



President's Message



Dear Friends,

As winter winds down, spring has already started to peak up through the thawing ground. The weather has suddenly turned warm, some of our flowers have started to come up and the warmth has finally allowed me to put our sukkah away! Memories of the bitter cold are fading fast as the days continue to get longer. And soon it will be time to get ready for Passover and spring cleaning.

Following Purim is Shabbat Parah, when we read the Torah portion about cleanliness, redemption and the red heifer. It signifies the start of our preparation for Passover. At the end of the redemption ritual, the people are purified, but the person who performed the ritual becomes temporarily impure; it makes the impure pure, and makes the pure impure. This portion is read at a time when we are preparing to clean our homes for Passover as well; when you clean a house, you start with a clean sponge and a dirty house and you end with a dirty sponge and a clean house. In both cases we are transferring the dirt or impurities to make us clean.

And we are fortunate to have so many veteran members. This spring we will honor Beth El and our members when we celebrate our 65th birthday the weekend of April 27, 28 and 29. 


Join us at Congregation Beth El along with community leaders as we explore World Religions







Modigliani Unmasked: Exhibition at the Jewish Museum of New York. We added another category to the list of media suitable for discussion during Book Nosh – art exhibits. Amedeo Modigliani arrived in Paris in 1906, when the city was still roiled by anti-Semitism after the long-running Dreyfus Affair. In response, the young artist got in the habit of saying, by way of introduction, "I'm Amedeo Modigliani; I'm a Jew." We are reliably informed that the exhibit is well worth visiting.



<u>How to Be a Muslim: An American Story</u>, by Haroon Moghul. The author is a young man coping with the pressure of a world that fears Muslims, struggling with his faith and searching for intellectual forebears. This is the story of the second-generation immigrant, of what it's like to lose yourself between cultures, and how to pick up the pieces.




Housekeeping: A Novel, by Marilynne Robinson. First published in 1980, this book retains its haunting beauty. According to the NYTimes review, this book "is about people who have not managed to connect with a place, a purpose, a routine or another person. It's about the immensely resourceful sadness of a certain kind of American, someone who has fallen out of history and is trying to invent a life without assistance of any kind, without even recognizing that there are precedents. It is about a woman who is so far from everyone else that it would be presumptuous to put a name to her frame of mind." (The author won the 2005 Pulitzer Prize for **Gilead**.)



My Father's Paradise: A Son's Search for His Family's Past, by Ariel Sabar. The author's father was born in the ancient town of Zakho in a remote corner of northern Iraq. For nearly three thousand years, it was the home of a small group of Kurdish Jews. Alas, they were forced to leave their homes after the formation of the modern State of Israel. However, in searching for his family roots, the author uncovered fascinating aspects of the sweeping saga of Middle-Eastern Jewry – a world that is mostly gone now. Terrific book; highly recommended.

This book reminded one of our Book Noshers of the long-running PBS series called <u>Finding Your Roots</u>. Currently in its fourth season, Episode 5 featured Scarlett Johansson, Paul Rudd, and John Turturro. Two of those three actors have Jewish roots. Try to guess which two.



The Gold of Exodus: The Discovery of the Real Mount Sinai, by Howard Blum. This Indiana Jones-style adventure book recounts the story of a daring and dangerous attempt to find the site of the "true" Mt. Sinai (in modern-day Saudi Arabia!) using hints in the Old Testament for guidance. Whether historically or scientifically accurate or not, the book is an entertaining and discussion-provoking read.






The Book of Separation: A Memoir, by Tova Mirvis. The young author of three well received novels (The Ladies Auxiliary, The Outside World, and Visible City), Ms. Mirvis, born and raised in a tight-knit Orthodox Jewish family, decided at age 40 to leave her husband and her faith. This memoir recounts her experiences walking away from the only life she had ever known. This book brought to mind the explosion of recent movies dealing with life in, and separation from, ultra-Orthodox Jewish communities, including:









The Story of the Jews Volume Two: Belonging: 1492-1900, by Simon Schama. Companion book to the PBS and BBC series by the famed historian and best-selling author of numerous works of popular history. This volume spans the centuries and the continents, from the expulsion of the Jews from Spain during the Inquisition to the shtetls of Russia to the dusty streets of infant Hollywood. Highly recommended by our reviewer.



<u>Gone to Soldiers</u>, by Marge Piercy. A sweeping novel set during WWII, it recounts the horrors of the concentration camps, the heroism of soldiers on the beaches of Okinawa, the skies above London and the seas of the Mediterranean, the brilliance of code breakers, and the resilience of families waiting for the return of their loved ones. The stories are told by 10 women, each with her own voice and her own poignant saga.

Several other books, movies, TV shows, archeological digs, and stories of personal travel in the Middle East were mentioned in passing. You had to be there to find out what was so great about each one of them.




And After the Fire: A Novel, by Lauren Belfer. The author, Lauren Belfer, is coming to Beth El on May 6, 2018. 


The Physician, A Novel, by Noah Gordon, tells the story of a Christian boy who lives in England in the 11th century. He decides to travel to Persia to study medicine with the famous Muslin physician Avicenna. As it happens, Christians are not welcome in Muslim Persia. To overcome this obstacle, the boy decides to pretend that he is a Jew. Unfortunately, this means that he has to travel across Christian Europe disguised as a Jew. Many adventures ensue. The book was also turned into an entertaining movie.

<u>The Dovekeepers A Novel</u>, by Alice Hoffman. Historical fiction at its best. The stories of four women who find themselves on Masada among several hundred Jewish fighters, besieged by the Roman legions, in 73 C.E.



