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



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TBESOC COMMUNITY BY RABBI K'VOD WIEDER

STRENGTHENING THE SIX PILLARS OF OUR

Some of you may remember the song "Three is a Magic Number," made popular by Schoolhouse Rock. Our Jewish tradition also finds meaning in grouping fundamental principles to who we are into threes. For example, the early rabbi Shimon Hatzaddik teaches that upon three things the world stands: Torah, Avodah, and Gemilut Hasadim (Avot 1:2). Torah, or deep wisdom teaching about the nature of reality and the human experience is essential to help guide our lives towards being a meaningful participant in creation. Avodah - or spiritual practices like prayer, meditation, or anything that helps us be more present to our values of love, justice, and compassion on a regular basis, is necessary to have the strength and focus to overcome inner obstacles to living the lives we intend and being the people we want to be. And Gemilut Hasadim - or deeds of lovingkindness is how we ground our values and spiritual awareness into action - to make a difference in the world.

The 13th century mystical text of the Zohar also expresses a sacred trifecta through the teaching that God, Torah, and Israel are one. In this formulation, Torah is the common denominator with the rabbinic teaching above, suggesting that our deeper teachings about ourselves and the world are also intimately connected to the reality of God's presence and our Jewish community.

These foundational principles form the basis of who we are as a synagogue community and how we prioritize what we do and how we do it. The six values that serve as the pillars of our strategic plan are Kehilla, Kolel, Kesher, Limmud, Avodah, and Tikkun Olam.

Kehilla, Kolel, and Kesher are the interpersonal foundations of who we are as a caring community. They all revolve around the teaching of the Zohar that meaningful Torah and spiritual experience can only be experienced in community, in Kehilla, in being together. And specifically, in order for the community experience to truly reflect God and Torah, we need the values of Kolel and Kesher.

Kolel, or inclusion, expresses the reality that each and everyone of us, in our uniqueness and diversity, is not simply tolerated, but celebrated. Our differences, whether racial, sexual orientation, political perspective, neurodiversity, or the infinite different ways we show up in the world, are gifts for each other to teach, enrich, inspire, or challenge.

And Kesher, which means connection, expresses our commitment to not just come together to avoid loneliness or have something to do, but to build deep and meaningful relationships. We want our synagogue community to be a place where our relationships support one another in growing into more conscious, compassionate, and joyous people, and the full range of our experience is welcome.

EACH ONE OF US BRINGS GIFTS

CREATING THE SACRED SPACE THAT IS TBESOC

In order to live these values, our Small Group Initiative, which begins right after the High Holy Days, gives us the opportunity to build meaningful relationships with each other through topics that allow us to explore the challenges and opportunities of being human and being Jewish. Programs like Can We Talk?: Building Relationships Through Disagreement give us opportunities to learn how to engage in conversations with those who think differently than we do on social or religious issues, leading to greater understanding and connection.

Limmud - our commitment to ongoing Jewish learning of all ages comes from our identity as "people of the book." From our Early Childhood Center, to Center for Jewish Learning Religious School, to our BESTY Teen Programming, to numerous adult education opportunities, I encourage you to take advantage of the learning opportunities to deepen your Jewish wisdom.

Many of us don't realize that prayer services have the capacity to inspire, to bring us to tears, to help us connect to an essential part of ourselves that has been covered over by the *vicissitudes of life*. Our commitment to *Avodah*, to meaningful spiritual practice is supported by our Center for Meditation and Jewish Spirituality. Our Soul Spark Shabbat Friday Night and Jerusalem Shabbat Saturday Morning services are designed to use music, meditation, and mystical teachings to impact us in a deeper way. And our weekly online meditation group helps support us in learning to be more present with the small and big moments of our lives.

Finally, our commitment to *Tikkun Olam*, repairing the world, connects to the value of *Gemilut Hasadim* - acts of loving kindness. Whether we are combating anti-semitism, helping resettle refugees, working to address climate change, addressing homelessness through the 8th Grade Tzedakah Board and Mitzvah Day, or caring for each other in illness and loss, our community finds meaning, purpose, and connection through putting our values into action.

My vision of our direction as a community is that we continue to grow more fully into these six pillars. Each one of us brings our gifts, our unique perspectives, our time, and our resources in order to create the *mishkan* - the sacred space that is TBESOC and we hope that you will be an integral part of strengthening these pillars of our holy community.



GET TO KNOW OUR NEW RABBI



On behalf of Temple Talk, Heather Kartzinel had the opportunity to spend some Zoom time with Rabbi Jason Rosner, our incoming clergy who will lead TBESOC's Reform-style worship services

"I chose to become a Reform Rabbi, Rabbi Rosner began because I believe Reform Judaism offers an honest and deep approach to balancing Judaism and modernity. We are able to make decisions about our practice. In a world where we are not hemmed in by ghetto walls and restrictive laws, Reform Judaism offers a unique way to participate fully in both Jewish and civic life. We believe in partnering with the Source of Creation to make the world around us a better place for everyone in it. Growing up in Orange County, I understood our mission is to leave the world better than we found it."

