President's Message



Shalom,

Spring is here. With it comes the break from cold weather we've all been waiting for. The upcoming holiday of Shavuot commemorates the giving of the Torah to the Jewish people. This was a new phase in the life of the Jewish People; it signified their acceptance of God's laws and the beginning of following the mitzvot. It is also the harvest festival, or the festival of the first fruits. In biblical days, the 7 species for which Israel is known were brought to the Temple as tribute, including wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, dates and olives. There are several customs that are still celebrated today to help commemorate Shavuot. Many people will have a dairy meal on Shavuot, and we also read the Book of Ruth. Another custom is Yerek, the decoration of the synagogue with flowers and greenery. If you are in shul for Shavuot you will see that we have bright arrangements in the sanctuary and flowers draped over the Sifrei Torah. This is also another reference back to spring and the reemergence of bulbs and perennials; it is a very pretty time both inside and outside the synagogue.

Spring also marks the winding down of the school year and the beginning of graduation season. Spring is a time of rebirth and new beginnings. As my son Sam graduates from Columbia University and the Joint Program, he will be getting ready for his first full time job. Leaving behind the comfort of his friends and dorm life, he will be starting a new phase of his life. He is now dedicating himself to his new goal. Students of all ages will be looking forward to the next school year. My son Jeremy will be a rising junior at the University of Maryland while other students will be rising to their new grade levels as well. It is a time to look to the future.

It is not just students that transition over the summer. I would like to thank Rabbi Gruenberg for all of the support and guidance he has offered us over the past seven years. We have laughed, loved, celebrated and mourned together with Elissa, Sam, Kayla and Rabbi Gruenberg. They have been a very important part of our lives. Rabbi Gruenberg's Message



It is difficult for me to write that this is my last bulletin article as the rabbi of this sacred community. Given that reality, there is only one way that I can begin, which is by humbly asking for your forgiveness. I know there are occasions that I am both aware and unaware of over the past seven years where I fell short of your expectations, and for that I am sorry. The fact that it was never my intention to do so, is irrelevant to the fact that it happened, and again I ask for your forgiveness.

These past seven years have been tremendous for the Gruenberg Family. Our children Sam and Kayla were little in July 2011, when we arrived. As you know Sam will become a Bar Mitzvah in June, and Kayla is an 11 year-old young woman. In many ways our children grew up in this community. It was here that they ran in the halls, danced in front of windows, disrupted services, and most importantly,

were treated with great love and care by the entire community. Beth El will always have a special place in their hearts.

When Elissa and I arrived here seven years ago, we were somewhat new to being parents, the rabbi, the rabbi's wife, and in general to the roles you so graciously conferred upon us. We have learned more than you could ever know. Through your gentility, your generosity, and your patience you have taught us what it means not only to serve a community, but to be taught by one as well. We can only hope that you have learned from us a fraction of what have learned from you.

Being the rabbi of a sacred Jewish community is a tremendous gift. What this allows me to share with you is what I treasure most of this work. Whether its sitting with a family in mourning hearing someone's life story, practicing for a Bar/Bat Mitzvah celebration, or welcoming someone into the covenant of our people; it is these intimate moments, that I appreciate most, and I will be forever grateful to you for allowing me to be a presence during these sacred times.

For us this is the epitome of a bittersweet time. There is a tinge of bitterness in our air, because we will be leaving you. We will miss this community, the friends we have made, the values and lessons we have learned and all of you who have so deeply touched our hearts these past years. There is also a taste of sweetness in the air as well. What we have been blessed with from this community will be a part of the lives of the Gruenberg Family forever. Despite less geographic proximity, the friendships we have created, the relationships we have developed, the times both good and bad we have shared, and the place that you hold in our hearts will remain strong.

This is not an official goodbye. We are still here until the last week in June, I would love to sit personally with as many of you as possible. I can only think of one way to close which is to offer a slightly original take on a prayer that is special to me.

May God make this sacred community like the strongest ones that our ancestors built.

May God bless and watch over this sacred community as it endeavors to make the world a better place.

