# President's Message

Shalom,

The amazing Whitney Houston begins her song "Greatest Love of All" by talking about our kids; 'I believe the children are our future teach them well and let them lead the way'. At Beth El, we are doing a lot to keep the truth in these words. We have many activities each week dedicated to our children. The week starts for them with FJLC Hebrew School for all grades K – 7 on Sunday morning. Here the children begin by learning some Hebrew language, tefillah (or prayer) and about happenings in Israel. This continues on Wednesday nights for the older kids with FJLC, and for our teens with HaMoadon, our Hebrew High School. Here we are able to engage our young adults in lively discussions about Israel and current events. On Shabbat morning, we open with monthly Minions Congo and B'nai Mitzvah University (BMU). At Minion Congo the children and their families are always very engaged by Liz Ravitch, who expertly inaugurates the children into the world of Conservative tefillah. BMU is an opportunity for upcoming B'nai Mitzvah families (sixth and seventh graders) to learn from one of our B'nai Mitzvah tutors Phyllis Schachter, and our education director Karen Lewin, about what to expect from, and how to prepare for, their upcoming simcha (special occasion).

On any given day, night or weekend, USY may have an event as well. Our Chaverim (3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades), Kadima (5<sup>th</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup> grades) and USY (8<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades) chapters are all very successful. They hold events for each age group though the month and year. While our Chaverim and Kadima have individual chapter events, our USYers have local and regional events. By the time you all are reading this edition of The Shofar, many of our USYers are participating in an International event being held in Chicago. Several of our youth will be experiencing this wonderful sharing of ideas, learning and forming a life-time of friendships. Finally the year ends with summer experiences at Camp Ramah. We have many children that spend 4 or 8 weeks each summer experiencing our core Conservative Jewish values in communal life with several hundred other Jews; it is an experience that cannot be matched.

If you would like to introduce any of this to your children, or if you just want to get a taste of the Ramah experience, we will be having our own Ramah Shabbat during the weekend of January 5 - 6, led by our own Ramahniks, people who have experienced summers at Camp Ramah. We will also be welcoming a special guest over the weekend, Rabbi Joel Seltzer, the director of Camp Ramah in the Poconos. He will be speaking about Camp Ramah and will also be available to answer questions about the summer camp experience.






Our Israel Forum will continue presenting programs discussing the pros and cons of Israel and our relation to it.

# Adult Education: Book Nosh Notes from November 19th

Beth El's Book Nosh Discussion Group met for the first time on Sunday, November 19th. Fourteen attendees noshed on bagels and had a great discussion about the following five books. <u>Stranger in My Own Country: A Jewish Family in Modern Germany</u>, by Yascha Mounk. The book deals with the legacy of the Third Reich and discusses how anti-Semitism and far-right extremism coexist with feelings of shame and self-conscious philo-Semitism in postwar Germany. Several of our participants described their own experiences with the life of Jews in post-war Germany.



<u>Doomed to Succeed: The U.S. - Israel Relationship from Truman to Obama</u> by Dennis Ross. The author is a US diplomat who has been dealing with US policy toward Israel for nearly 30 years. In this book, he describes the policies and attitudes toward Israel of every administration from Truman to Obama. After listening to a report on this book by one of our participants, a lively group discussion ensued about the history of the US/Israeli relations over the past seven decades and our perceptions of the relative levels of support for Israel by various US presidents who have been in office during that period of time.



<u>Small Great Things:</u> A Novel, by Jodi Picoult. After a report on this story, we discussed the personal experiences of some of our participants with racism and anti-Semitism in our society.






And After the Fire: A Novel, by Lauren Belfer. This story hopscotches from Prussian Berlin in the 1790's to present-day America, with stops inbetween at Weimar in the immediate aftermath of the defeat of Germany and at academic institutions in post-war United States. Although fiction, the book is based on meticulous historical research and sheds lights on some 200 years of Jewish life in what is now Germany, with interesting sidelights on some famous German composers. This book is this year's One Book One Jewish Community selection of the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia. In addition to the book, the participants discussed upcoming events, included at Congregation Beth El, scheduled in connection with the OBOJC program for this year.



<u>Dinner at the Center of the Earth</u>: A Novel, by Nathan Englander. We briefly mentioned the latest book by this author – just out – and discussed his previous literary output. One of Mr. Englander's earlier books, **What We Talk About When We Talk About Anne Frank:** Stories, was a previous OBOJC selection. We discussed the possibility of inviting Mr. Englander for a book-signing event at Beth El.

# **Adult Education: Book Nosh Notes from December 10th**



**Beneath a Scarlet Sky**, by Mark Sullivan. This best-selling novel (soon to be a "major motion picture") is based on the true story of an Italian teenager who, during World War II, risked his life guiding Jews across the Alps into Switzerland and also became a spy inside the German High Command. There is the requisite romance subplot as well. An entertaining, fun read; recommended by our reviewer.



