



## FROM THE RABBI Steven C. Kane



Dr. Louis Finkelstein was one of the most important Jewish figures of the 20th century. He was the Chancellor of the Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS) from 1940-72 and it was during his tenure that JTS became the preeminent institution for Conservative (and American) Judaism. Dr. Finkelstein was known for his own scholarly works and for bringing great minds to teach at JTS. I was fortunate to be Dr. Finkelstein's last assistant, helping him with essays on a major rabbinic work called the *Sifra*.

There is a story that was told of Dr. Finkelstein that I have heard many times, and having gotten to know him, I have no doubt it is true. Apparently a student went to him after *minyan* one day and asked him the following; "Dr. Finkelstein, I am surprised you spend such little time at prayer. I know of other great rabbis and teachers who sometimes pray for hours on end. Yet I see you come to *minyan*, recite the prayers and then leave. Why?" Dr. Finkelstein replied, "I do not wish to take away from the time I have for study." The student replied, "But what about the importance of prayer?" Dr. Finkelstein thought for a moment, looked at the student and said, "It is much more important to be engaged in study than in prayer. That is because when I pray I speak to God; when I study, God speaks to me."

There is no doubt of the importance of study in Judaism. If one is engaged in study, one is not obligated to break off from it in order to pray (practically speaking people do end their study to pray, but never the less it is not necessary). *Pirke Avot*, the Teachings of the Sages, contains many teachings about the importance of study. The first one states, "Make your home a regular meeting place for scholars, sit eagerly at their feet and drink in their words." (*Avot* 1:4).

How is it that we can both "make our homes a regular meeting place for scholars" and "drink in their words", when we aren't even going out of our homes, and certainly not inviting others inside right now? I'm not sure that *Pirke Avot* anticipated Zoom (or even books), but each time we listen to a lecture or take a class on Zoom, we have invited scholars into our home! Indeed I would say that while we all would prefer the possibility of meeting and studying in person, there is something to be said about attending a class as we sit on our own couch and drink coffee or tea that we ourselves made. These sages, as Rabbi Tamar Elad-Applebaum teaches in her commentary, provides a "thin shell around the soul". We truly invite them into our homes when we study with them remotely and with our coffee and tea also drink in their words.

In *Elul*, the month leading up to *Rosh HaShana*, we had an entire month of new classes and programs to prepare us for 5781. We now begin our fall and winter classes. Our full booklet will be sent in a day or two. The classes cover a wide range of topics, but all of them have something in common. They feature wonderful and dedicated teachers, great learning opportunities and the possibility of making our homes "a meeting place for scholars", even when it's on Zoom. It is how, like my teacher Dr. Finkelstein, we can hear God speaking to us.

## FROM THE PRESIDENT *Clare Rosen*



*Xenophobia* is defined as chauvinism, racism, nationalism, prejudice, racial intolerance or as in the Vidui, our personal confessional said on Yom Kippur, the irrational fear, disdain, and persecution of foreigners. While as Jews we have always been commanded to respect the foreigner/outsider, it wasn't until 1972 that the word xenophobia was included in the High Holiday Machzor.

Historically, CSI has and continues to embrace diversity. Our "mission statement" avows that:

***We affirm that everyone is a stakeholder and community matters.  
We nourish our deep roots. We grow. We believe in the possible.  
We value diversity. We are young and young at heart.***

These days, what was once merely an annual reflection now is a perennial concern. The past couple of years have asked of us to pay closer attention to those who feel marginalized from society. As Jews and members of CSI we understand our obligations to reach out to those feeling distanced and to gain a better understanding of people from other backgrounds.

We have been alerted to the hard facts that African American, native Americans and Latinos have been disproportionately hit harder by the COVID pandemic. Dr Fauci identified it as "exacerbation of health disparity." These and other underserved groups live in communities with fewer available resources. Could this be an example of xenophobia, i.e., chauvinism? Can we look the other way and do nothing?

