HALAKHIC CORNER Yom Kippur

- **Q:** What is the proper format for Havdala at the conclusion of Yom Kippur?
- A: The Shulchan Aruch (O"C 624:4) rules that there is an obligation to make Havdala with a candle after Yom Kippur. In contrast to Havdala at the conclusion of Shabbat, the flame must come from a fire that has been burning since the beginning of Yom Kippur. The Mishnah Berurah explains that on an ordinary Saturday night we create a new flame to light the Havdala candle in order to commemorate Adam's discovery of fire which took place at the conclusion of the first Shabbat in history. However, at the conclusion of Yom Kippur we use an already existent flame to light the Havdala candle to signify that the use of fire is prohibited on Yom Kippur unlike other holidays when we are permitted to use fire in order to cook. The Shulchan Aruch records a dissenting opinion that one need not use a fire for Havdala that was burning since the beginning of Yom Kippur and one can light a match and light the Havdala candle from the match.

The Shulchan Aruch also rules that we do not use Besamim for Havdala after Yom Kippur even if Yom Kippur coincides with Shabbat. The Mishnah Berurah explains that we usually use Besamim during Havdala in order to comfort our bodies with a pleasant smell after losing our Neshama Yiterah, the additional soul that we receive on Shabbat. However, since Yom Kippur is a fast day we do not receive an additional soul and therefore no Besamim is needed.

DAVENING @ HOME

Step by Step Minhagim and Halakhot Shabbat Parashat Ha'azinu-Shabbat Shuva Erev Yom Kippur/Yom Kippur through Erev Sukkot September 25-October 2, 2020 By Rabbi Elazar Muskin

During the Covid-19 crisis, please use the following guide if you are davening without a Minyan.

Friday, September 25th

- One may say *Selichot* without a *Minyan*. The only passage one should *omit* in *Selichot* is *Hashem, Hashem Kel Rachum V'chanun*. If one, however, joins the *Minyan* via zoom, he may recite with the *Minyan, Hashem, Hashem Kel Rachum V'chanun*.
- **Include** *Tachanun* at the conclusion of *Selichot* and *Shacharit*.
- Insert Shir HaMa'alot before Yishtabach.
- Recite Shacharit Amida with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- At the end of the *Amida* recite *Avenu Malkenu*.
- In Shacharit after reciting the Shir Shel Yom recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.
- During *Chodesh Elul* we encourage everyone to recite five chapters of *Tehilim* daily (except on *Shabbat* and *Rosh Hashanah*) proceeding accordingly through the entire Book of *Tehilim*, concluding on *Erev Yom Kippur*.
- Recite the Mincha Amida with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- Neither Tachanun nor Avenu Malkenu are recited at Mincha.
- Candles can be lit between 5:30 6:27 PM.
- A full Kabbalat Shabbat and Maariv with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions should be recited.
- After the *Maariv Amida* recite *Vayechulu* but not *Magen Avot* and *Elokeinu V'Elokei Avotenu*. They are only said when davening with a permanent *Minyan*. It is customary to recite *Vayechulu* together with either another male or female.
- In Maariv after Aleynu recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.

Shabbat, September 26th – Parashat Ha'azinu – Shabbat Shuva

- Shacharit is a regular Shabbat Shacharit with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- Insert Shir HaMa'alot before Nishmat.
- Do not say Avenu Malkenu.
- Do not say *Anim Zemirot*. This is only recited when *davening* with a *Minyan*.
- Recite the Shir Shel Yom for Shabbat followed by Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.
- The Torah reading from a *Chumash* is *Ha'azinu*. The *Haftorah* is the special *Haftorah* for *Shabbat Shuva*. It is from Hosea (14:2-10 then Joel 2:11-27 and Micha 7:18-20).
- Skip both chapters of *Y'kum Purkan* and the *Mi Sheberach*. They are only said when *davening* with a *Minyan*.
- Recite the Mi Sheberach for the IDF and the Tefilah for Medinat Yisrael.
- Recite Av HaRachamim followed by Ashrei.
- *Mincha* can be said as early as 1:15 PM but no later than 6:35 PM.
- During *Mincha* recite the sentence *Va'Ani Tefilati* right after *U'va L'Tziyon*.
- During Mincha Amida include the Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- Recite *Tzidkatcha Tzedek* at *Mincha*.
- *Maariv* is the regular Saturday night *Maariv* with *Aseret Yemei Teshuva* insertions.

- Omit V'he Noam but say V'yeeten Lecha.
- After Aleynu recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.
- Shabbat ends 7:30 PM. Say a complete Havdalah.
- At 9:00 PM, special Yizkor via Zoom for those who will not be at a *Minyan* on *Yom Kippur*.

Sunday, September 27th - Erev Yom Kippur

Follow the listing of Tefilot for Kol Nidrei and Maariv compiled by Rabbis Muskin and Proops.

