MEN'S SHAVUOS ALL-NIGHTER **SATURDAY, JUNE 8, BEGINNING 11:30 P.M.**

On Saturday night, June 8th beginning at 11:30 p.m., we will participate in the exciting centuries old tradition of spending the first night of Shavuos immersed in Torah study.

Shavuos is the anniversary of the entire Jewish nation's receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai. On that glorious morning, exactly 3,331 years ago, G-d woke us from our sleep with the sound of thunder.

In commemoration and to demonstrate that we are so excited to celebrate receiving the Torah, we don't need to be woken up because we won't sleep the night before. Rabbi Becker will lead an exhilarating study session.
