KSDS CLASS OF 2024 HEADS SOMEWHERE OVER THE RAINBOW



For over thirty years the graduating class of KSDS (Krieger Schechter Day School) has been producing and performing a high-caliber musical all in Hebrew. The performance showcases the students' language learning - integrating Hebrew through direction, script, and song. In addition to acting, singing, dancing in the show, students also design and fabricate costumes, props and stage sets - skills they learn in their 8th grade elective classes. Their middle school drama curriculum has also readied them for this experience by fostering their development as performers, nurturing their ability to embody characters, and enabling them to convincingly express themselves in a language that is not their native tongue. The KSDS 8th Grade all-Hebrew musical provides students with a lifelong attachment to the everyday, real, lived language. The play also serves as a major "homecoming" event for alumni, and the experience as a whole is key to a class's bonding and identity during their KSDS and alumni years.



This year our talented students performed an impressive rendition of The Wizard of Oz, *HaKosem Me'Eretz Ootz*, for a packed house at the Peggy and Yale Gordon Center For Performing Arts. They worked for months to rehearse their lines, perfect choreography and create a vibrant and magical set, resulting in a performance that surpassed all expectations. The students showcased professionalism, creativity, and a true passion for this long-standing KSDS tradition. A huge thank you goes out to our dedicated teachers and staff who guided and supported our students throughout the production.

The words of this *Ashrei* prayer seems to capture the sentiment of the families and staff who participated in a very special *Simhat Shabbat* (The Joy of *Shabbat*) program on Saturday, February 3rd. The day was filled with thoughtful and engaging programming for students in grades K-8 and their families.

The day began with a lively family service co-led by Rabbi Seltzer and Chizuk Amuno students from grades K-4. Over 170 people were in attendance as the students took their places around the reading table, joyfully singing out the words of the prayerbook and enlivening the spirits of everyone in the room.

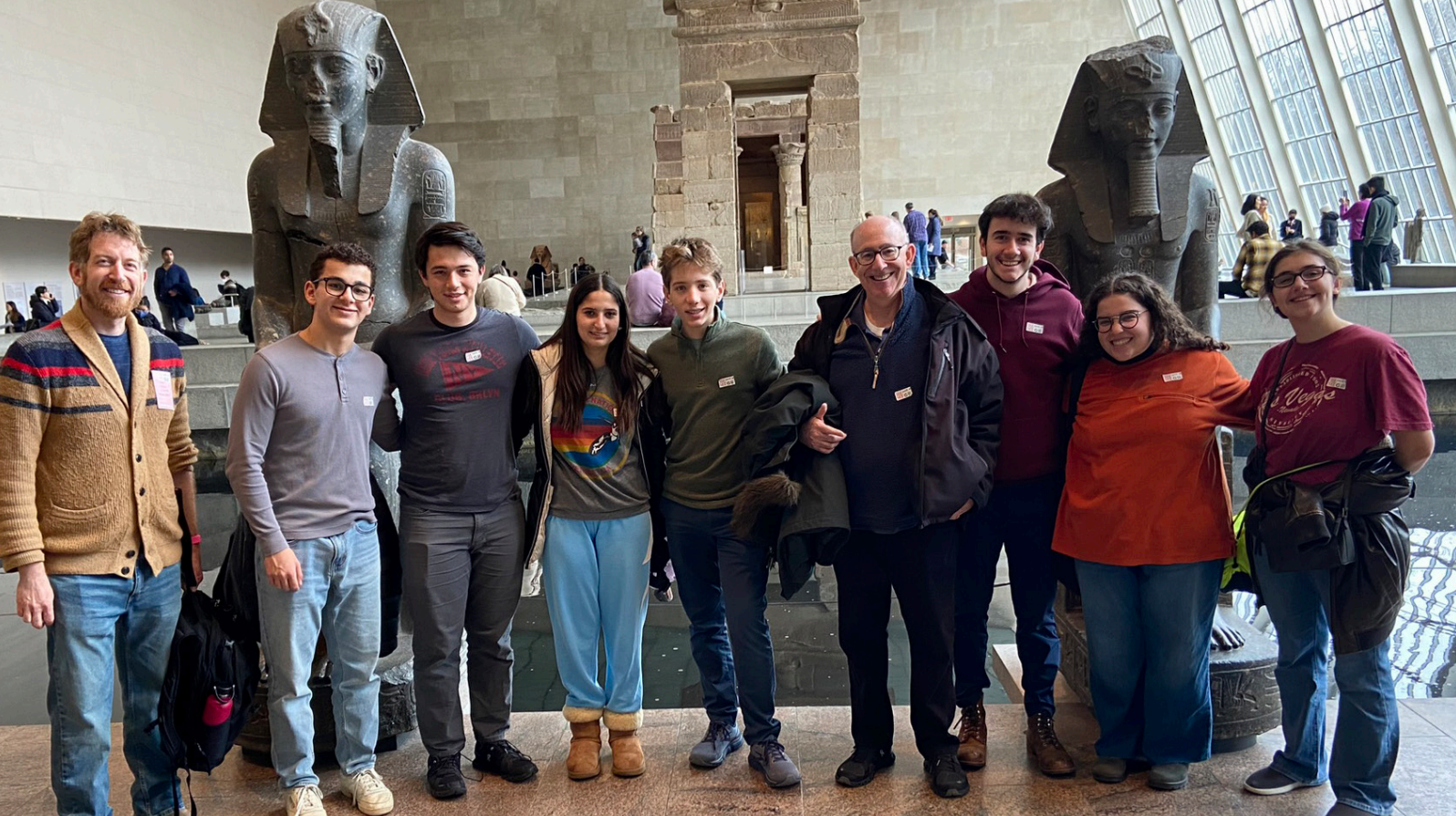
Simultaneously, our middle school students were participating in a service all their own. The bespoke service was created and led by Aliyah Smelkinson, Chizuk Amuno's Assistant Director of Teen Education and Youth Educator. The 5th-8th graders were joined by their friends to explore the Ten Commandments - the theme of the *Torah* portion that week.

