Dear Chaverim,

In the last few weeks or days of December my email inbox started filling up with “end of the year” messages from organizations and communities looking back at the year and summarizing their accomplishments. Usually, somewhere in the message there is a call to support their work and a button to click to make a donation.

Our Beth El family also has so much to be proud of and we’ve accomplished a lot this past 2022!

Let’s start with my deep appreciation of the leadership and continued outreach of our adult education and BEWL programs, Social Action drives, membership and Chesed committees building connections and checking in on people, the Minyan crew who keep our daily minyan a continuous offering every single day of the year for many in the wider Jewish community to have a place for remembering a loved one or find peers to chat at the beginning or end of a day. And, of course, the commitment and hard work of our Beth El staff, answering all your questions and being there for you and for our community!

Now let’s just name a few highlights of this past 2022: In the beginning of the year we celebrated my installation, a moment of acknowledgement that we as rabbi and community are growing together and expressing our commitment to each other to continue life’s journey together.

For Passover, we had our first community Seder since the pandemic, and in May we learned about our Bukharian neighbors in town, and their history and culture. It was an evening filled with music, dance, and tasty food, and stretching our feelers out into the wider community.

Our High Holy Days, Cantor Rabbi Taff brought back good memories for so many who have been part of this community for a long time, and his engaging singing made this year’s Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur a treat and a prayer filled with Ruach.

With Shabbat All’Italiana in November we brought in another cultural and musical highlight, opening ourselves to the beauty of Italian tropes and melodies.

Those are just a few of the bigger highlights of the continuing work that we all do at Beth El. Now I would like to mention a few **new initiatives** that have become part and parcel of our rhythm at Beth El.

With the beginning of the new school year we started our Bogrim program in the Hebrew school in which we made it possible for our post B’nei-Mitzvah teens to stay engaged in the learning and discussion of contemporary Jewish issues and identity.

Throughout the year, and with the help of our member musicians, we have introduced the new ruach- and song-filled “**Kabbalat Shabbat in the Round,**” which has already evolved into a regular occurrence every few weeks and always includes a lively discussion “round” and a good dinner. It’s a great occasion for longtime and new members, old and young, to come together. Mark your calendar: the next one is **January 27.**

Since the fall, we now also have a collaboration between the PJ Library and our preschool to hold young family events and services. Just last week more than fifty people joined us for our young-family Hanukkah party.

And since Thanksgiving weekend we’ve started a new - and, hopefully soon, dear - tradition of “**Shabbat at the Rabbi’s house,**” in which my family and I invite you to a homemade Shabbat experience, with song, prayer, good food, and the warmth of a Shabbat dinner in someone’s home. While Daniel and I are fully committed to continuing this tradition ourselves, we are, in the new year, also starting to look for volunteers who can open their home to host a Friday-night dinner, so we can expand our Beth El family and grow closer together.

As we enter into a new secular year, I ask you to share your thoughts and ideas for our community. What are your Beth El resolutions for 2023?

Dear Friends,

Only a few months ago we were wishing one another Shana Tovah, and now we get to repeat these same wishes as we celebrate the secular new year. Unlike most, we have two opportunities each year to take stock of our lives and reassess our goals. Many revel in making lists, coming up with improvement plans, setting goals, or taking steps forward. Gretchen Rubin,

the creator of *The Happiness Project*, suggests coming up with a “word” for the year that will create focus and set an intention for the upcoming year. This word can be anything: literal, figurative, or a combination. For example, the word “steps,” reflecting the goal of moving forward. When I think about Beth El, the word that embodies my goal is “kehillah,” community.

As President, I strive to focus on our goal of creating a vibrant community where we can pray, learn, and practice tikkun olam, all while forming relationships and being there for one another. Religious institutions are a vital source of community building. Everything we do at Beth El is devoted to maintaining and growing our Jewish community. Beth El is the glue that binds us together, creates a sacred space, and preserves our traditions for the next generation. Our minyans, our monthly social action projects, our preschool, religious school, and our adult education programs all speak to upholding Jewish values and making the world a better place.

Last week, *The New York Times* had an article about how several churches were canceling Christmas Day (but not Christmas Eve) services due to lack of participation and volunteers. They noted that their families preferred to be home, in pajamas, celebrating among themselves. Here at Beth El, we seek out different ways for our community to connect. We have traditional services. Or we have more innovative prayer services such as our monthly meditation services, musical Kabbalat Shabbat services, and our upcoming Dorot Shabbat

Experience for all ages. Whichever service you choose, we are providing human connection and uplifting our spirits.

Beth El also creates kehillah in many other ways, conducting our traditional December 25th Mitzvah Day, hosting a community-wide PJ Library Hanukkah Party for preschool-aged families throughout Phoenix, screening a Valley Beit Midrash film, hosting our own Hanukkah celebration, and the Women's League organizing a Reverse Tashlich at a community garden. In a few weeks we will celebrate the marriage of Rikki Silver and Adam Zubkoff, continuing the multi-generational ties of one our Beth El families.

Each day, I am reminded of the kindness and the meaningful relationships that make up Beth El. The Rabbi recently shared a midrash focusing on how God gave us the power to choose light or darkness. Bringing light to our Kehillah is who we are at Beth El.

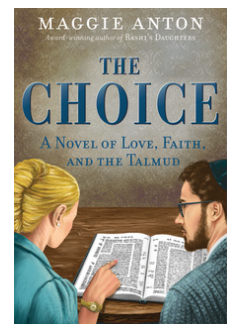

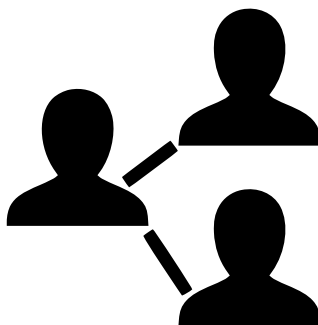

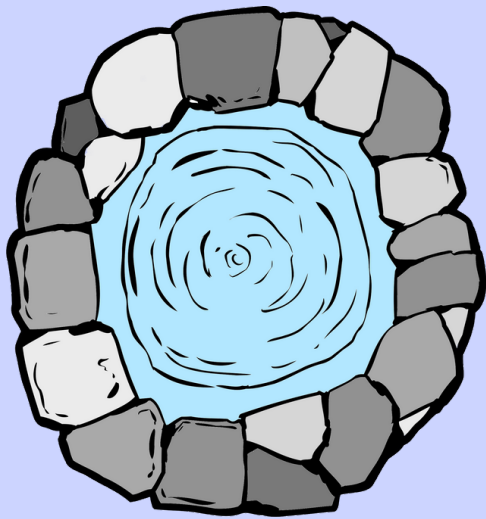
