Summer greetings! With Shavuot on Memorial Day weekend, we just finished another cycle of the school year and the Jewish spring holidays. We shared sad and joyous occasions this past year - saying goodbye to some of our dear members thev passed celebrating new beginnings R. Nitzan Stein Kokin with baby namings and weddings.

For me as your rabbi it is a tremendous blessing and honor to share life's journey with you in its ups and downs. And I always hope that I can be there for you to either hold you and comfort your pain or increase your joy!

But I do not only want to share those low or peak moments with you, rather I enjoy the day-to-day and the week-to-week celebrations as we navigate through life. So I want to tell you about a few newer initiatives that made a difference for me this year.

Thanks to Joanie Charnow and Nora Elias from our preschool, and our collaboration with Marci Lewis, we brought in PJ library events and activities for our young families several times this past year including Kabbalot Shabbat and holiday programs for our little ones. We will continue our collaboration next vear and hope to put together a regular Tot Shabbat.

Thanks to our active Hebrew school and teen parents, we've started the new Dorot Shabbat series. We just dipped our toes in the water with some holidays, Shabbatot, and two teen Havdalah evenings, but now we are in full planning mode for an alternative Shabbat and holiday experience in the coming school year with family-friendly services empowering parents and teens to become leaders and having fun being together at Shul.

We've also started a "Travel" Shabbat initiative, in which our community members open their houses for a Kabbalat Shabbat celebration, inviting their friends, families, and I to come and bring Friday night services to the evening. We shared a few of them that were a true delight for all. Potluck makes it easier on the hosts, and we spent the evenings singing, sharing stories, and eating together. It doesn't matter if we are just a small group of 8, for example (as not every living room hosts 30 people), or a large group - the essence is to celebrate Shabbat together personally!



We all grew a little closer as we shared the evenings. If you'd like me to come to your house for a Kabbalat Shabbat - please let me know - we are happy to help create such a joyful evening together, in a way that works for you! I will be back from vacation in the second half of July and would love to celebrate Shabbat with you.

"Shabbat at the Rabbi's house" is similar - just that everything happens at my house - so let me know, the next time you'd like to visit with the Stein-Kokins for a Shabbat or holiday!

I've also tremendously enjoyed our Be'er HaTorah study throughout the year with our intense discussions in which we bring our intellect and our personal reading to the text on Shabbat afternoon—another way to share ourselves.

United for Ukraine

".....you were once strangers...."

The devastation and destruction of the war in Ukraine continues into its second year, with thousands of Ukrainians dead and wounded. Millions were forced to leave their homes in search of safety and security.

Many are fleeing to nearby countries in Europe, but an estimated 100,000 are seeking temporary refuge in the United States through the United 4 Ukraine humanitarian initiative.

In response, a group of members from Beth El Congregation and Temple Chai has committed to sponsoring a Ukrainian family's resettlement in the Valley.

We are asking you to join us.

Beth El and Temple Chai: Uniting To Help Ukraine is working with HIAS, Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, through its Welcome Circle program, and has now created more than 100 circles across the United States to help.

HIAS has resettled refugees since 1881 and continues to rescue both Jews and non-Jews who are seeking safety from war or other life-threatening conditions.

The Welcome Circle assists newcomers in navigating their new environment, accessing government programs and social services, finding jobs and housing, and funding basic needs for an initial six-month period.

We have completed a Welcome Plan and submitted it to HIAS and are awaiting a match with a family coming to Phoenix. We are raising \$35,000 to pay for the immediate needs for the newcomers, and we are asking for your help.

The Center for Jewish Philanthropy and the Jewish Community Foundation will receive donations, and Jewish Free Loan has offered to disburse them. The three communal organizations are 501(c)3 charitable organizations, ensuring that all contributions are tax-deductible and all expenses are carefully audited. Any funds not used by our Welcome Circle will be directed to assisting local refugee resettlement.

BEWL organized a volunteer event at the Arizona Kosher Pantry on Sunday, May 21. It was wonderful to have the many helpful and eager hands of USYers join BEWL members, parents of USYers, and a few prospective synagogue members to pack meals for the homeless. We packed up at least 150 meals: meatloaf, salmon, and chicken that will be distributed to those in need, regardless of their religion. Beth El has a food donation box in the front lobby that goes to Ezras Cholim, but monetary donations are also needed for them to continue their work. Every month they distribute over 15,000 pounds of groceries, deliver 300 kosher meals, and operate a food pantry that is open five days a week to the public. Learn more at www.azkosherpantry.org. Dear Families,

May was a very busy and emotional month for me. Every year I say good-bye to our pre-k children but this year it was a little different. More than half of the class had been with us since they were infants others since they were toddlers or two. The impact of the last five years and how the pandemic effected our small children is challenging for not only the children but the parents and teachers too.

These kiddos have been through a lot; we all have been through a lot. They became a family, our preschool community family.

I have always told parents that from the first day, that I give them a tour when you are in our school; you are family. That is the best feeling a parent can have when dropping off their child.

Being a preschool teacher or Director for me was not about the money, it was about the importance of a job and the future of everything. Over the past thirty-plus years, things have changed. The students I taught are now doctors, scientists, have families or are still in school. I know my school made a difference in their lives, and they will also make a difference in other lives. The pandemic brought attention to the world many different things. One thing was that childcare workers are ESSENTIAL workers.

The Department of Economic Security gave preschools a Childcare Stabilization grant. This grant was to help us offer better pay to hire qualified teachers and buy supplies. They also devised other ways to help families pay for quality early education by raising the DES payments and more scholarships. People are starting to notice how important we are. The future begins with our young children; we must ensure they get what they need to grow and learn in a robust and healthy environment.

Our school, community, and all the families know they are in the best place possible for that to happen. June and July are what we call camp, it is a little different, but the learning and the comfort are the same. We will create a circus for the first five weeks and a fair for the last four. We will have water play and drama, art, and music, all taught by our talented Beth El Early Childhood Center staff.