After services, everyone came together for a joyful and performance singer, songwriter, rapper, and spoken word artist, Ari Lesser. During his performance, we "gave thanks" in a rap, rhymed the siddur, and danced with Miriam at the Red Sea. The highlight was when Ari performed free-style raps about various animals that the audience called out.

After a sumptuous *Shabbat* lunch by Chef Annie (and ice-cream sundaes for desert and a birthday cake for Jacob Hodes), we returned to the Esterson Auditorium for "amazing feats of comedy" by entertainer Michael Rossman. He captivated the audience with his hilarious juggling, magic, and unicycling acts. The afternoon concluded with an open gym with games led by our wonderful counselors who attend the Glazer High School program.

The rabbis teach us to seize every opportunity to experience "joy" on *Shabbat*. And that's exactly what we did!





YOUNG LEADERS OF GLAZER HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM TAKE ON NEW YORK CITY

Each Sunday for the past eighteen months, a group of students from our Glazer High School Program have participated in an enrichment initiative to learn with guest teachers - Dr. Steven David, Dr. Ari Roth, Dr. Ben Sax, “MZ” Morgenstern, and Rabbi Richard Camras. On Sunday, January 14th, this dedicated group of teens traveled to New York City to learn with faculty from some of New York’s most innovative seminaries. In addition to participating in thought-provoking learning sessions, the group was also treated to several iconic New York City activities including seeing a Broadway show, visiting the Metropolitan Museum of Art and touring the Lower East Side neighborhood - all explored through a Jewish lens. Strong Jewish leaders are literate in Jewish values, sacred texts, and history - we believe these teens can include themselves among this group.

The following are personal reflections from a few of these young leaders:

“Walking into the hotel, I was excited about the next 24 hours. I was excited to engage. To engage with my classmates who traveled with me and to engage with the educators who had made it a priority to meet with us while in their city. Feeling my Jewishness more now than ever before (“before” being “before October 7”), I hoped that the 24 hours that were to follow would be filled with opportunities to discuss thought-provoking questions, questions that related to significant issues about Jewish law, questions that would force us to think critically. I was not disappointed.” (Julia Levin)

“Our trip to NYC allowed me to further explore the intellectual aspect of my faith. While in the past I have gone on day trips with Rosenbloom Religious School and Netivon, this was a step beyond, and it allowed for us to take part in multiple study sessions during our time in New York. I enjoyed our discussions as we delved into the text beyond surface-level observations, allowing me to gain a deeper understanding of their meanings.” (Mallory Gordon)

