which gives them a comical appearance, but they are great layers, of blue eggs;; and; Buck Eyes, the name derived from Ohio's name of Buckeye State, who lay brown eggs, are very active and noted for their vigilant pursuit of mice, some compare them to cats due to this ability. Finally we have Golden Laces Wynadottes, which are dependable layers, even in cold weather and are very beautiful with a variety of gold and black feather patterns.

We will be bringing them to CSI to join our existing flock at the end of June when they have all their feathers and can survive outdoors.

Greetings from the CSI Community Organic Farm,

By the time you're reading this update we will be anticipating our first significant harvests of the season. So, please keep an eye out for email updates regarding the availability of our produce and plan to drive by to purchase and help support this unique feature of the CSI community.

Despite the restrictions imposed by social distancing in response to the pandemic, we've managed not only to prepare the planting beds, but, to improve the soil by adding over 15 yards of compost and a boost of organic fertilizer. The irrigation system is sprinkling, the chickens are laying, many of the walking paths have received a fresh coating of wood chips and there's still fire wood (all hardwoods and now seasoned) available (suggested donation of \$18 for a midsize sedan trunk full).

Our transplants for the season include Broccoli Raab, Brussel Sprouts, Celery, seven varieties of Cucumber, Eggplant, four varieties of Squash, six varieties of Zucchini, Chard, two varieties of Bok Choi, Basil, four varieties of Lettuce, 4 varieties of Sweet Pepper, 4 varieties of Cherry Tomato and thirteen varieties of regular Tomato. We're anticipating growing additional items from seed once social distancing rules are relaxed and we can complete the installation of our new greenhouse. This is your opportunity to make suggestions regarding other vegetables you'd like us to try in the Community Garden.

Volunteers to help with the various farm chores are always welcome. Prior experience is not necessary. On the job training will be provided. Tasks range from harvest weighing and order preparation in the modestly air conditioned CSI meat kitchen to outdoor labor which is guaranteed to fill-in for even the most vigorous of gym workouts.

Looking forward to seeing you all again soon at CSI events.

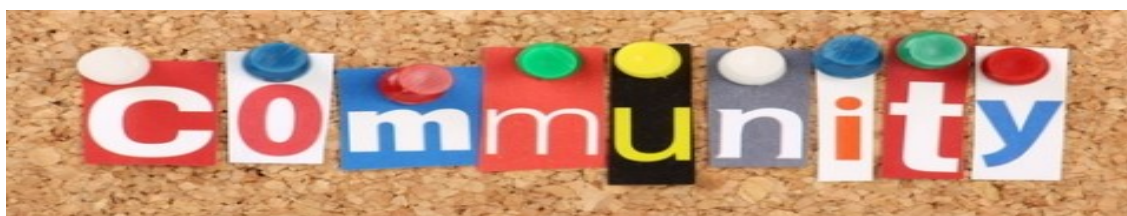

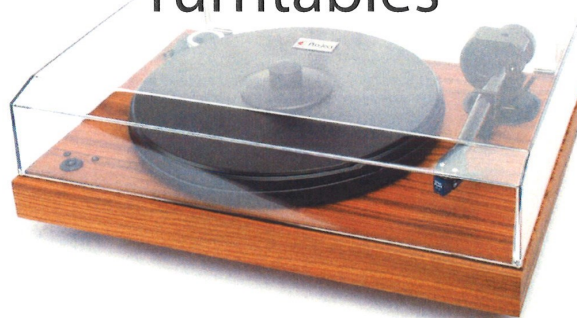
