Rabbi's Message

Not By Might - Reflections on Chanukkah

Most of us are aware that the celebration of Chanukkah is based upon two separate traditions. One is the military victory of the Maccabees in 164 BCE over Antiochus and

the Syrian Greeks. This story is related in the Apocrypha, a collection of religious books which stand outside the canon of the Old Testament. Strange as it sounds, the story of Chanukkah is found nowhere in the Bible, despite there being an account of those events authored perhaps a generation after their occurrence. The other tradition, first found in the Talmudic tractate Shabbat, speaks of the miracle of the oil which lasted eight days despite being sufficient for only a single day. In other words, the military victory tradition would seem to be much older, and more "authentic", than the oil tradition.

Despite this, it is the latter which is more prominent in our current practices. We light menorahs which, in traditional circles, utilize oil rather than candles. We eat foods like latkes and sufganiyot because they are fried in oil. We read a haftorah from the book of Zechariah which speaks of the high priest Joshua lighting the menorah in the Temple. Indeed, the very name Chanukkah means "dedication", not victory, and is directed to the ritual of lighting the lamp rather than any aspect of military strategy.

So why, you may ask, do we preference the oil tradition? The simple answer is this – wars are acknowledged as being necessary at certain times, but they are never to be celebrated. Anyone who has ever visited the beaches of Normandy is surely grateful that the Allies prevailed, but looking over the rows and rows of graves reveals that an enormous price was paid in blood and treasure. The same has been true throughout history. Did you know that the very first word in the western literary canon is "rage", the term which marks the beginning of Homer's description of the tragic loss of life in the Trojan War?

In a tradition which reveres life above all else, there is really only one choice, and that is to celebrate the light of the burning oil. So when you gather your family to kindle the menorah, surely you should take a moment to mourn the enormous costs paid for our freedom throughout history. But we should primarily be inspired toward lives of holiness, symbolized the by the menorah's light. That, more than any military victory, is genuinely something to celebrate.

Israel Forum







The Israel Forum presented The Forgotten Refugees Program on Sunday, October 7. It was a tremendous success! Over 150 members and non-members came out to listen to the experiences of Sephardic Refugees; Albert Algazi, Bert Arwas, Henry James, Toni Algazi, Rabbi Albert Gabbai and Eva Samachson. The stories were riveting. After the program, guests sampled a variety of Middle Eastern delicacies.

Can Water Technology Bring Peace to Israel?

Many experts are predicting shortages in drinking water in the world



with all nations in the hope to improve relationships. Muslim/Arab nations rarely accept direct cooperation with Israelis even when it is a benefit to them and in spite of Israel not setting pre-conditions. In rare cases like natural disasters, some Muslim nations have accepted limited Israeli help but with conditions of keeping a low profile.

Water

Israel has been recognized worldwide as the topmost nation in managing water resources. Netafim, an Israel company, dominates the \$2.5 billion micro-irrigation market. They have formed partnerships in China, India, and Vietnam among other places. Their products are also widely used in the American Southwest. Israel has the best record in water conservation, recycling and reclamation. The process is based on reverse osmosis; salty water is pushed through a membrane that allows the water molecules, but not the salt molecules, to pass.

Israeli technology, from the drip irrigation method to dual-flush toilets, has made Israeli today the leading nation in maximizing water applications. Aqwise, another Israeli company, has a unique process that greatly increases the efficiency of the bacteria that are used in secondary sewage with treatment. Emefcy, yet another Israeli company, has a process that reduces the volume of sludge created in secondary treatment. Israel has greatly improved its relationship with China and India in sharing their water technology. In turn, Israel hopes that they would support Israel favorably at the U.N.

Middle East Water Problems

The ever increasing need for clean potable water is clearly a worldwide issue but predominantly in the Middle East which has a comparably high birth rate in the world. Currently, Israel provides fresh water to the Palestinians and Arabs in Gaza, Judea, and Samaria and Jordan. All Arab nations can benefit using Israeli technology successes in water management. Arab nations have generally stayed away because a perception of cooperation with the Jewish State has always been unthinkable since it is not popular in the Arab/Muslim Street.

Can Muslims ever accept Israel as a Jewish nation?

Is there another President Sadat that could work on improving Muslim/Jewish relationships when he accepted an invitation by Prime Minister Began to visit Jerusalem more than 35 years ago? History has proven that when there is consensus among the Jews, they prevail.

Cemetery Plots at King David Memorial Park

No one really expects the need of having to buy cemetery plots. It is a wonderful benefit of belonging to Congregation Beth El of Yardley. There is no better time to buy than the present time, before you have the need. We want to help you make the choice before the emotional time after a death.

Many funeral directors encourage the pre-need arrangements of all of the aspects of the funeral, burial, and monuments. The Cemetery Committee can offer you the time to select a plot at the cemetery or just by reviewing our plot maps and photographs.

King David Memorial Park is located in Bensalem, PA. Beth El has over 400 plots in section R. Effective September 1, 2016 the Board of Directors approved a price increase to \$1800 per plot. This is far below the price for the general public making a request at King David. A Family Gravesite includes four plots and costs \$7200. Sign up now for the reduced prices. These charges are transacted with the synagogue only and you may not deal with King David or other congregants directly for the purchase or sale of any plots in Section R.

When a plot is paid in full the owner is granted the rights of sepulcher and these rights are shared with their heirs even if they are not members. Beth El does not sell plots to non-members of the congregation. In the event of an owner moving or not needing their plots, they may return their papers for a refund less 10% of the purchase price. The price of the plot does not include any services, openings, burial, vault, or monument charges.
