

FROM THE RABBI Steven C. Kane



Shavuot is perhaps the most unusual holiday in the Torah. We learn in the Torah that *Pesach* celebrates our liberation from Egypt and that Rosh *Ha-Shanah* and *Yom Kippur* begin the new year, offering us the opportunity for teshuvah (repentance and forgiveness). Succot recalls the huts our ancestors lived in as they wandered in the desert for 40 years, and then later when they were settled in the land of Israel, harvesting crops. Indeed each holiday's name reflects exactly what we are celebrating (for example, we call *Succot* by that name because our ancestors dwelt in a hut called a succah). However, when it comes to Shavuot this is not the case. The name Shavuot means "weeks," referring to the time period from Pesach until the next holiday (seven complete weeks). It says nothing about what is being celebrated.

There are two other unique aspects to Shavuot. While the Torah tells us to "count off seven study of the Talmud tractate Bikurim, which weeks" from *Pesach* and then celebrate *Shavuot*, unlike all of the other holidays no specific date is given for its celebration. Finally, although it is grouped with *Pesach* and *Succot* as one of the three "pilgrimage festivals" (shalosh regalim), it is celebrated for only one day (two in the diaspora), whereas both Pesach and Succot are each celebrated for one week.

Because of these unique aspects to *Shavuot*, the rabbis were able to add to the holiday. First, they gave it a date on the calendar, the 6th of Sivan. Then they added another layer of celebration to it, establishing it as the day that Moses received the Torah on Mt. Sinai. Judaism has always had a grand tradition of textual study, so a holiday that celebrates the giving of the Torah also celebrates the beginning of our long and deep commitment to the study of our texts. In the 16th century this celebration of Torah study led the kabbalists to institute a full night of study called Tikkun Leil *Shavuot.* They taught that we count the 49 days from *Pesach* to *Shavuot* because our ancestors

needed seven complete weeks (after leaving Egypt) to prepare to receive the Torah on Mt. Sinai. They compared this to a bride who prepares for her wedding seven days in advance. The Zohar, the basic book of Jewish mysticism captures this when it teaches that our study of the Bible on *Shavuot* evening is "like a bride who has placed her jewels in a crown and arranged her adornments prior to her marriage." Some studied from a book also called Tikkun Leil Shavuot, which contains a few verses from every Torah portion and then from each of the other 19 books of the Bible. This, however, is not the only way Jews have celebrated our commitment to the study of our texts.

There are three other texts we traditionally study on Shavuot. The first is the Ten Commandments, since they are the essence of revelation and are read during the morning service. The second is the contains the laws of the first fruits of which were blessed on Shavuot. The third is the study of the Book of Ruth, a Biblical book whose story takes place at this time of year and is traditionally read at services on the second day of Shavuot.

While we don't have a tradition at CSI of staying up all night for study, we always have a late night study session *Shavuot* evening, honoring Judaism's tradition of textual study. This year we will be studying the Book of Ruth, which though only four chapters long, contains a remarkable depth to it. Together I hope we will discover "The Hidden Message of the Book of Ruth." I hope you will join us on Shavuot evening, Saturday June 4, following our 9:00 pm evening service. (For those who can't make it in person, it will be livestreamed, though not on Zoom.) And yes, there will be cheese cake!

Greetings from the CSI Community Organic Farm,

By the time you're reading this article we will have most of the planting beds filled and will be anticipating our first significant harvests of the season. Please keep an eye out for email alerts regarding our farm stand operating hours and the availability of our produce. We anticipate hosting weekly farm stands for our members and the local community once again this year. Your support of this unique feature of the CSI community is critical for us to maintain the program.

Our chickens are producing about a dozen eggs per day. Purchasing these farm fresh heirloom eggs in the CSI office for \$6 per dozen is another way you can help support the CSI Farm. Please call the office in advance to confirm availability and reserve yours. In comparison to store-bought eggs, I find that the CSI eggs have a stronger/thicker shell and a more richly colored yolk.

The CSI walking/nature path has expanded slightly and is ready for those looking to take a contemplative, relaxing stroll through the woods. Our picnic table, outdoor worship and fire pit areas have all received a fresh coating of wood chips and would be an inviting place to take a lunch break or have dinner with family. Perhaps you'd like to reserve this wonderful feature of our campus for an event? Please call the office to inquire about availability.

We've been busy preparing our planting beds by tilling the aisles to return soil to the raised beds, adding a bit of organic fertilizer and distributing chips to slow the inevitable weed growth. The irrigation system is running and the Community Garden is ready for both seasoned and novice gardeners to enjoy the rewards of growing their own food. Please reach out to Jill Greenstein at jillgreenstein9@gmail.com to reserve one of our roughly 3' x 15' beds.

Produce for the season includes bush beans, celery, six varieties of cucumber, eggplant, squash, zucchini, chard, bok choy, basil, eight varieties of lettuce, sweet pepper, five varieties of cherry tomato, six varieties of regular tomato, fennel, kohlrabi, peas, kale, arugula, sorrel, spinach, radish and dill in addition to our garlic and perennial herbs like chive, oregano and mint. We'll also be growing eight varieties of flowers this year, and we'll supplement with seeded crops started in our greenhouse. If you have suggestions regarding other vegetables you'd like us to try in the Community Garden, please let us know.

As always, volunteers to help with the various farm chores are welcome. No prior experience is necessary. Tasks include harvesting, harvest weighing, order preparation, farm stand set-up, sales, and greenhouse management, as well as outdoor labor associated with planting, weeding, pruning, staking, tying, chicken coop tending and chip distribution.




