Over 90 years ago,

Temple Beth El was a little room and a big dream.



June 4th, 1929

Nineteen founders met to formulate the aims of a new Temple dedicated to the principles of the Conservative Movement, then developing in the United States. Their first services were held in a room, gradually moving into a hall, and finally to a private home on 12th & Walnut Streets that the 50 member families remodeled to function as a Temple.

1935

The congregation continued to grow until it was necessary to rent a large auditorium for High Holiday and Confirmation services. The Hebrew School needed larger classrooms and the congregation needed space for social functions.





Our school has received the "Framework for Excellence Award" from our parent organization, The United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism. This is the highest award given to religious schools in Conservative Judaism. Our success is due to both an outstanding faculty who are skilled at sharing their love of Judaism and due to our supportive parents, who extend our lessons into their homes.

Dear Parents.



Sisterhood Message


Welcome to Temple Beth El. As a potential member of our congregation, you are invited to participate in our numerous activities. We offer something for everyone.

Ritual and Service of Temple Beth El


Under the guidance of Rabbi Moshe Re'em and coordinator, Shari Spark, Ritual and Service oversees and implements Jewish ritual life, prayer, life cycle events and Torah study. We look forward to your participation, leadership and learning.

Tefillah, Torah & Worship The heart of our Temple Beth El community

Observances of Shabbat, holidays and life-cycle events reflect our Conservative, traditional orientation. Lively melodies mix with traditional modes to create an engaging and vibrant prayer atmosphere. Our members are welcome to lead from the bimah as well as join in from the "kahal" (congregation). Whether you participate in person, or join in virtually, our shul is a community where participants of all ages and life experiences come together, sharing in prayer, ritual and the study of Torah.

We follow the liturgy in Siddur Sim Shalom. While much of the service is conducted in Hebrew, English readings and transliterations are interspersed.





Friday night services are led by Rabbi with guitar for Kabbalat Shabbat and include hearty congregational participation. Our Friday services are often enlivened by our youth leaders. "Shabbat Under the Stars" is our beautiful, summer outdoor service. In the winter, we start early with a "Shmooze and Spirits" social half-hour, and in the spring/summer we begin later and stay after for Oneg Shabbat.

Morning services embrace the peace of the day and feature our congregants reading Torah and Haftara, and leading davening. Our prayer is relaxed and spiritual. Divre Torah often include congregational participation.

Several Shabbatot are enhanced: "Something for Everyone" welcoming our children for youth services, and adults for GPS/Guided Prayer Service; once a month celebrating Birthday Shabbat; honoring our Holocaust Torah annually; Sisterhood Shabbat with our members leading; Dor l'Dor family services; and more! Stay for delicious Kiddush lunch following services where we welcome you to our Beth El family.

Havdalah with Rabbi Re'em on Facebook Live brings our Beth El family together online. We welcome the new week in song as we join Rabbi for a virtual sing along! Several times during the year, we join for Havdalah in-person for our family Havda-lalala that includes candle lighting, story and song.

High Holidays at Temple Beth El focus on welcoming the New Year and preparing ourselves for the work of teshuvah. With opportunities for everyone—traditional to contemporary, for adults, families, teens and children—High Holidays at Beth El offer a deeply meaningful experience.

We welcome you to Temple Beth El's davening community: Dedicated families and individuals of different ages and life experiences, who participate in many different roles!
