# PARSHA MATTERS - by Rabbi Elliott Diamond

### A TALKING DONKEY

A talking donkey?! This image or character seems much more appropriate for a Disney movie than for the parsha. And yet, that's precisely that image that the Torah places before us in Parshat Balak. The frightened king of Moav, Balak, hired Bilaam to use his proven powers of cursing to harm Bnei Yisrael. While riding his donkey on route to do his dirty work, the Torah describes a miracle that happened: Bilaam's donkey began to talk and complained to Bilaam, his owner, that he was mistreating him. This startling episode was intended to stop Bilaam from continuing with his plan. A short interaction ensued before Bilaam continued on his way - ultimately to fail in his mission because of Hashem's direct intervention at a later point.

But why the need for a talking donkey? Why did Hashem change the rules of nature if, in the end, he anyway intervened and didn't let Bilaam curse the Jews? It seems like the talking donkey didn't have any impact whatsoever on Bilaam's behaviour. In fact, the Mishna in Masechet Avot declares that the miracle of the talking donkey was created by Hashem on the first Erev Shabbat of Bereshit, moments before sunset, in order to ensure its timely appearance centuries later at the right time. But did this turn out to be a "useless" miracle?

Rabbi Chaim Shmulevitz z", the late Rosh Yeshiva of the Mir Yeshiva in Yerushalayim, offers a provocative answer. The miracle of the talking donkey was never intended to protect the Jewish from any harm that Bilaam had intended. Rather Hashem had one goal in mind regarding the miracle of the donkey: to give a wicked man the chance to change his ways and improve. In other words, declared Rabbi Shmulevitz, it was important to and worthwhile for Hashem to create a miracle just to try to straighten out a single evil person, even if the attempt didn't work in the end.

Who is worthy of our help and consideration? Who do we "write off" as not deserving enough of our time, effort and energy? Some donkeys carry a message worth considering.




