NOVEMBER 22 - 24, 2019

We are thrilled to announce the installation of our new Rabbi, Raysh Weiss, on the weekend of November 22 - 24, 2019. Rabbi Weiss will begin her tenure at Beth El this summer as she and her husband, Rabbi Jonah Rank and daughters, Ariana and Meital, transition from Halifax, Nova Scotia. We will host a three-day celebration for the community with something for everyone. Rabbinic installation is a long – standing tradition in the Conservative movement as we welcome our new spiritual leader.

### Rabbi's Message



Shalom Beth El!

The summer months, while full of the joy of outdoor activities, travel, and other adventures, also mark -- especially for students, teachers, and often for rabbis as well -- a period of anxious anticipation of transitions that are about to occur. This summer, the Beth El community is also in the midst of an exciting and challenging transition, as it has just bid a very fond farewell to Rabbi Scott Hoffman, who has devotedly

served the community, sharing his unique Torah during this transitional year, and the community is now on the threshold of experiencing a new rabbinic presence in its midst.

I am struck by the fact that at the time of my writing this piece, we are approaching the Torah portion of Be'haalotekha, which teaches us -- in a brief, seemingly unlikely, but pivotal passage -- an important lesson about the sacred difficulty of such transitions:

And when the ark traveled Moses said: "Arise G-d and disperse Your enemies and those that hate You shall flee from before You." And when it came to rest he would say: "Return G-d, the myriads of the thousands of Israel." (Numbers 10:35-36)

You may be familiar with the Hebrew original of these two verses, "va'yehi binsoa ha'aron," which we traditionally sing at the outset of the Torah service as we open the ark and remove the Torah. But what is the relevance of these words to our reading of the Torah? To add to the enigma of these iconic words, these two verses, when they appear in a Torah scroll, are flanked by two inverted Hebrew letter nuns "1". What could be the meaning of such a peculiar phenomenon?

According to the Gerer Rebbe (the spiritual leader of the Ger Hasidic sect), the portions right before and after these verses are meant to be cut off by the upside-down Hebrew *nuns*, so as to separate two bad things. The reason for this separation, according to the Gerer Rebbe, is because the Torah doesn't want to have two negative things in a row and thus inserts -- and even highlights! -- the very positive statement of faith in the Lord's salvation of Israel contained in Num. 10:35-36 in order to interrupt the negative accounts surrounding these verses. What negative things is the Rebbe referencing? One is the people's continual complaining and the other is the fact that, according to the Midrash, after receiving the Torah at Sinai, the Israelites departed in an unseemly hasty fashion.

According to this explanation, Numbers 10:35-36 -- now immortalized in our regular Torah service -- promises us protection and an ultimate return as a people—the very opposite of the discord embodied by the Israelites' constant complaining during their desert wandering and the disrespect exhibited by their hasty departure from the radically unifying and transformative theophany at Sinai. The Gerer Rebbe's understanding of the unusual placement and presentation of these verses cautions us that all transitions -- and particularly those involving Torah -- must be undertaken with careful and thoughtful purposefulness.

As the summer winds down, and we all begin to anticipate the upcoming end of the Jewish year, these verses offer a gentle reminder that every time and place we study Torah is a holy one, causing any sort of departure to be tinged with a certain trauma and sense of loss. While our family's transition from Halifax, Nova Scotia, a place where we learned so much transformative Torah, is a bittersweet one, we are eagerly anticipating joining the Beth El community and learning and thriving together as a community. We sincerely hope that, as the community has thrived and flourished under its previous rabbinic leadership for whom there is so much respect and admiration, so will we move on together through this transition with joy and excitement, bolstering one another with our enthusiasm and lovingkindness.

In the coming weeks, I look forward to embarking on a new journey together with you. Please introduce yourself to me and don't hesitate to remind me of your name. I am also excited to learn your story and dreams and to share mine with you. May this transitional time yield countless blessings for us all.

### Rabbi Raysh Weiss Bio

We are pleased to welcome Rabbi Raysh Weiss to Congregation Beth El. She was the rabbi of Shaar Shalom Congregation in Halifax, Nova Scotia, where she also serves as an associate chaplain at Dalhousie University She is an honors graduate of Northwestern University, where she majored in Radio, Television and Film and Comparative Literature; was a J. William Fulbright fellow in Ethnomusicology in Berlin, Germany; holds a Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota in Cultural Studies and Comparative Literature; and was ordained by the Jewish Theological Seminary of New York in 2016.

Throughout her years in rabbinical school, Rabbi Weiss was a Wexner Graduate Fellow and served on the board of *T'ruah*: The Rabbinic Call for Human Rights as well as the board of the National Havurah Committee. In 2015, Rabbi Weiss was named one of New York City's "36 Under 36" by the Jewish Week, and in 2001, she was a Bronfman Fellow in Israel.

Rabbi Weiss brings to her rabbinate her passions for building vibrant and inclusive community, encouraging spiritual and intellectual inquiry, and promoting social justice activism. She is particularly proud of a number of her pastoral accomplishments at Shaar Shalom, where she has served as Rabbi for the past three years. During this time she has initiated and facilitated a regular communal Jewish loss support group; she has introduced programs emphasizing social justice and community-building, such as launching Shaar Shalom's first-ever Tikkun Olam Committee and working with youth to create their own social action projects; and she has spearheaded several new educational initiatives, including the founding of the Halifax Communal Beit Midrash, the creation and implementation of a year-long, weekly Introduction to Judaism class, and the introduction of the Chai Mitzvah adult education curriculum to her synagogue, as well as the creation of several unique experiential educational opportunities for youth.

Rabbi Weiss is committed to promoting widespread Jewish literacy and to that end, she has written and published many pieces in a variety of publications aimed at the Jewish community at large. She is a regular columnist for the national Jewish newspaper, the Canadian Jewish News, and also writes for Jewish educational outlets such as myjewishlearning.com and Tablet and has designed complementary education resources for Simon Schama's The Story of the Jews (PBS).

Rabbi Weiss, who is both a vocalist and saxophone player, enjoys bringing music into all facets of her life and the lives of those around her. Other hobbies include cartooning, film-making, and cycling. Most of all, she enjoys connecting with people and helping them connect with one another in order to discover their potential together.

Rabbi Weiss is married to Rabbi Jonah Rank, and they are the proud parents of Ariana Weiss-Rank and Meital Weiss-Rank.

### Cemetery Plots at King David Memorial Park

No one really expects the need of having to buy cemetery plots. It is a wonderful benefit of belonging to Congregation Beth El of Yardley. There is no better time to buy than the present time, before you have the need. We want to help you make the choice before the emotional time after a death.

Many funeral directors encourage the pre-need arrangements of all of the aspects of the funeral, burial, and monuments. The Cemetery Committee can offer you the time to select a plot at the cemetery or just by reviewing our plot maps and photographs.

King David Memorial Park is located in Bensalem, PA. Beth El has over 400 plots in section R. Effective September 1, 2016 the Board of Directors approved a price increase to \$1800 per plot. This is far below the price for the general public making a request at King David. A Family Gravesite includes four plots and costs \$7200. Sign up now for the reduced prices. These charges are transacted with the synagogue only and you may not deal with King David or other congregants directly for the purchase or sale of any plots in Section R.

When a plot is paid in full the owner is granted the rights of sepulcher and these rights are shared with their heirs even if they are not members. Beth El does not sell plots to non-members of the congregation. In the event of an owner moving or not needing their plots, they may return their papers for a refund less 10% of the purchase price. The price of the plot does not include any services, openings, burial, vault, or monument charges.