<u>Srugim</u>, An Israel TV Series. In an important conceptual breakthrough, we decided that there was no reason to limit our discussion to books only. We talked about **Srugim**, which is a great Israeli TV series (it ran for 3 seasons) about the lives of young, orthodox men and women, living in Jerusalem. It is kind of a Jerry Seinfeld show, except much more interesting. Available on Amazon.



<u>Menashe</u> is a 2017 movie set in New York's Hasidic community. The title character is a kind, hapless grocery store clerk who struggles to raise his young son following his wife's death. In Yiddish, with subtitles. An insightful, sympathetic, touching look at a way of life about which we have heard a great deal but understand very little. Should be added to Beth El's film festival next year.



<u>One of Us</u>, a movie about the Hasidic community. Again, a documentary, but a tougher, more unflinching look at three young people who are trying to transform themselves into secular Americans living life in the mainstream. A very good movie. Available on Netflix.



The popular GPS navigation app, beloved by many was developed and popularized by Waze Mobile, an Israeli company founded by Ehud Shabtai, Amir Shinar, and Uri Levine. It was acquired by Google in 2013 for \$966 million. The founders are popular heroes in Israel because they insisted that, as a condition of the sale, Google guarantee that all Israeli Waze jobs would stay in Israel.

# Adult Education: Book Nosh Notes from December 10th



<u>Enchanted Islands</u>: A Novel, by Allison Amend. The story of Frances Frankowski who works for the Office of Naval Intelligence and who is given a top-secret assignment to marry handsome spy Ainslie Conway and move to the Galápagos Islands to investigate the Germans living there in the build-up to World War II.



<u>A Place to Call Home</u> is an Australian TV show about a young woman who has been banned from home by her mother for the "sin" of converting to Judaism. After 20 years of living in Europe, she returns to Australia, hijinx ensue, and many scandalous family secrets are revealed.



**Esther**: A Novel, by Rebecca Kanner. This is the familiar story of Esther, told from her point of view. A fun read with many interesting tidbits on what the author imagines life would have been like for the "lucky" girls taken by Persian troops to become inmates in the emperor's harem. Likely to appeal to readers who enjoyed **The Red Tent**, by Anita Diamant.



<u>Ester and Ruzya: How My Grandmothers Survived Hitler's War and Stalin's Peace</u>, by Masha Gessen. A memoir by a New York Times journalist who left Russia in 1981, when she was 14, went back 10 years later, and eventually reconnected with her relatives. Rather than tell her own story, she weaves together the stories of her two Jewish grandmothers, who lived through the turmoil and terror of the first half of the 20th century.



# American Friends of Kaplan Medical Center "HEART & SOLE" CAMPAIGN

The American Friends of Kaplan Medical Center was incorporated in 2008 as a not-for-profit 501(c)(3). It is running a "Brick-by-Brick" campaign to raise \$15 million, over the next two years, for this new high-tech cardiac center costing \$45 million. Citizens of the State of Israel will match each U.S. dollar with two of their own – more than enough to cover the cost. Construction will begin in 2018, and Israel needs our help! In addition to major fund-raising efforts, the AFKMC is launching the "Heart and Sole" Campaign at the grass roots level to involve donors and create awareness of KMC. "Gently worn" shoes collected will be recycled to more than 50 countries overseas. In return, based upon the total weight of shoes collected, the AFKMC will receive a check from the recycling agency, located in Bensalem, PA.

# All proceeds go directly to the "Brick-by-Brick" fund.

By contributing to this effort, community members perform a "triple" Mitzvah: money is donated to the Kaplan Medical Center project – a less fortunate individual receives the recycled shoes – and recycling the shoes is eco-friendly.





The Cemetery Committee can offer you the time to select a plot at the cemetery or just by reviewing our plot maps and photographs. King David Memorial Park is located in Bensalem, PA, Beth El has over 400 plots in section R. Effective September 1, 2016 the Board of Directors approved a price increase to \$1800 per plot. This is far below the price for the general public making a request at King David. A Family Gravesite includes four plots and costs \$7200. Sign up now for the reduced prices. These charges are transacted with the synagogue only and you may not deal with King David or other congregants directly for the purchase or sale of any plots in Section R. When a plot is paid in full the owner is granted the rights of sepulcher and these rights are shared with their heirs even if they are not members. Beth El does not sell plots to non-members of the congregation. In the event of an owner moving or not needing their plots, they may return their papers for a refund less 10% of the purchase price. The price of the plot does not include any services, openings, burial, vault, or monument charges.
