Tu B'Shevat Wisdom From Rabbi Carnie Shalom Rose



Yedidim/Yedidot Yekarim VeYekarot (dearest friends) Shalom!

My teacher and cousin, Rabbi Shlomo Carlebach (Z"L), once said that it is quite easy to tell which are

the most profound Jewish Holidays. They are, he suggested, the ones that are observed by the smallest number of individuals. His statement is not only poignant, but it is also tremendously accurate - especially as it relates to the holiday which we will celebrate in just a few days, Tu B'Shevat – The New Year of Trees. Sadly enough, for the most part, this day passes annually without much notice and without much recognition.

Now, we might believe that the reason the observance of this day has disappeared from our individual and communal radar screens has something to do with the fact that it is anachronistic and antiquated. Maybe its messages are no longer relevant? Perhaps Tu Beshvat no longer speaks to us in the way it spoke to past generations of Jews? After all, we are living in postmodern times. We are "more

evolved" and "more sophisticated". We know far more about the world around us than our ancients could ever have hoped to know.

I think not! In fact, Tu B'Shevat may be even more relevant today than ever before in our history. So why and how is it that Tu B'Shevat goes unnoticed and unrecognized by so many of us?

I believe there are several layers to this mystery. First, the holiday of Tu B'Shevat is not mentioned in the corpus of the Torah itself. It is mentioned only later in the Mishnah (c. 200 CE), and despite the fact that Judaism, as we know it today, is a Rabbinic religion (established by the Rabbinic Sages), the fact that it is not mentioned in the Bible may have contributed to its relegation to a "tier 2" holiday in the minds of some Jews.

Second, though the Holiday is mentioned in the Mishnah, no specific ritual observances are mentioned in connection with this day. And as we all know, disembodied religion (religion sans ritual) has little if any ability to maintain viability.

Finally, Tu B'Shevat seems to have

been observed most fastidiously by two groups of Jews—Sephardim & Kabbalists (mystics). And clearly, most of us are neither Sephardic nor are we initiates in the esoteric mystical traditions of our people. Hence, the holiday seems to have fallen out of favor—at least for the majority of Ashkenazi Diaspora Jews.

Yet despite all these valid reasons to downplay Tu B'Shevat, if we pause to reconsider this holiday and its focus on trees and what they have to teach humans, we might discover some tremendously valuable and spiritually uplifting meanings.

Two brief examples, which I hope, will wet your appetite for additional exploration:

1) The Rabbi of Ger taught: Tu B'Shevat is a special time. It is the season when we are called upon to pay heed and provide care for the trees. We tend to them and hope they will imbibe and absorb the nutrients that we lovingly provide for them. So too, is it a special time for the human to absorb the teachings of the Torah, which are nourishment to the soul. Tu B'Shevat

calls on us to open ourselves up anew to absorbing the waters of Torah and, in this way, become refreshed and renewed.

2) The Bialer Rebbe taught: The strength of the tree is in its roots. Without these roots, the tree cannot flourish—it cannot survive. So too, it is for the Jewish People. We must have strong roots. And these roots bind us not only to the past, but also to one another. When together we celebrate Tu B'Shevat, we join our roots to the roots of the primordial tree—the quarry from which all souls are hewn.

As we grow and deepen as individuals and as an Am Kadosh (Holy Community), I pray that we will together merit to celebrate this beautiful and profound holiday. May this be God's will - and our own! Amen!

Join Us For Shabbat Shirah, The Shabbat Of Song!



Every morning in services, our liturgy includes a beautiful section of Torah, recalling Moses and the Children of Israel singing to God,


Miriam leading the women with drums and dances in celebration, singing songs and dances of freedom, leaving oppression and degradation behind and looking toward a new beginning as a people. Through chanting this section each morning, we have the opportunity to reenact a celebration of freedom, placing ourselves at a moment of rebirth, perhaps reminding ourselves that each day is a chance for renewal, for us as a people and as individuals.

The section is from Parashat B'shallach and the passage begins, "Then Moses and the Children of Israel will sing this song to God, and they declared saying: I will sing to God for God is exalted above the exalted." It is the first person, "I will sing" that catches one's attention. Each person takes responsibility for this song; responsibility for celebration in this moment. I'm sure not everyone crossing the sea felt they were great singers, but they knew they needed to participate in this moment.