At CSI our Social Action and PRIDE Committees are just two of what CSI does to address some of these issues.

The Social Action committee, led by Judy Boehr, is charged with ... the responsibility of developing and maintaining liaison with other organizations both Jewish and non- Jewish in the community. It shall have the responsibility of studying community problems and when appropriate make recommendations for appropriate action by the Congregation, its auxiliary organizations, or its committee, to the Board of Trustees.

CSI's PRIDE Committee, led by Suzanne Haber, was established to create an embracing community and safe spaces for all of our members and guests, regardless of their sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. We are committed to educating and creating awareness around LGBTQ+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning/ Queer, etc.) subjects through a variety of programs and collaborations.

Several members of these and other CSI committees have attended workshops, trainings etc. to raise their own awareness and understanding of current issues. These include:

USCJ-Keshet Leadership Project for LGBTQ Equality and Belonging.

By taking part in the Keshet Leadership Project training CSI is:

1. Conducting ongoing evaluation of CSI's current programs, policies and culture, and identify areas for growth in LGBTQ equality and belonging.
2. Discovering how to recognize opportunities and challenges for welcoming and affirming LGBTQ members of CSI.
3. Creating an achievable action plan for making us more inclusive.

Expert coaching and support from Keshet help us to implement our action plan.

Others attended Kol Tzedek: A Virtual Conference on Racial Justice where tools to initiate and build on social justice work in our community were presented. They are collaborating with local churches and other organizations to continue this mission.

Please join me in making sure that combating xenophobia, individually and as a community, is something we Jews do every day, and not just on the High Holidays.

## FROM THE NURSERY SCHOOL DIRECTOR *Naomi Elyachar*



Every year, Jewish nursery school classrooms are guided through their curriculum by the holidays and changes in the natural world around them. Teachers bring in materials to create hands on experiences and speak with students about the changes they see happening during their time outside. Classes traditionally always spend some time outside, but this time is usually focused on gross motor play, and teachers often rely on experiences outside of school in their conversations about the changing weather and landscape. This school year, our school children have a unique opportunity to see the changing of the seasons and weather as they experience it. Our classrooms are literally under the trees as the leaves fall. Instead of reporting on the weather from the comfort of their classrooms, they are able to discuss what the weather is by noticing how many layers they are wearing, how fast the wind blows across their faces, and whether the ground they are sitting on is wet.

As someone who likes to create a plan and see it through to completion, outdoor classrooms can prove to be very onerous—the weather plays a huge factor, the ground isn't level everywhere, and there are no walls for teachers to hang anything on. However, we are also able to see the benefit of our outdoor settings as we see the children engage with their materials and surroundings in new ways. The teachers' work is cut out for them to make this year meaningful with the challenges at hand, but sometimes the setting and the limitations prove to yield positive outcomes we otherwise would have never uncovered.

A great example is the way our classes learned about pumpkins this year. A few weeks ago, the children were all able to visit the pumpkin patch at the CSI farm, which was generously donated by Fred Schulman. Each classroom kept a couple of the pumpkins to use for different activities. In one of our classrooms, the teachers are constantly thinking creatively of how to use materials in new and different ways. This desire is spurred in part by the fact that all small materials are brought to and from the outdoor classroom every day. The more you can use the same materials in different ways, the less there is bring with you. This class used blocks to bang pegs into the sides of the pumpkin—a great fine and gross motor activity that prompted interesting dialogue and language use. I'm sure it also exposed the students to a completely new experience as well! Another class cut the pumpkin open. Children who wished to were able to feel the insides of the pumpkin. Seeds were then incorporated into art work. These children also recognized that seeds can be planted. Since soil is already a part of their outdoor classroom and digging is a typical activity for them, they were easily able to plant the seeds. Whether or not these seeds grow into pumpkins only time will tell, but the fact that this entire process of picking a pumpkin to exploring the insides to planting a seed was so seamless and able to unfold naturally based on the children's own imaginations and curiosities was only possible because of our outdoor setting.

