THE FUTURE OF CONSERVATIVE JUDAISM

Sunday, November 17th, 7:00 PM

A Panel Discussion featuring Rabbi Adina Lewittes, Rabbi Jeremy Kalmanofsky, and Rabbi Jan Uhrbach. Moderated by Rabbi Kane.



Rabbi Adina Lewittes was ordained from the Jewish Theological Seminary in 1993, becoming the first Canadian woman to become a Conservative rabbi. She has held various leadership positions in the Jewish community, including having served as the first female Assistant Dean of the JTS rabbinical school. She serves as the rabbinic Scholar in Residence at B'nai Jeshurun in Manhattan. In 2014 she resigned from the Rabbinical Assembly in order to officiate at intermarriages.



Rabbi Jeremy Kalmanofsky was ordained at the Jewish Theological Seminary in 1997, where he was a Wexner Graduate Fellow. Since 2001 he has served as the rabbi of Congregation Anshe Chesed in Manhattan. He regularly publishes essays on Jewish thought and practices, and serves on the Committee on Jewish Law and Standards of the Conservative Movement.



Rabbi Jan Uhrbach was ordained from the Jewish Theological Seminary in 2003, also serving as a Wexner Fellow. Before becoming a rabbi she was a lawyer, graduating from Harvard Law school in 1988. She has served The Conservative Synagogue of the Hamptons since 1999, and is currently also serving as the (founding) director of the Block/Kolker Center for Spiritual Arts at JTS. Rabbi Uhrbach is the Associate editor of our prayerbook, *Siddur Lev Shalem*. Most importantly she has taught the Woman's Torah Study class at CSI for 17 years.

FROM THE RABBI

Steven C. Kane



In the middle of the last century Conservative Judaism was the largest Jewish stream (a term I prefer to the word "denomination") in the United States. Close to 40% of the Jewish community called themselves Conservative. Most had come from Europe and while they wanted a traditional service, they also wanted a synagogue that was modern and American. Conservative Judaism fit that description. The service looked pretty much like the one they were used to, but there was a real sense that certain compromises for the sake of modernity had been implemented successfully. Chief among them was the ability to sit together with families during services. Orthodox synagogues did not allow for this, and Reform synagogues had too much English and simply did not feel traditional enough for them.

Yet for the past 15-20 years Conservative synagogues throughout the country have been steadily losing members. If you grew up on places like Long Island, or in a smaller town in upstate New York, it is reasonably possible that the Conservative synagogue of your youth has either merged with another or closed its doors completely. While there is still a significant number of Jews who identify as Conservative, the Reform movement surpassed Conservative as the most populous Jewish stream over the past few decades. Some Conservative institutions, in particular the Ramah camping movement, have flourished and grown, while others have dwindled.

Every year The Rabbi's Circle sponsors a significant lecture in the fall. These lectures have featured a whole host of scholars, thinkers and writers and the topics have ranged from Israel and the Middle East to issues of interest to us as American Jews. This year however I thought we would try something new. Instead of having one person give a lecture on a topic of interest I have invited three of my colleagues to be on a panel to discuss The Future of Conservative Judaism. The three rabbis, all with very different perspectives, will discuss their views of the Conservative movement's future. One panelist is our own Rabbi Jan Uhrbach, (Rabbi Uhrbach has been teaching our Women's Torah study class for many years), who spends much of her time in academic circles and is a faculty member at the Jewish Theological Seminary. Another panelist is Rabbi

Jeremy Kalmanofsky, a full-time pulpit rabbi who is the spiritual leader of Congregation Anshe Chesed in Manhattan. The third rabbi on our panel is Rabbi Adina Lewittes who is currently serving as the Scholar in Residence at Congregation B'nai Jeshurun in Manhattan, an independent synagogue. While all three rabbis were ordained as Conservative rabbis by the Jewish Theological Seminary, Rabbi Lewittes is no longer a member of the (Conservative) Rabbinical Assembly, resigning a few years ago so that she might be free to officiate at intermarriages.