<u>The Kill Artist</u>, by Daniel Silva. This is the book that introduced the world to the intrepid Israeli intelligence officer Gabriel Allon. At last count, Daniel Silva has published 20 thrillers, the last 17 of them featuring Gabriel Allon. We've been warned that you can't just read one – the series is seriously addictive. Last we heard, movie rights have been acquired by MGM, so look for another action franchise to hit your neighborhood movie theaters soon.



<u>The Wine Lover's Daughter: A Memoir</u>, by Anne Fadiman. A daughter's recollections of her father, Clifton Fadiman, the well-known Jewish intellectual, author, editor, radio and television personality, wine lover, and all-around bon vivant. (He died in 1999, at the age of 95) Written with wit, verve, and love.



<u>Jewish Noir: Contemporary Tales of Crime and Other Dark Deeds</u>, by Kenneth Wishnia. A great collection of stories featuring Jewish mayhem and malfeasance, some of it possibly based on fact. After discussing one of the stories in particular, our reporter told us where she bought the book – a great little bookstore in Lenox, MA, where the owner, Matt Tannebaum, not only stocks a terrific collection of Jewish-themed books but will gladly spend 30 minutes chatting with you to make sure that you find just the right one. Gloria Allred was born Jewish – who knew? She was born into a Jewish working-class family right here in Philadelphia. She is now 76-years-old and has never stopped chasing high-profile cases. She is the subject of a flattering new Netflix documentary, **Seeing Allred.**



Social Action Opportunities

Beth El has raised over \$200.00 just by donating shoes

The American Friends of Kaplan Medical Center was incorporated in 2008 as a not-for-profit 501(c)(3). It is running a "Brick-by-Brick" campaign to raise \$15 million, over the next two years, for this new high-tech cardiac center costing \$45 million. Citizens of the State of Israel will match each U.S. dollar with two of their own – more than enough to cover the cost.

Construction will begin in 2018, and Israel needs our help! In addition to major fund-raising efforts, the AFKMC is launching the "Heart and Sole" Campaign at the grass roots level to involve donors and create awareness of KMC. "Gently worn" shoes collected will be recycled to more than 50 countries overseas. In return, based upon the total weight of shoes collected, the AFKMC will receive a check from the recycling agency, located in Bensalem, PA.

All proceeds go directly to the "Brick-by-Brick" fund.

By contributing to this effort, community members perform a "triple" Mitzvah: money is donated to the Kaplan Medical Center project – a less fortunate individual receives the recycled shoes – and recycling the shoes is eco-friendly.



PASSOVER 2018

It is time to begin thinking about Pesach. Good preparation is the key to a wonderful Seder and a meaningful Pesach.

Hametz (leaven) – The main ritual observance of Pesach is ridding our homes of all forms of leaven. First, all bread products should be removed, either donated to a food pantry, sold, given or thrown away by nightfall on the day before Pesach. Second, we do a ritual search for leaven (bedikat hametz), this year on the evening of Thursday, March 29, traditionally by candlelight, using a feather and spoon to collect several pieces of specially placed leaven. This is a great ritual for the whole family! We then recite the formula for nullifying any unfound hametz (bittul hametz). In the event that some products are too expensive to actually be disposed of, they may be sold to a non-Jew for the duration of Pesach, and Rabbi Gruenberg can act as your agent in that transaction if you sign the form in the synagogue office by Thursday, March 29. On the morning of the First Seder night, (Friday, March 30) we destroy the hametz (biur hametz) that we found the night before, usually by burning it, and we again recite the formula for nullifying unfound hametz. The rituals for searching, nullifying and destroying hametz can be found in a good haggadah. Beth El will be collecting your nonperishable, unopened chametz and donating it to the Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry. Please leave your donations in the lobby no later than Thursday, March 29 7:00am.

Ta'anit Bekhorim (Fast of the Firstborn)

On the day leading into seder, all firstborn Jews customarily fast from morning until evening. However, if one takes part in a mitzvah that includes a feast, the fast is cut short. Join Rabbi Gruenberg on **Friday, March 30 at 7:00am morning minyan for some study.**

Ma'ot Hittin

As on every Jewish holiday, it is praiseworthy to give to tzedakah so that others will have enough to eat and, in the case of Pesach, provisions for seder. One wonderful opportunity for doing so is by contributing to Mazon, a Jewish response to hunger. We have their materials in the synagogue lobby or go to: http://www.mazon.org. Seder

The complex details of seder are best addressed through a good haggadah. The Rabbinical Assembly's Feast of Freedom includes a lot of wonderful material, and the Hartman Institute's A Different Night is great for kids, but many others are also worth checking out. Remember that the best seder experience will be one where everyone participates by reading, acting out the story or telling their own stories of personal redemption. There are many online resources to help you enhance your seder.





King David Memorial Park is located in Bensalem, PA, Beth El has over 400 plots in section R. Effective September 1, 2016 the Board of Directors approved a price increase to \$1800 per plot. This is far below the price for the general public making a request at King David. A Family Gravesite includes four plots and costs \$7200. Sign up now for the reduced prices. These charges are transacted with the synagogue only and you may not deal with King David or other congregants directly for the purchase or sale of any plots in Section R. When a plot is paid in full the owner is granted the rights of sepulcher and these rights are shared with their heirs even if they are not members. Beth El does not sell plots to non-members of the congregation. In the event of an owner moving or not needing their plots, they may return their papers for a refund less 10% of the purchase price. The price of the plot does not include any services, openings, burial, vault, or monument charges.