- One may say *Selichot* without a *Minyan*. The only passage one should *omit* in *Selichot* is *Hashem, Hashem Kel Rachum V'chanuan*. If one, however, joins the *Minyan* via zoom, he may recite with the *Minyan, Hashem, Hashem Kel Rachum V'chanun*.
- Do not recite *Tachanun* at the conclusion of *Selichot*.
- Regular weekday *Shacharit Davening* but omit the following:
 - o Mizmor LeToda
 - Tachanun
 - o Avenu Maklenu
 - LaMenatzeach
- Insert Shir HaMa'alot before Yishtabach.
- In Shacharit after reciting the Shir Shel Yom recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.
- Complete reciting the last five chapters of Sefer Tehilim.
- Recite *Mincha* before you eat your *Seuda HaMafseket*. Insert *Vidui* at the end of *Amida* for *Erev Yom Kippur*.
- Do not say *Avenu Malkenu* at the end of Mincha.
- It is customary to bless one's children before *Yom Kippur*.
- If you will be saying *Yizkor* on *Yom Kippur* remember to light a *Yarzheit* candle before lighting *Yom Tov* candles.
- *Everyone*, whether saying *Yizkor* or not, should light a 25-hour candle in order to have a source that has burned all *Yom Kippur* from which to light the *Havdalah* candle after *Yom Tov* ends.
- Candles should be lit no later than 6:24 PM. The *Brakha* is *Lehadlik Ner shel Yom HaKippurim* and *Shehecheyanu*.
- Men should put on their *Talit* and *Kittel* before starting *Kol Nidrei*.
- Give yourself enough time to recite *Tefillat Zakah* before *Kol Nidrei*.
- *Kol Nidrei* should begin right after lighting candles.
- Do not recite the passage Al Da'at HaMakom that precedes Kol Nidrei and eliminate the sentence MiYom Kippurim Sheavar ad Yom Kippurim Zeh.
- Men should recite Shehecheyanu after saying Kol Nidrei.
- It is customary to recite *Vidui* ten times during *Yom Kippur*. In order to achieve this say *Vidui* (*Ashamnu* and *Al Chet*) both during your silent *Amida* and after the *Amida*.

Monday, September 28th – Yom Kippur

Follow the listing of *Tefilot* for *Yom Kippur* day compiled by Rabbis Muskin and Proops for *Yom Kippur*.

- Put on your *Talit* and *Kittel* before starting *Birkhot HaShachar*.
- It is customary to recite *Vidui* ten times during *Yom Kippur*. In order to achieve this say *Vidui* (*Ashamnu* and *Al Chet*) both during your silent *Amida* and after the *Amida* for *Shacharit*, *Mussaf*, *Mincha* and *Neilah*.
- *Yizkor* may be recited without a *Minyan*.
- *Yizkor* is said even if one is mourning a parent during the 12 months.
- Even if you do not say *Yizkor*, you should say *Av HaRachamim* followed by *Ashrei* and then *Mussaf* with *Aseret Yemei Teshuva* insertions.

- Recite the *Avoda* after saying the silent *Amida*, but do not kneel to the ground as is customary in Shul.
- The earliest time one can start *Mincha* is 1:14 PM.
- *Neilah* should not begin before 5:27 PM and no later than 6:41 PM.
- During *Neilah* be careful to change the wording of the insertions to reflect it is *Neilah*.
- During Avenu Malkenu be careful to change the wording to reflect it is Neilah.
- Conclude *Neilah* by reciting *Shema* once, *Baruch Shem Kevod* three times, and *HaShem Hu HaElokim* seven times.
- The *Shofar* should not be blown before the fast ends at 7:27 PM.
- If you are able to blow the *Shofar* blow a set of:
 - o Tekiah, Shevarim-Teruah, Tekiah
 - o Tekiah, Shevarim, Tekiah
 - o Tekiah, Teruah, Tekiah
- Keep on your *Talit* and *Kittel* until you finish *Maariv*.
- Recite a regular weekday *Maariv* while including *Atah Chonantanu* in the *Amida*.
- Recite *Kiddush Levanah*. Look up at the moon and then turn east to say *Kiddush Levanah*. If you have no family member with you say the phrase *Shalom Alechem Alechem Shalom* to yourself three times. Say *Aleynu* at the conclusion of *Kiddush Levanah*.
- Recite *Havdalah*. Begin with *Borei Pri HaGefen*. Omit the *Brakhah* for *Besamim*. Light the candle from the *Yarzheit* candle that has burned throughout *Yom Kippur*. Say the concluding blessing like every Saturday night.

Tuesday - Thursday, September 29th - October 1st

- Recite a regular weekday *Shacharit*. Remember not to say the insertions of *Aseret Yemei Teshuva*. If you by accident recite them, even *HaMelech HaKadosh*, you do not need to repeat the *Amida*.
- Omit *Tachanun* at *Shacharit* and *Mincha*.
- Say Lamenatzeach between Ashrei and U'va L'Tziyon.
- The last time to say *Kiddush Levanah* is on Thursday evening.

