## PARSHA MATTERS - by Rabbi Jared Anstandig

### MISHKAN - FOR GOD OR FOR US?

We often speak about the Mishkan as being the abode of the Shechina, the divine presence, so to speak. And the medieval commentator, Rabbi Yosef Bechor Shor (Shemot 30:1), explains that this is for good reason. After all, the furniture of the Mishkan closely resembles that which we would expect to find in the home – the Menorah is the light fixture, the Shulchan is the table, and the Mizbeach is the kitchen. Even the smaller Mizbeach used for incense is likened to a perfumery. Finally, the inner sanctum, the Kodesh HaKodashim, seems to be no different than a bedroom, as it were.

Accordingly, asks Bechor Shor, are we to imagine that God actually lived in the Mishkan? He answers with an emphatic "no!" The Mishkan is not for *Him*. The heavens cannot contain His presence, how would it even be conceivable for the walls of the Mishkan to contain Him? Rather, Bechor Shor explains that the Mishkan is for *us*. By creating something resembling a home for God, it makes us better people.

He explains that by having the Mishkan, a physical representation of God's presence among the people, we hold ourselves to higher standards. If God lives down the block from us, we'll be more careful with how we behave.

But, perhaps the most important part of this idea is the institution of sacrifices, particularly those offered to expiate sin. Bechor Shor explains that if we didn't have these korbanot we would have no motivation to repent or even to perform mitzvot. He presents an analogy: If a person has laundry detergent, any time he or she stains his or her shirt, he or she will clean the shirt – provided there is a good reason to do so. But, if one lacks any method of cleaning clothing, even if the need is very great, one will be resigned to have a perpetually dirty shirt and give up even trying to avoid stains in the future. Both shirts will inevitably get dirty, but only the one who can clean the shirt will actually do so and will try to keep it clean in the future.

So too with our lives, Bechor Shor explains, with the Mishkan and korbanot. We will inevitably make mistakes in our lives; our clothing will get dirty. But the proximity of the Mishkan reminds us that God cares, and korbanot give us the means to make our mistakes right and demonstrate the importance of doing better in the future. And so, although the Mishkan is His house, so to speak, the Mishkan is ultimately there for us – to help us become the best versions of ourselves.
