THE BLESSINGS OF COVID 19

There is a chasidic teaching that says that there is nothing that occurs in our lives, no matter how bad or difficult it may be, that does not bring with it some blessings. When that happens, some of the bitterness of our experience is mitigated just a bit. For example, I have taught to many of you that when a loved one dies, they leave behind gifts. Though we would of course rather have them with us, one of those gifts is to bring family and loved ones together. People who have not seen each other for years are often reunited at *shiva*. That in a sense is the "gift" of our loved one as they leave us.

The same can be said for the terrible pandemic that we have lived through for the past year and many months. There were members of our community who unfortunately died of Covid-19. Others fell ill and feared for their own lives, although they have thankfully now recovered. However it wasn't just those who fell ill. All of us were affected, whether it be through our own health (or a loved one), having to shelter in place for weeks, having to quarantine due to being exposed, missing an important family event and in so many other ways. So we can rightfully ask of this chasidic teaching, "what were the blessings of Covid-19?"

In late May, many of us were privileged to hear an excellent talk by Dr. Jack Wertheimer on how Covid-19 has affected the Jewish community, in particular synagogues. A part of Dr. Wertheimer's talk was devoted to the many positive aspects of the Jewish communal response to the pandemic. One of those was the prediction that synagogues would not be able to cope with the restrictions imposed on them. Actually, as Dr. Wertheimer pointed out, synagogues became very creative and indeed found many different ways to connect with their members. These are among what I would term, "the blessings of Covid-19".

What were some of those blessings?

- We all learned how to meet electronically. I
 wonder how many of us had ever experienced a
 Zoom meeting before last March? (I actually had, but
 only as a tool for long distance learning.)
- * Families began new rituals, such as gathering each Friday night to light candles together on Zoom.
- * We began live-streaming our service. Now anyone can "tune in" if they can't make it to *shul*.
- People have discovered how important our community is to them, especially when such things as our wonderful weekly sit down Shabbat kiddush had to be canceled (it's coming back in July).
- * We have learned that so much of our lives can be taken for granted, and we have therefore learned to appreciate everything even more.

I am certain there are other blessings that have come out of Covid-19, and if you have some of your own to share, please e-mail me at rabbi@csibriarcliff.org and let me know the blessings you have taken from this very difficult time. The great Talmudic scholar Joni Mitchell once wrote, "Don't it always seem to go that you don't know what you've got till it's gone..." Covid-19 has taught us that we don't have to wait "until it's gone" to know the blessings we have in our lives.

FROM THE PRESIDENT Clare Rosen



As I complete my first year as the president of CSI, I want to pause to thank everyone who has worked so hard to keep our beloved synagogue flourishing. To all of you please know how much I appreciate your support for me but more importantly your support and love for CSI. We have remained open throughout the pandemic. I want to personally thank our clergy, Rabbi Kane, Cantor Shiovitz, our educators, led by Libby Spitzer and Naomi Elyachar, our director and office staff, Ellen Johnson, Dina Katz, Jennifer Halperin, Janice Rappaport, and our everything person, Rosita. And I also want to thank the Board of Trustees, the Executive Committee, and all of those who give untold hours to CSI. We are better because of you.

The Encyclopedia Britannica defines a Synagogue, also spelled synagog, in Judaism, as a community house of worship that serves as a place not only for liturgical services but also for assembly and study. Its traditional functions are reflected in three Hebrew synonyms for synagogue: bet ha-tefilla ("house of prayer"), bet ha-kneset ("house of assembly"), and bet ha-midrash ("house of study"). The term synagogue is of Greek origin (synagein, "to bring together") and means "a place of assembly."

Most houses of worship are talking about how to safely bring people back inside. Many are writing reopening plans while others, like CSI, are writing reentry plans. Reopening is a broad term. CSI is already reopened. We held hybrid services, with attendance both in person and remotely. The Nursery School has remained open all year, either holding classes outdoors or in the building during inclement weather. Other programs, activities and the Religious School have been on Zoom or live streamed. CSI never closed. Re-entry focuses on the transition for those who have been away for an extended period of time. CSI, much more than a Jewish place of worship, is preparing for a return to face-to-face, in-person participation. And for that reason, we are planning to address a variety of needs beyond physical health.

As a place of study and learning, a *bet ha-midrash*, we have to address our educational programs. Our Religious School students have attended school

remotely since March 2020, only coming to the building for a few special programs. Not only will our teachers need to plan how to adapt our new curriculum to inperson lessons, but they will be rebuilding a community of learners who haven't spent time together for more than a year. Some students, traumatized by COVID, will need additional support. Our robust Adult Education programs have also been on Zoom. In reality, the number of programs and attendance at all of these have grown. Will we continue to have remote access to the Adult Education programs?

We have been a functioning House of prayer, a bet ha-tefilla. Minyan, Shabbat and holiday services have been both remote and in person. There are many questions that need to be asked and answered. Will we continue with this same configuration? Will some people remain attending remotely?

And we are a place of assembly, a *bet ha-kneset*, that needs environment and infection control. Therefore, we are reviewing all of the health and safety measures that CSI implemented during COVID. Do we need to put additional ones in place or not?

We need to address social, emotional, and mental health needs. What supports do the teachers, students, and congregants need? What special considerations do we need to provide for vulnerable populations?

So, I ask you, how are we doing and what additional questions do we need to ask as we plan for re-entry? You can email me questions, ideas, concerns or just introduce yourself. My email address is below.



Greetings from the CSI Community Organic Farm

As you're reading this update we will be anticipating our first significant harvests of the season and have already delivered samples of our herbs to several local venues. Please keep an eye out for email updates regarding the availability of our produce and help support this unique feature of the CSI community by purchasing from us. We will be hosting at least a weekly farm stand for our members and the local community and expect to have some prepared items again from Chef John.

Our new brood of chickens have matured into hens and are providing us with at least a dozen eggs per day. Purchasing these farm fresh heirloom eggs in the CSI office for \$6 per dozen is another way you can help support the CSI Farm. Please call the office in advance to confirm availability.

The CSI walking/nature path is expanding and ready for those looking to take a contemplative, relaxing stroll through the woods. Our picnic table area has received a fresh coating of wood chips and would be an inviting area to take a lunch break or have dinner with family.

We've been busy preparing our planting beds by tilling the aisles to return soil to the raised beds and adding a bit of organic fertilizer. The irrigation system is running and the Community Garden is ready for both seasoned and novice gardeners to enjoy the rewards of growing their own food. Please reach out to <u>Jill Greenstein</u> to reserve one of our roughly 3' x 15' beds.

Produce for the season includes bush beans, sweet corn, cucumber, squash, zucchini, chard, bok choy, basil, lettuce, sweet pepper, cherry tomato, regular tomato, fennel, kohlrabi, peas, kale, arugula, sorrel, spinach and dill in addition to our garlic and perennial herbs like chive, oregano, thyme and mint. We'll also be trying to grow a more significant flower crop this year and we'll try supplementing these items with seeded crops started in our new greenhouse. If you have suggestions regarding other vegetables you'd like us to try in the Community Garden please reach out.

Volunteers to help with the various farm chores are always welcome. Prior experience is not necessary. Tasks include harvesting, harvest weighing, order preparation, farm stand set-up, sales, greenhouse management, as well as outdoor labor associated with planting, weeding, pruning, staking and tying.


- We bring members who live alone good cheer with a phone call (or hopefully a visit soon).




