PARSHA MATTERS - by Rabbi Jared Anstandig

UNITY ON SUKKOT

Many of us are familiar with the idea initially mentioned in Vayikra Rabba 30:12 that each of the four species represents a different kind of Jew. The Etrog, both fragrant and tasty, represents Jews that have both Torah and good deeds. The Arava, lacking both, represents Jews who are lacking both Torah and good deeds. And the Hadas and the Lulav, each containing only one of those qualities, representing Jews who contain either only Torah or only good deeds. The idea, the Midrash goes on, is that we come together for our sake. The Jewish people become stronger when we are all unified.

But there is more to the story. Rav Yosef Karo in Beit Yosef (Orach Chaim 551:11) quotes a story as told by the 13th century Italian rabbi, Rabbi Menahem Recanati. He writes:

On the first night of Sukkot, I hosted a certain German guest named Rabbi Yitzchak. In a dream that night, I saw this guest writing the four-letter name of God, but he spaced the final letter far apart from the three preceding letters. When I asked him why, he responded that such was the practice in his hometown. I protested and rewrote the Name properly. I was in wonderment and didn't understand the meaning of the dream. The next morning I saw this guest shaking the lulav but holding the etrog far apart from the other three species. At this point I understood meaning of the dream.

Shockingly, in this dream, the different species in the Lulav bundle don't represent different types of Jews; they represent the four letters of the name of God. The Name of God was incomplete until the four species were finally brought together. When we are separated from one another, it doesn't only harm our peoplehood. Our disunity impacts the very nature of God, making Him incomplete, as it were. This year, as we pick up our Lulav bundles, may we remember that we all must come together. Not only for our sake, but for the sake of the Oneness of God.

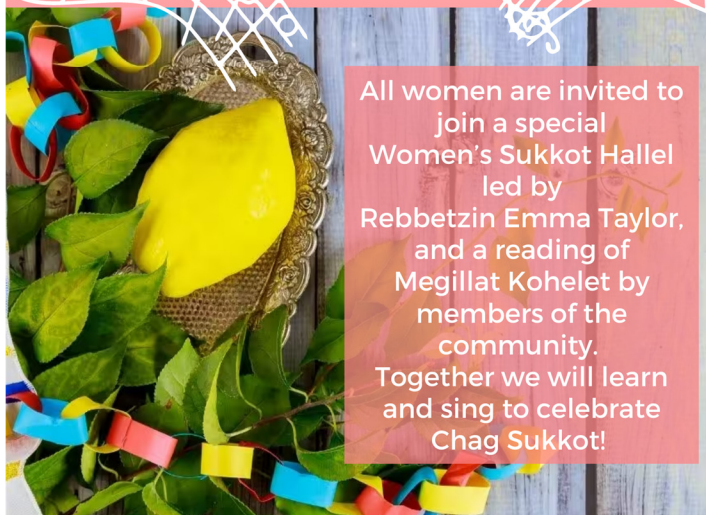

The Koffler Gallery, in partnership with architect Manuel Herz and renowned Holocaust scholar and curator Robert Jan van Pelt, announces the world-premiere exhibition of *The Synagogue at Babyn Yar: Turning the Nightmare of Evil into a Shared Dream of Good*.

This international exhibition is about Babyn Yar in Kyiv, Ukraine, the site of the first major massacre of Jewish people during the Holocaust on Sep. 29-30, 1941. Featured are a scale model of the Synagogue designed by Herz; materials that served as sources of inspiration for Herz; large-scale photographic murals directed by Ukrainian-Canadian photographer Edward Burtynsky taken by Ukrainian photographer Maxim Dondyuk; and architectural photography by Dutch photographer Iwan Baan.

This third exhibition at Beth Tzedec drawn from Kaufman's work in Poland and Ukraine, depicts the remnants of Jewish life that remained there 75 years after the Holocaust. The exhibition features 17 images from a trip to Ukraine in 2016. Kaufman explored the cities of Lviv and Bukovina and surrounding smaller cities and towns.

The Jewish population of western Ukraine today is less than five thousand, and it is a struggle to preserve the artifacts of Jewish life from before the Holocaust. The ongoing conflict in Ukraine underlines the difficulty of preserving Jewish material culture in areas where the community is small and without resources.

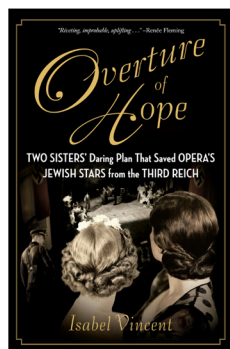

Rabbi Dr. B. Barry Levy began teaching Bible, Hebrew, and cognate subjects at Erna Michael College of Yeshiva University in 1969 at the age of 24. He received semicha from YU in 1971, and he completed his PhD at NYU in Ancient Near-Eastern Languages in 1974 with an analysis of a unique Vatican manuscript of the Palestinian Targum, Neofiti 1. As Ba'al Koreh he has memorized much of the Torah text. **Professor at McGill University from 1975 until retirement in 2017**, Levy taught more than 50 different courses in three faculties, chaired the Jewish Studies Department, was **Dean of the Religious Studies Faculty**, and **directed the Jewish Teacher Training Program**. He has lectured all over the world. Levy is the author of *Planets, Potions and Parchments*, *Fixing God's Torah: The Accuracy of the Bible Text in Jewish Law* and the forthcoming *Jewish Masters of the Sacred Page, a History of the Miqra'ot Gedolot*.
