Dear Chofetz Chayim Worshipper,

We are proud of the fact that with your patience, help and support, we continue to respond to the challenges that Hashem brought to us in the form of COVID 19.

We have, during the past weeks, taken some small steps in returning back to holding synagogue services, which have been held with participants wearing masks and proper social distancing. Service times have been modified to minimize interaction.

It is with great joy and trepidation that we move forward with services for the High Holidays. At this time, we are scheduling Rosh Hashanah. Yom Kippur programming will be scheduled later.

The following schedule has been established based on the advisement of our medical and halachic experts, which will ensure the quality of our High Holiday services, and at the same time protect those attending.

- **In order to ensure the prescribed safe social distancing, attendance at services will only be allowed by pre-reservation.** We have prided ourselves throughout the past 41 years that our doors are open to all Jews, however, this still being the case, we must limit attendance to only those who register, and to be fair, it must occur on a first-register-first-served basis.
- **Only those wearing masks that cover nose & face will be allowed to attend services**
- As at all medical facilities, temperature will be taken at the door.
- Rosh Hashanah morning and evening services will take place inside the synagogue, and are open to men and women by pre registration only
- Sunday's outdoor Shofar blowing in our synagogue courtyard is open to men and women by pre registration only
- Due to necessary health precautions, Rosh Hashanah services are not open to children under Bar/Bat Mitzvah age unless actively davening and sitting with parent at all times.
- If you plan on attending, you must register by sending an email to Rabbi Becker

Friday evening, September 18, 6:10pm - 6:55pm

Shabbos morning, September 19th, 8:30-11:00am

Shabbos evening, September 19th, 5:50 pm-7:05 pm

Sunday morning, September 20th, 8:30am-11:30

Sunday morning September 20th, 11:30 [Outdoor Shofar blowing] (This will allow those who have not attended services inside to hear the Shofar and fulfill the mitzvah).

Sunday Evening September 20th 5:55 PM - 7:05 pm

Due to the limitation of participants, it is REQUIRED that those registering arrive on time.

******Again, if you plan to attend you MUST register by sending an email to Rabbi Becker indicating which services and times you plan to attend******

Please respond ASAP. As much as it pains us, when we reach our registration limit, we will be forced to turn people away.