After leading Temple Beth Israel of Highland Park and Eagle Rock (TBILA) through the dual-affiliation process over the last four years, he is excited about joining our progressive synagogue: When discussing ways to connect members to Shabbat observance in community, Rabbi Rosner

has observed, "What matters is that your friends are there. One approach that I've seen be very effective is to ask a cross-section of the community to take part in leading parts of the service, and then to ask them to invite their friends to cheer them on. The more a group starts to get together and to look forward to seeing each other every week, the greater the gravitational pull of that group, and the growth happens naturally. I strive to keep my services and sermons balanced so that someone coming in for the first time will not feel lost, but someone who's there for the thousandth time will feel spiritually fulfilled. I believe that synagogues are run by a thousand conversations in the parking lot—that it's about being in constant regular touch with the community and checking in."

Envisioning ways to engage members in other ways, Rabbi Rosner said, "I think we can make our building like a mother tree that puts out shoots. I want to try to do things outside the building in the neighborhoods where people live." He articulated, "I want to teach. I want to be involved with the school. I want to be involved with confirmation. I want to be involved with adult education. I want to be involved with pastoral care and visiting people in Heritage Pointe." Regretting he can't be everywhere at once, he acknowledged, "The rabbinic world is constant triage." Being a rabbi requires simultaneous concentrated attention to individuals alongside the

well-being of the membership as a whole. "Part of the role of Rabbi is deep thought about particular topics—how to address a communal need or how to write a very good sermon or prep a class—and part of it is very emotionally focused, like pastoral care or meeting with B. Mitzvah families," he explained. Finding this balance is a difficult, continuous challenge for clergy.

Moving on to social action, Rabbi Rosner described his implementation of composting on-site at TBILA: "It makes people more conscious of the sort of cycles of nature. Since it's a Jewish organization, it also is an opportunity for discussion and argument over what can go in the composter, the right time to turn the compost. It's been really fun." However, his awareness concerning food and eating extends far beyond composting. Educating himself about the extensive negative environmental and humanitarian impact of meat and dairy production, Rabbi Rosner and his wife, Noémie Taylor-Rosner, gradually became vegans. "I believe that we have major Jewish values-considerations-that we should be thinking about. We should be concerned about Tza'ar Ba'alei Chayim, the inflicting of unnecessary pain on animals. We have this deep-rooted, Torah-driven heritage to respect the cycles of nature and not exploit the land we're living on—the livestock that we're raising-because if we do that, we knock the system out of alignment. We have come to believe that science has triumphed over nature-that humankind's technological advancements have triumphed over and subdued nature—and it's just not true," he said.

Equally important to him is the treatment of workers throughout the chain of modern kosher food production. He continued, "I think that everything we do has to be viewed through a Jewish lens, and I think once we start looking at the food production that we have in this country and throughout the world, we are left with at least a strong desire to opt out once we look really closely at it."

Rabbi Rosner intends to build personal relationships with religious, civic, and law enforcement leaders

here in Orange County as he has in the greater Los Angeles area. He spoke passionately about this topic, saying, "I think also by showing a public image of us as good citizens—as good participants in our community, in our democracy; as people that come from a variety of socio-economic and political backgrounds; as Americans like everybody else-I think doing that in public is very important." In discussing TBESOC's participation in ADL's Kulanu: Synagogues in Action Against Antisemitism, he continued, "I believe that that relationship-building is what helps when those antisemitic attacks come. And when they come, it's incumbent on the rabbis of the community and the lay leadership to strongly message that we take security seriously, that we decry antisemitism wherever it happens, that we are fighting against it, that we're actively working to make this world better. It's not just synagogues that it's happening to: it's mosques, it's churches, it's ashrams, it's everything across the continuum."

Other targets of Rabbi Rosner's public activism include housing affordability and homelessness: "The Talmud is clear: when giving *tzedakah*, we treat the poor of the Jews and the poor of the non-Jews the same in order to create peace in society. We have a responsibility to the general society to ensure a floor of a dignified way of life, healthcare access, and so on. We have to look out for the whole society around us."

Coming of age in the late '90s and early 2000s has shaped Rabbi Rosner's sense of humor and adaptability to-and at times active seeker of-variety and change. "I will randomly quote classic episodes of The Simpsons and Arrested Development," he joked, "and I love PBS NewsHour." How else does his generation differ from others? "I think one area that it's been very interesting to watch is how philanthropy works among Millennials. Millennials came of age during economic downturns and massive leaps in technology early in our adult lives. It impacts the way we view Judaism and everything else in our lives." He continued, "We are also further removed from the Shoah and foundation of the State of Israel than our parents' generation, and yet at the same time were able to participate in programs like Birthright."

We are fortunate to have Kim Gubner step in as our cantorial soloist for the upcoming year. Although not an ordained cantor, Kim has been training to be on the bimah for many years. She began her cantorial soloist career in Calabasas at Congregation Or Ami under the tutelage of Cantor Doug Cotler and Rabbi Paul Kipnes. They taught her how to officiate Shabbat, B. Mitvot, shivah minyanim, and other Jewish occasions that call for music.

When Kim and her family (husband Adam, son Jeremy, and daughter Madison) moved to Orange County, they fell in love with Temple Beth El of South OC. Kim immediately rolled up her sleeves and got involved behind the scenes in committees such as Jewish Life and Rituals, Hineinu Caring Committee, Women's Retreat, and 4 years as a Board Trustee. She also brought Childspree to our congregation. Childspree is an immersive Mitzvah event in which our congregants are paired with OC foster children and enjoy shopping for Back to School clothes.