We now await the next change of the seasons—from falling leaves to cold temperatures—and how the children's interests and inquiries will guide their learning toward new and exciting experiences!

# RELIGIOUS SCHOOL UPDATE






## PRIDE COMMITTEE - Suzanne Haber, Chairperson

The Sisterhood Book Club continues this year with new facilitators,  
Roberta Bar-Levav and Susan Thrope.

The first book we will be reading is “Gateway to The Moon” by Mary Morris.

**From award-winning novelist Mary Morris comes the remarkable story of a remote New Mexican town coming to grips with a dark history it never imagined.**

In 1492, the Jewish and Muslim populations of Spain were expelled, and Columbus set sail for America. Luis de Torres, a Spanish Jew, accompanies Columbus as his interpreter. His journey is only the beginning of a long migration, across many generations. Over the centuries, de Torres’ descendants travel from Spain and Portugal to Mexico, finally settling in the hills of New Mexico. Five hundred years later, it is in these same hills that Miguel Torres, a young amateur astronomer, finds himself trying to understand the mystery that surrounds him and the town he grew up in. Entrada de la Luna is a place that holds a profound secret--one that its residents cannot even imagine. It is also a place that ambitious children, such as Miguel, try to leave. Poor health, broken marriages, and poverty are the norm. Luck is unusual. When Miguel sees a flyer for a babysitting job, he jumps at the opportunity, and begins work for a Jewish family new to the area. Rachel Rothstein is not the sort of parent Miguel expected. A frustrated artist, Rachel moved her family from New York in search of a fresh start, but so far New Mexico has not solved any of the problems she brought with her. Miguel loves the work, yet he is surprised to find many of the Rothstein family’s customs similar to ones he’s grown up with and never understood. Interwoven throughout the present-day narrative are the powerful stories of the ancestors of Entrada’s residents, highlighting the torture, pursuit, and resistance of the Jewish people. A beautiful novel of shared history, *Gateway to the Moon* is a moving and memorable portrait of a family and its journey through the centuries.



Dear Rabbi Kane,

On behalf of the Ossining Food Pantry and the individuals and families we serve, please accept my heartfelt thanks and appreciation for your and your Congregation's so very faithful support of the Pantry and for the more than \$900.00 that has been contributed to date to the Pantry in donations, in substitution for the in-kind donations normally contributed through Operation Isaiah.

As you are probably aware, because of COVID-19, and our concern for the health and safety of both our volunteers and the clients we serve, the Pantry has had to temporarily suspend the distribution of food directly to our clients at the Trinity Church Parish Hall. In its place, the Pantry has been distributing C-Town gift cards and Farmers Market coupons, enabling our clients to acquire the food they need and want at times convenient to them. The amount provided through the C-Town gift cards and Farmers Market coupons is quite substantial (exceeding \$60,000.00 per month to the 600+ households we are presently serving), far surpassing the amount we would normally expend through our normal distribution of food at Trinity pre-COVID-19. We also continue to provide Emergency Food Distribution at Trinity to assure that a family in need of immediate help will have food on their table within twenty-four hours. In addition, we are providing food distributions twice a month at Star of Bethlehem, through Feeding Westchester's mobile food pantry, and weekly through our outreach partnership with Loaves and Fish and St. Ann's. In further partnership with Feeding Westchester, we also recently assumed responsibility for food distributions each Tuesday at Trinity (drive by) and HORAC. Until COVID-19 is under control, we will endeavor to provide as much outreach as we can through the above programs. We are able to do so only because we are so very blessed to have the help and support of wonderful individuals like you, and the Congregation Sons of Israel. You all, like the individuals and families we serve, are truly a part of our Food Pantry Family. Hope you all had wonderful and fruitful Holidays, and please stay safe and well.



