PARSHA MATTERS - by Rabbi Chaim Strauchler


LAW'S AND LIFE'S PURPOSE

Our Torah portion contains a series of laws for how God intends for the Jewish people to live. Why does a religious text put such an emphasis on the mundane operation of society, including laws such as a goring ox and a wondering donkey?

The Ramban argues that in order to abide by the last of the Ten Commandments, not to be jealous of another's possessions, we need to know what belongs to whom. The myriad laws in our parsha serve an instrumental purpose. They are a means by which we know what is ours and what is our neighbour's.

Rashi sets a more profound goal for these laws. The laws of damages are juxtaposed with those of constructing the altar to teach that these two institutions must exist side by side. The Sanhedrin must be located next to the Temple. Justice is an embodiment of the divine, which is no less important than the Beit Hamikdash. These laws contain within them divine meaning that requires us not just to abide by them; we must also know their logic and study them in depth.

On Shabbat March 2, we will welcome Prof. Chaim Saiman as Scholar-in-Residence. His recent book, *Halakhah: The Rabbinic Idea of Law*, makes the argument that our sages "use concepts forged in regulatory frameworks to do the work that other societies assign to philosophy, political theory, theology, and ethics – and even to art, drama, and literature. While Halakhah's regulatory ideals are realized through observance of its laws, access to the broader social and religious aims is gained, through Talmud Torah." As we read this week's parsha, let us ask ourselves the degree to which we have engaged in these social and religious aims. May we devote ourselves to the many levels of our Torah's meaning.