The panel discussion will take place on Sunday evening, November 17th, at 7:00pm. Thanks to the generosity of our Rabbi's Circle sponsors, the discussion will be free and open to the public. I have asked each of the panelists to make an opening statement on our topic of about 5-7 minutes. I will moderate (and perhaps even offer a few thoughts of my own), and have a list of questions that I think will be of interest to us all. Perhaps chief among them will be the question of the role of Conservative synagogues and rabbis in intermarriages, though there will undoubtedly be many other pressing issues we will want to hear from them about. There will be a chance for questions from the audience, but if you have a pressing issue you want to be addressed, please let my know in advance and I will make certain it is addressed.

I have no doubt that there will be a future to Conservative Judaism (hence the title is a statement, not a question), but what Conservative Judaism will look like even ten years from now is yet to be determined. Please join me for an evening that is sure to be provocative, interesting and thought provoking.

Hazzan Jeffrey Shiovitz



While the honey from *Rosh Hashanah* is finally used up, when the boards of the *Sukkah* are stacked and stored for the year, the sense of anticipation with which we greet the fall is replaced by looking forward to what awaits us directly. I would like to share with you some of the exciting musical activities that we have planned for the coming months.

Please join us on Saturday evening, November 23rd as we welcome back to CSI (after a long hiatus) one of the legends of Jewish Rock n' Roll-SAFAM. Safam, which means moustache, is truly one of the great Jewish bands of all time. If there was a Jewish music hall of fame, Safam would headline it. They are the creators of the American-Jewish sound. Their music is electric and exciting. They sing in both English and Hebrew. It has been a while since they were last here. I can't wait to hear them again! This will be an amazing concert. I am sure that you will be dancing in the aisles! (You don't have to, though.) Please mark the date on your calendars. You won't want to miss seeing Safam in concert here at CSI on Saturday evening, November 23rd at 8PM.

Our Jewish Music Through The Ages begins its 32nd year! I know, I can't believe it either. It will feature some of my favorite music. All programs are Saturday evenings in members' homes. The first program will take place on November 2nd and feature Jewish Rock n' Roll. December 14th will be the Jewish music of Leonard Cohen, Bob Dylan and Woody Guthrie. January 11th will showcase Black Hebrew Music and February 8th will focus on Cuban Jewish Music. I hope you will be able to join us for one or all of these fun evenings of Jewish music.

For many years, synagogues across the country have focused on singing and teaching Jewish music to our children while thinking that our adults know all of the songs being sung. One of my favorite things to do on Shabbat and other times is to sing Hebrew, Yiddish, Israeli and other songs while sitting around the table. (I know, not a big surprise!) Therefore, as we began last year, we will be having the "Hazzan's "Tish" during Kiddush. We will have good old-fashioned community singing. We will learn and sing

z'mirot, Israeli songs and many others from my award-winning official songbook of the Conservative movement "*B'kol Echad: In One Voice*." I hope to see you at the next *Tish*, which will take place on November 16th. Knowledge of Hebrew is NOT required! A love of singing is!

Lastly, if you have ever wanted to read from the Torah, think about "Torah for the Troops." This time-tested method for learning to read the Torah will guarantee that you become a Torah reader. Give it a chance. I think you will like it. The first class will be held on Monday evening, October 28th at 7PM.

These are a few of the things planned for this year. I hope you can join me for some or all of these events. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to call me.