May God bless this sacred community with the divine presence and the strength to share that gift with the world. May You feel God's presence through one another's loving eyes, and may you all be able to live in God's greatest gift, peace.


FJLC Mock Mitzvah

Adult Education: Book Nosh Notes from March 11th





Eternal Life: A Novel, by Dara Horn. A brand new book by the well-known, "local" (she grew up in Short Hills, New Jersey), Jewish author. Not as well-known is the fact that she received her Ph.D. from Harvard University in Hebrew and Yiddish literature. All of her books are insightful, thought-provoking, and steeped in deep knowledge of Jewish history and religion. This latest novel poses the question, What would it really mean to live forever? Hopscotching over the centuries, from 73 C.E. to the present day, this novel tells the story of a woman who cannot die. Highly recommended for anyone interested in Jewish history, Jewish thought, and a Jewish meditation on the meaning of life.




We talked once again about <u>Srugim</u>, the great Israeli TV series (it ran for 3 seasons) about young, Modern Orthodox Jews living in Jerusalem. Available for free on Amazon Prime. Great fun, recommended for all.



<u>Fauda</u>, another great Israeli TV series, this one available on Netflix, tells the story of an Israeli agent who comes out of retirement to hunt down a Palestinian militant before the next terrorist attack. Exudes an aura of authenticity; makes for gripping drama. A different vibe from <u>Srugim</u> but great entertainment nevertheless.



OK, one more TV show to recommend, <u>The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel</u>, available on Amazon. We were reminded of this one by the film, <u>Making Trouble</u>, <u>Three Generations of Funny Women</u>, which was one of the feature presentations of Beth El's Jewish Film Festival this past season.




<u>From Sand and Ash</u>, by Amy Harmon. Set in Italy during WWII, this novel tells the story of a Catholic priest who hides a young Jewish woman in a convent, where she discovers she is just one of many Jews being sheltered by the Catholic Church. Highly recommended by our reviewer. For historical balance, however, this book should probably be read in conjunction with <u>Hitler's Pope:</u> The Secret History of Pius XII, by John Cornwell.

Adult Education: Book Nosh Notes



<u>The Producers</u> is a 1967 movie written and directed by Mel Brooks and starring Zero Mostel and Gene Wilder. In 2001, it was adapted by Mel Brooks and Thomas Meehan as a musical. The original Broadway production starred Nathan Lane and Matthew Broderick and ran for 2,502 performances, winning 12 Tony Awards. It is now playing at the Bristol Riverside Theater. Our reviewer, who attended the show in Bristol, was taken aback by the audience reaction to jokes that had originally been intended as satire. A free-flowing discussion of anti-Semitism ensued.



Finally, we touched briefly on the culpability of Germans (and Poles) for the Holocaust. <u>Hitler's Willing Executioners: Ordinary Germans and the Holocaust</u>, by Daniel Jonah Goldhagen, remains the definite study on the subject.





Cemetery Plot



No one really expects the need of having to buy cemetery plots. It is a wonderful benefit of belonging to Congregation Beth El of Yardley. There is no better time to buy than the present time, before you have the need. We want to help you make the choice before the emotional time after a death.

Many funeral directors encourage the pre-need arrangements of all of the aspects of the funeral, burial, and monuments. The Cemetery Committee can offer you the time to select a plot at the cemetery or just by reviewing our plot maps and photographs. King David Memorial Park is located in Bensalem, PA. Beth El has over 400 plots in section R. Effective September 1, 2016 the Board of Directors approved a price increase to \$1800 per plot. This is far below the price for the general public making a request at King David. A Family Gravesite includes four plots and costs \$7200. Sign up now for the reduced prices. These charges are transacted with the synagogue only and you may not deal with King David or other congregants directly for the purchase or sale of any plots in Section R. When a plot is paid in full the owner is granted the rights of sepulcher and these rights are shared with their heirs even if they are not members. Beth El does not sell plots to non-members of the congregation. In the event of an owner moving or not needing their plots, they may return their papers for a refund less 10% of the purchase price. The price of the plot does not include any services, openings, burial, vault, or monument charges.
