Rabbi's Message

At Temple Beth El, we begin preparing for the High Holidays soon after Pesach. So much goes into planning and thinking through how we want to approach Rosh Hashanna and Yom Kippur the coming year. Indeed, a great deal of details are involved in planning for the High Holidays. However, there is an even more important preparation that is necessary, that does not involve technical details. It is the preparation of the individual heart and that holds true for all of us.

Beginning with the Hebrew month of Elul, which this year falls on August 17th & 18th, we change the order of our daily practice. The shofar is sounded at the end of the morning service, every day except Shabbat. Not only does the sound of the shofar alert us to the coming of the High Holidays, it serves as a “wake-up” call to get busy with the task of *teshuvah*, repentance. Although sounding the shofar during this period is merely a custom and does not carry the weight of the mitzvah as it does on Rosh Hashanna, this year with the first day of Rosh Hashanna falling on Shabbat, we will not sound the shofar. In some sense, then, the custom of hearing the shofar during Elul this year carries more weight, since we will be deprived of hearing the shofar on the first day of Rosh Hashanna.

Like anything important in life, proper preparation for the High Holidays entails a process. Interestingly, this process lasts 40 days (from the first of Elul through Yom Kippur), an auspicious number in Jewish tradition. After 40 days on Mt. Sinai, Moses descends with the Torah and gives it to the people. The Israelites wander

through the wilderness for 40 years before entering the Promised Land. Forty, according to Pirkei Avot, is the age of understanding/insight. Forty is one of the few ages listed in Avot 5:23 that is based on a biblical verse. In Deuteronomy 29:3-4, Moses addresses the Israelites saying: “Yet to this day the Lord has not given you a mind to understand or eyes to see or ears to hear. I led you through the wilderness forty years.” Rash, in commenting on this verse says, “It takes a person 40 years to fully understand the mind of his/her creator and to gain the wisdom that s/he has learned. So forty is a magic number for insight or understanding.

Understanding our purpose in life, what God wants of us, is critical to this 40 day period. That goal is triggered not only by the sounding of the shofar every morning, but by the addition of Psalm 27 to the morning and evening service. Why add Psalm 27? Most commentators puzzle over what this Psalm has to do with the High Holidays. It does not discuss the act of repentance proper for this period. For me, the key line in this Psalm and its connection to the High Holiday period is verse 11: “Show me Your way, O Lord, and lead me in a level path.” We all pray for inner insight and understanding during this period of what our mission is in life. One the keys to attaining that is balance, a “level path.” Perhaps that is why the scale is the zodiac symbol for Tishrei, the beginning of the New Year. May we all do the work and preparation necessary to achieve both insight and balance in life!

Hayom Harat Olam - Today is the Birthday of the World *And All is Possible*

This year, Rosh HaShana falls on Shabbat. The first day of the holiday will be silent of shofar blowing because of this. On Shabbat, we refrain from hearing the blast that enters our souls, yet we still recite the most famous *piyyut* (liturgical poem) associated with shofar: “*Hayom Harat Olam, Hayom Ya’amid baMishpat, Kol y’tzurei ha’olamim - im k’vanim im k’avadim...*” Today the world is born - today standing in judgment are all the creations of the world, whether as children or as servants.”

The notion, the juxtaposition of the world being birthed, yet the creations of that world being judged, has long captivated commentators, and provided a basis for considering our intention during the season of repentance. Is the world celebrating its birth; or are we meant to stand before the judge of all? Do we await some sort of rebirth at this season; or are we recounting our actions for review? It seems that this *piyyut* is conveying that there are many possibilities - in multiple choice questions it is the option that says “all of the above”. This is a most puzzling part of our liturgy that is essential to our understanding of the Rosh HaShana holiday and service.

Even without the sounding of shofar, we can still feel the power of its blast through the recitation of this *piyyut*.

With this in mind, we have two opportunities to explore this central liturgy of Rosh HaShana:

- Hayom Harat Olam - All the Possibilities - An adult education class in 3 parts with Shari Spark, offered 7:30 - 8:30 p.m., on August 17th (Rosh Chodesh Elul), August 24th and August 31st at TBE - Start laying the foundations for meaningful participation on Rosh HaShana
- Rosh HaShana, Day 1, September 16th - Our family B’Yachad Service, 10:30 a.m. - 12 noon. An interactive family (appropriate for kids along with their adults) service and program exploring the theme of birth, rebirth and the three themes of the Rosh HaShana Musaf.

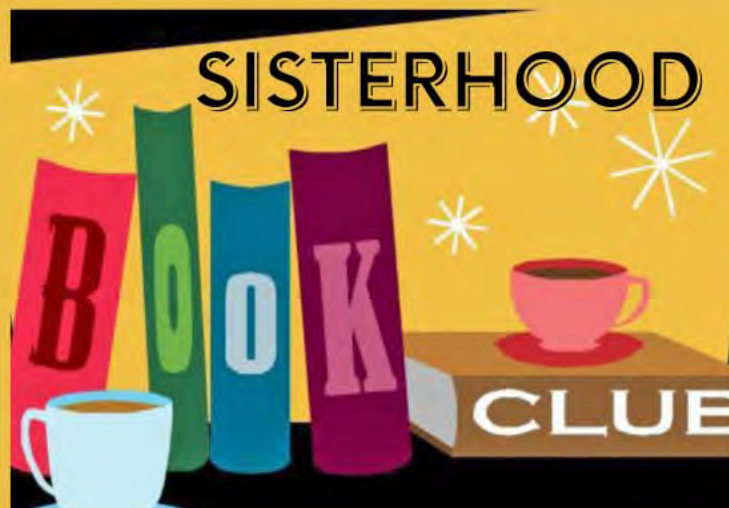

The modern quest for sustainability has posed an urgent question. What does Judaism say about caring for the earth? What behaviors does Judaism expect of us?

Efforts to answer this question have tended to focus on discrete deeds. But where was the overarching rubric that bound them all together and could guide our steps in a world of novel challenges? In a religion that expresses its values through commandments, was there not an all-encompassing mitzvah calling on us to sustain the world?

Pursuing this question, we found such a mitzvah hiding in plain sight - a commandment named "Yishuv haOlam," establishing and maintaining a habitable world. Little known, because it appears in no list of the 613 commandments, we find its footprints throughout rabbinic literature to this very day.

We invite you to tour the sources with us.



Rabbi Avram Israel Reisner is rabbi emeritus of Congregation Chevrei Tzedek in Baltimore, MD. He is a member of longstanding on the Conservative Movement's Committee of Jewish Law and Standards, was an editor of the two volume Siddur Sim Shalom published in 1998-2003 and is the creator of the triennial haftarah cycle. He serves as an appointed member of the Maryland Stem Cell Research Commission.



Rabbi Nina Beth Cardin was in the first class of women admitted to the rabbinical school of the Jewish Theological Seminary and has devoted much of her career to being a community rabbi. She currently directs the Maryland Campaign for Environmental Human Rights. She co-wrote, along with her husband, Rabbi Reisner, the Conservative movement's teshuvah (legal responsum) on Judaism and sustainability which was adopted unanimously by the Conservative Movement's Committee of Jewish Law and Standards in 2019.