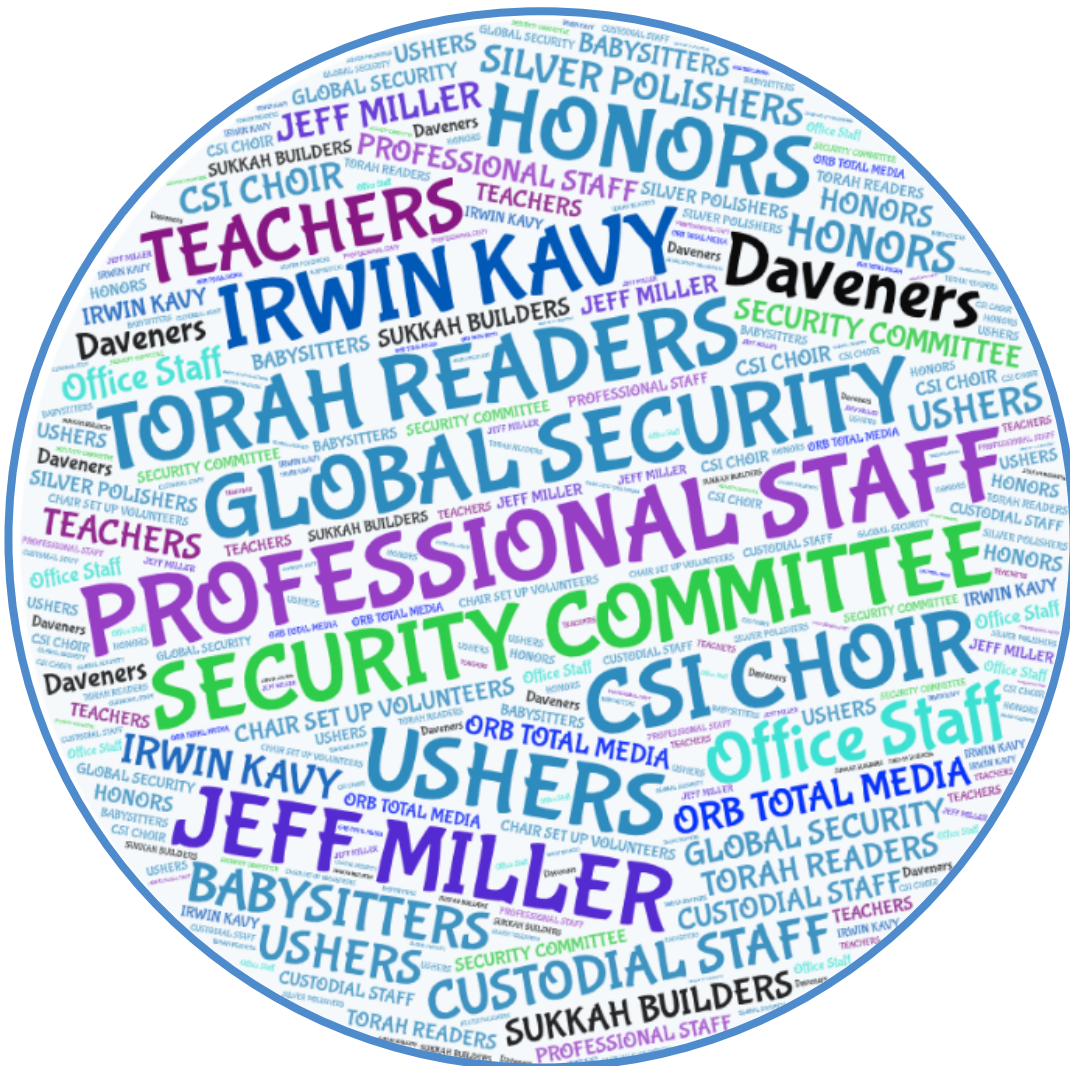

WE ARE EXCITED TO SHARE A NEW PROJECT FOR THE CSI COMMUNITY!

**Welcoming the stranger and helping those in need in
our midst are core principles of Judaism.**

In the tradition of these teachings, CSI is going to take part in
The Homeless Shelter Program,
a wonderful initiative of the Northern Westchester Interfaith Clergy Association.

Our community will join 15 other local faith-based organizations to provide shelter and warm meals for those in our neighborhood who are literally out in the cold. Each organization signs up to help for one week at a time (or more) over the course of the winter.

During the week of January 19th to the 26th, CSI will welcome 10-15 homeless adult guests who will be accompanied at all times by a trained supervisor. Transportation is provided for them. Our guests will bring their own sleeping mats and will be in the building from 9pm each evening until 7am each morning.

We've done the research:

There is no disruption to any services, classes or programs at CSI.
The building is left completely clean - there is no burden whatsoever on CSI staff.
There is never a time when our guests are unsupervised.
We provide a safe, warm sleeping space and meals...there is no downside!

- ◆ CSI volunteers will be asked to prepare kosher dinner, breakfast and/or bagged lunches at the synagogue.
- ◆ We are NOT expected to serve, so food prep can be done based on your schedule.
- ◆ Meals are simple, we'll provide some suggestions and will, of course, take some suggestions!
- ◆ We'll send out sign-up forms for each meal, giving everyone an opportunity to help.
- ◆ This is a project for people of ALL ages; families, teens, singles, young and old alike!
