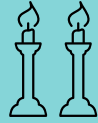

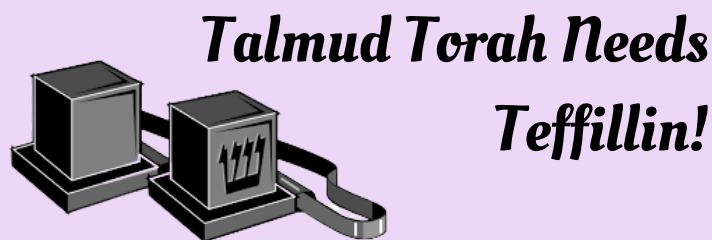
As for me, I traveled to Israel for the wedding of my nephew. Seeing over 200 twenty-something Israelis dancing and celebrating this union with such joy was truly uplifting. I was also energized exploring the streets of Jerusalem, and seeing people of all ages, dress, and degrees of observance, going about their business, visiting together, and sitting in cafes at all hours of the day and night. All the while, internally exclaiming, "Wow, everyone's Jewish!" Yet, it was just as awe inspiring to see Jerusalem come to rest for Shabbat. This connectedness to our people and our history – especially as I try to make sense of the daily chaos in the world – is so reassuring.

While touring the Old City, I was struck by the layers upon layers that make up Jerusalem: The City of David, the Romans, the early Christians, the Byzantines, the Moors, the Crusaders, the Ottomans, the Europeans, and modern day Israel. Each group adding their own landmarks, fighting their own political and religious battles and creating their own story and meaning.

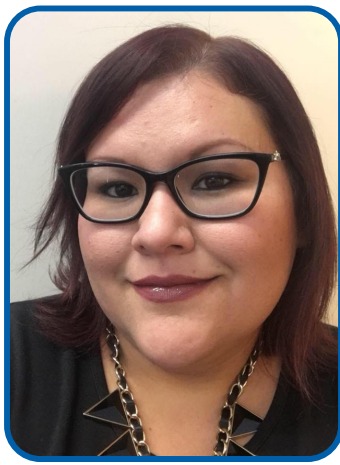

Here are some of the reasons to support the activities of BEWL:

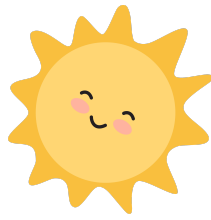
- BEWL is providing breakfast for Talmud Torah's Orientation Event August 21, 2022.