“After our Sunday learning sessions, we enjoyed a very tasty dinner before heading to see Hadestown on Broadway. During the show, we noticed connections between the musical and the texts we had studied earlier about Lot’s wife, including the theme of the strength, or lack thereof, to not look back. We concluded the very full day by taking a moment to discuss our thoughts of the play over cheesecake! As a high school Junior, it is often really difficult to find any time at all to do non-school or -athletic related activities, so I was so glad to go on this super dense trip full of intense learning and intriguing discussions, and I am really grateful to the staff for making it happen.” (Jonah Intner)

"Despite having gone to New York many times in the past, this trip was unlike any experience I had before. Not only did I gain new insight into the material we studied, but I also gained new insight into the various ways a Jewish person can live their life. It was interesting for me to hear what our different teachers each decided to do after high school. I was grateful to hear their different experiences because I have been thinking a lot about what I want to do after high school. My favorite part of the trip was our Jewish tour of the Met - getting the Jewish perspective on the Met, its history, and its exhibits was an awesome experience." (Gilad Gamliel)

"I've never been a part of an educational experience that took full advantage of its environment in such a deep way. We learned about Sdom—the story where Lot's wife is turned to salt—and then we watched the Broadway show Hadestown about the same story. We learned about Jewish values and culture in the classroom, and then we traveled to the Lower East Side to experience the Jewish culture. Every aspect of the education was immersive; I felt like I lived what I learned. I left this trip wanting more, and I think that's the sign of a great experience. I learned, and then I experienced what I learned. I connected with Judaism, with faculty, with students, and with New York City. I had a great time, and I only wish I could go again." "To the students: You are an incredible group of people. It was an honor and a pleasure to spend time learning with you and our teachers. What a joy to see your commitment, enthusiasm, and menschlichkeit for your Judaism, your studies, and, most importantly, each other." (Rabbi Seltzer and Aliya Smelkinson)

GOT DIAPERS?

Goldsmith Early Childhood Center does! But many families don't. In fact, nearly half of all families with young children in the United States reported diaper need in 2023 (The National Diaper Bank Network Diaper Check 2023: Diaper Insecurity among U.S. Children and Families). Diapers matter - worrying about having enough diapers is stressful. Some daycare providers require parents to send diapers with their kids, so if they don't have enough diapers for the day, they don't have childcare. ShareBaby, started in 2014 right here in Baltimore, works to meet the need for diapers and other baby care items among Baltimore families.

In January, Goldsmith held a diaper and baby supply drive to collect items for ShareBaby, and baby, Goldsmith got diapers! **How many?** Over one thousand! To be exact, 1,153 diapers, 3,556 wipes, and many other baby supplies were donated over 8 days by Goldsmith families. **Move diapers?** All those donations had to get to ShareBaby somehow. Rosenbloom Religious School's 7th graders loaded all the donations for transport to ShareBaby while they discussed *tzedakah*, *gemilut hasadim*, and *mitzvah* projects with their teacher.

Sort diapers? All donations to ShareBaby have to be sorted and prepared for distribution. More Chizuk Amuno members helped with this, spending a couple hours on a Sunday afternoon sorting items at ShareBaby's warehouse. Thirteen volunteers sorted a mountain of kids' clothes by gender and size, all in preparation for making packs of clothing for families in need. It takes a village - or in this case, a whole congregation from preschoolers to teens to adults - to help families care for their kids. All these volunteers didn't change any diapers, but they did help change the lives for some people who do.

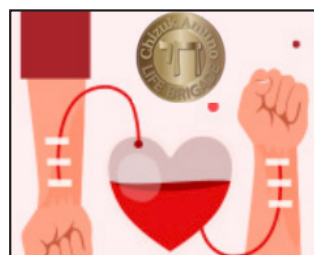
SISTERHOOD SOUP-ER TORAH FUND EVENT

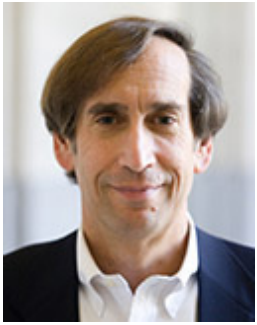