Each year, we have a Shabbat of song and celebration called Shabbat

Shirah. It is the Shabbat when we read Parashat B'shallach, the Song at the Sea. Each year we introduce new music into our community for this musical celebration. (Check your B'nai Amoona emails for information on how to listen to the melodies.) Those who have participated in years passed know it's not a performance. I cannot do it alone. Shabbat Shirah is a true celebration because the people of this singing community learn the songs and sing. This year, our Artist-in-Residence, Eitan Kantor has gathered a beautiful selection of melodies for us to learn and sing together. Do mark your calendars for this special Shabbat and for the beautiful song sessions that lead up to it. This is for those who consider themselves singers and for those who don't. And if you don't feel comfortable joining in person, please join the communal celebration by learning the melodies and joining virtually. Each of you deepen the musical and spiritual experience for your community when you say, "I will sing." I look forward to embracing the promise of communal and individual renewal that we can experience through song.

Member Spotlights: Cindy Schuval and Michael Samis



Cindy Schuval moved to St. Louis in 1992 with her husband David and joined Congregation B'nai Amoona shortly thereafter in 1994. She described that after

sitting in services just once, they joined because they liked Rabbi Cytryn as well as the warmth of Rabbi Unger. Cindy celebrated her Bat Mitzvah as an adult in December 2007 because growing up in an Orthodox shul did not provide her with that opportunity. Her three children, Matthew, Michelle and Jaime attended Hebrew and Religious school at B'nai Amoona and likewise celebrated their B'nai Mitzvah at the Shul. Both Matthew and Michelle also worked as Teacher Assistants in Hebrew School and all three attended Camp Ramot Amoona and participated in USY.

Cindy explained that upon joining the Shul, she became involved by working on a program called, "Mitzvah" through the suggestion of Enid Weisberg-Frank. She said this experience led her to become involved in Sisterhood, the Gift Shop and she was engaged as a Board member as well. Cindy progressed on the Board and was President from 2013-2016. She said she really liked being President very much and actively involved the Board to create an engaging atmosphere. Looking back, she feels that she helped facilitate volunteers, working as a team, and feels she was approachable and a good listener. She said she worked diligently to make sure she got back to anyone who contacted her and believes she kept open lines of communication. Cindy has continued to hold leadership positions in our congregation where she spearheaded the first Interfaith Initiative (that was unfortunately put on hold because of the COVID pandemic) and she chairs the Nominating Committee. In addition, Cindy is leading a task force that will examine scholarships for the ECC, Camps and Religious School.

When asked about her favorite aspect of membership, Cindy described her close friendships that all stem from Shul. Her love of our Senior Rabbi Carnie Shalom Rose and Cantor Sharon Nathanson allow her entire family to continue to feel very connected to B'nai Amoona.

Why We Do What We Do

I began Religious School in 1st grade, and since then, my attachment to synagogue life has never faltered. Being in a synagogue is like a second home to me. I remember the first time I was taught the words B'Tzelem Elohim (created in the image of God). Not the 10 Commandments. Not the Shema. These words. I could not read the Hebrew; however, it didn't matter at all. I understood the words as if they were being directed specifically to me. Instructed right then and there about the divine spark that was in all of us. Each created from the same, holy

When asked where my passion for

inclusion comes from, THIS is the moment that readily comes to mind. I know this much is true.

Each of us has gifts. Each of us has something to offer. Each of us is human. With this gift of humanity we are EACH deserving of dignity, hope, love, compassion, support, kindness, and inclusion. No one is to be separate from the Kehillah, community.

And why is this? THIS is because each of us is created B'Tzelem Elohim; created in God's image.

The Month of February is Jewish Disability Awareness, Acceptance and Inclusion Month (JDAIM). The mission is to unite Jewish communities worldwide to raise awareness and support efforts to foster inclusion.

The work of inclusion is a great passion of mine; however, I find it challenging that we name a month about it. I have come to realize that it is important to name things that are important. If not, it is easy to ignore them

This being said, Inclusion is much

more than creating a situation of us/them and finding ways to bridge the two. Inclusion is about the greater circle. Making space from the beginning. Challenging the narrative where we need programs which are inclusive. Instead, being inclusive is just that... a state of being. Always present. Always part of the normative way of life.

There are so many labels that can be given to someone...Someone with mental illness, physical disabilities, emotional challenges, or even intellectual deficits.

What if we disregard the labels? What if the narrative is changed so instead we focus on B'Tzelem Elohim. The HUMAN piece. Each with their own challenges, triumphs, blessings and incredible gifts. This is what I believe is the most important work I do at B'nai Amoona. Every day I am blessed to be present with congregants; engaging with and witnessing all the ways each person is B'Tzelem Elohim.

speak passionately about the reasons we should create circles where every human has a place among the community.
