Indemnification	 Provides that Congregation shall indemnify any person who is a party to any legal proceeding, because he/she was a Director, Officer, employee, professional staff member, Rabbi, Cantor, or agent of the Congregation, against expenses (including attorney's fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement (if approved by the Board of Directors in advance) actually and reasonably incurred by him/her in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding, if he/she acted in good faith and in a manner he/she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Congregation and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his/her conduct was unlawful. Congregation shall advance expenses upon receipt of an undertaking to repay if ultimately determined that such individual not entitled to be indemnified.
Emergency Bylaws	 Expressly provides that in the event of an emergency: A special meeting of the Executive Committee or the Board may be called by any Officer or Director upon one hour's notice The Director or Directors in attendance at such meeting shall constitute a quorum
