I accept that your disability exists and you should have rights that protect you.


Inclusion

Here are some ways to help


- Wear a mask, you never know when you are around someone who is medically fragile and they should not have to disclose this information to people around them.
- Instead of saying "I'm done with the pandemic," say, "I'm traumatized by the pandemic."
- Remember the values you had prior to the pandemic and survival skills. If there is a gap, this may mean you are experiencing trauma.
- Reconnect to your Jewish values.






ABILITY vs CAPACITY: Capacity can change throughout the day based on a number of variables such as physical pain, being tired, already having done a lot that day. For example, anxiety may prevent someone from returning a text or phone call in a timely manner. Continue to reach out to that person and ask them if it is okay that you continue to contact them. Not having capacity does not mean they do not want to be included.

LRECC 2022-2023 REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN!

Why attend LRECC? There are many reasons but one is that we are a team of experienced professionals. Part of what we do, aside from nurturing and encouraging developmental growth, is provide developmental screenings. Although all children age 3 and older are given the DIAL-4 screening, we document your child's growth beginning in the infant room. The DIAL-4 screening assess developmental skills that are the foundation of learning - fine and gross motor skills, basic concepts, and language acquisition. We meet with you throughout the year formally and informally to discuss your child's growth and milestone achievements. When necessary, we refer families to Special School District (SSD) or other resources for further assessment. In some cases, SSD teachers come to LRECC to provide services in areas including speech, motor skills, concepts, language and social skills. If we feel a child younger than 3 may have delays, we refer children and parents to First Steps, which, like Special School District, provides developmental screenings. We know the earlier we can intervene and promote development, the more likely a child will have educational success.

Our hours of operation are 8:00 am-5:30 pm, all year. We follow current COVID-19 guidelines, so right now we do not mix age groups throughout the day. We will continue to keep our unvaccinated children

Our early childhood center has always been a happy place, and this year is no exception. It feels good to be here doing what we all love teaching your bright and wonderful children.

CAMP B'NAI AMI

This year is flying by very quickly. Summer will be here before you know it and summer means - Camp B'nai Ami! We have 7 weeks of camp this year: June 14-Aug. 5 and our hours of operation stay the same all year, 8:00 am-5:30 pm. We have a few openings and waitlists are growing. We can open more spaces as soon as we have the staff in place!

Our Camp Director is our fabulous Morah Kerri Alper, who also serves as the asst. director throughout the school year. We will make use of our huge campus for lots of outdoor activities and keeping everyone busy exploring nature. For campers in our oldest group, Koalas (turning 4 before July 30) we will be swimming once again at the Elks Lodge. Everyone else will have fun at water play! Summer is a wonderful and

memorable time for everyone.

Get Involved



It recently occurred to me that most members of B'nai Amoona have never actually visited my office. Unfortunately, most people haven't

been in our building in a long time. I hope this will change very soon.

I was never the kid who plastered their walls with teen idols or my favorite band members. I was the kid who didn't move around her furniture; don't you know that every room has a "proper position" for the bed?! I had a canopy bed at one time. Lots of stuffed animals and dolls. And many...many...many...books!

When I moved into my first apartment I suddenly realized that this was the first time my home could represent me! Without even consciously doing it, each aspect of my apartment, from pictures on the walls to my choice of bedspread, spoke to an aspect of my personality.

In my last 29+ years of professional life, my office space has become a second home. In doing so; it has become very reflective of who I am and my values. Recently, someone came to my office who hadn't visited in a while and shared that, once again, wherever I plant myself feels like "Liessa."

If you were to visit, you would see some of my favorite quotes, a messy desk (though I know where everything is at all times!), bookshelves over flowing with books, a soft place to rest, pictures of my kids, artwork supplied by children, and of course, always a stuffed animal and fidget tools galore!

If you look closely, you will also see two items that have been in every office space I have ever inhabited. The first is a small picture of Alexander from "Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day." by Judith Viorst. The second, a bright neon yellow SEND HELP sign that most individuals keep in their car.

The "Send Help" sign which was once a joke between co-workers, has become a constant reminder that I am not alone in the work I do. It takes a village of co-workers and volunteers to create the community we have at B'nai Amoona. I am blessed to be at a place where each of us is working towards the same mission.

The work is challenging and exhausting at times; yet the feeling of being part of an incredible

dedicated team creates an environment infused with energy and love.

Alexander is found taped to my screen. Why, you may ask? In the book, Alexander is having an absolutely "horrible" day. However, in the end, he also realizes it's just one day. There is always tomorrow.

Some days do not go as planned, and yet, it's okay. This has been very helpful for me during the Pandemic.

Tomorrow does come. When I speak to people on the phone or in my office, I often refer to Alexander. We often talk about how the Pandemic has been hard on our children. It most certainly has!

However, it has affected everyone! Many of my daily interactions are with people who are struggling due to the isolation and other challenges of the Pandemic. I have found that one of the most important messages I can share is one of community; Kehllah.

Alexander would want you to know that tomorrow will come. Today, let us help you, as we are here.

We, at B'nai Amoona, are a Kehillah; a community. We have pivoted. We have evaluated. We have been nuanced in what we do. We make decisions. We change those decisions. We create. We challenge. We DO the work.

In the end; whatever we do, we are still here! In the building. On Zoom. In the Sanctuary or Chapel. Our classrooms are filled and we are always just a phone call away.

If anything, this is the message I hope to share. Two years in... and we are still HERE. Educating, Davening. Engaging. Sharing. Supporting. Caring.

As I sit here in my office, I can wish that someday soon each of you will come by and visit. You'll see my messy desk and feel welcomed! However, until then, I want to remind each person that we are still here. Your community is here for you. Join a Minyan. Take a class. Volunteer. Reach out in whatever way you feel comfortable. Your B'nai Amoona Jewish Community is here for you. And we will continue to be!