Friday, October 2nd - Erev Sukkot

- Recite a regular weekday Shacharit
- Omit Tachanun at Shacharit and Mincha.
- Say Lamenatzeach between Ashrei and U'va L'Tziyon.
- Candles can be lit between 5:22 6:18 PM. The Brakhot on the candles are *Lehadlik Ner shel Shabbat v'shel Yom Tov* and *Shehecheyanu*.
- *Mincha* and *Kabbalat Shabbat* should take place no later than 6:25 PM. An abridged *Kabbalat Shabbat* is recited. It begins with *Mizmor Shir L'yom HaShabbat*.
- Bameh Madlikin is omitted.
- Both *V'shamru* and *Vayedaber Moshe* are recited before the *Amida*.
- Recite the *Maariv Amida* for *Yom Tov* with proper insertions for *Shabbat* and *Sukkot*.
- After the *Maariv Amida* recite *Vayechulu* but not *Magen Avot* and *Elokeinu V'Elokei Avotenu*. They are only said when davening with a permanent *Minyan*. It is customary to try to recite *Vayechulu* together with another person if at all possible. If you are alone still say *Vayechulu*.
- After Aleynu recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.
- *Kiddush* and the *Seuda* in the *Sukka* should not begin before 7:12 PM. *Kiddush* begins with the passage of *Yom HaShishi* just like every Friday night but then follows a *Yom Tov Kiddush* with *Shabbat* insertions. *Brakha* of *Leshev BaSukka* followed by *Shehecheyanu*.
- Birkat HaMazon should include Retzeh for Shabbat and Ya'aleh V'Yavo for Sukkot.

Friday, September 25th

- · Selichot are recited before Shacharit.
- Include Tachanun at the conclusion of Selichot and Shacharit.
- Insert Shir HaMa'alot before Yishtabach.
- Shacharit Amida and Hazarat HaShatz are said with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- At the end of the Hazarat HaShatz recite Avenu Malkenu.
- In Shacharit after reciting the Shir Shel Yom recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem.
- During Chodesh Elul we encourage everyone to recite five chapters of Tehilim daily (except on Shabbat and Rosh Hashanah) proceeding accordingly through the entire Book of Tehilim, concluding on Erev Yom Kippur.
- Mincha Amida and Hazarat HaShatz are said with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- Neither Tachanun nor Avenu Malkenu are recited at Mincha.
- Candles can be lit between 5:30 6:27 PM.
- A full Kabbalat Shabbat and Maariv should be recited with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- In Magen Avot the words Hakel HaKadosh should be changed to HaMelekh HaKadosh.
- After Aleynu the Mourner's Kaddish is said followed by reciting Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem and another Mourner's Kaddish.

Shabbat, September 26th - Parashat Ha'azinu - Shabbat Shuva

- Shacharit is a regular Shabbat Shacharit with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions.
- Insert Shir HaMa'alot before Nishmat.
- Do not say Avenu Malkenu.
- Say Anim Zemirot. The Chazan should open the Aron.
- Recite the Shir Shel Yom for Shabbat followed by the Mourner's Kaddish. Then recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem followed by the Mourner's Kaddish.
- Only the *Chazan* should open and close the *Aron* when taking out and returning the *Torah*.
- The *Chazan* should take the *Torah* directly to the *Shulchan*. There should be no kissing of the *Torah* by members of the *Minyan*.
- The *Torah* reading is *Ha'azinu*. The *Haftorah* is the special *Haftorah* for *Shabbat Shuva*. It is from Hosea (14:2-10 then Joel 2:11-27 and Micha 7:18-20).
- All Aliyot will be given to the Ba'al Kriah (unless there is a divider placed between the Ba'al Kriah and Oleh). He will make a Brakha both before and after each Aliyah.
- If the Ba'al Kriah is receiving all the Aliyot, only 7 Aliyot are recited. There is no Maftir. The Ba'al Kriah should also recite the Haftorah. After the Haftorah the Ba'al Kriah says Hatzi Kaddish that is usually said before the Maftir is called for his Aliyah.
- If Aliyot are being distributed, then a Maftir is said and Hatzi Kaddish is said before the Maftir. The Ba'al Kriah should receive Maftir and recite the Haftorah.
- One person, besides the *Ba'al Kriah*, will do both *Hagbah* and *Gelilah*. After lifting the *Torah* for *Hagbah* place the *Torah* on the *Shulchan* and perform *Gelilah* while the *Torah* is on the *Shulchan*.
- Recite the *Tefilah* for the American Government, *Mi Sheberach* for the IDF and the *Tefilah* for *Medinat Yisrael*.
- Say the two chapters of Y'kum Purkan and the Mi Sheberach.
- Recite Av HaRachamim followed by Ashrei.
- Mussaf with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions is said.
- Mincha is a regular Shabbat afternoon Mincha with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions. Mincha is at 6:25 PM at Shul.

- All three Aliyot will be given to the Ba'al Kriah (unless there is a divider placed between the Ba'al Kriah and Olyeh). The Ba'al Kriah will make a Brakha both before and after each Aliyah.
- One person, besides the Ba'al Kriah, will do both Hagbah and Gelilah. After lifting the Torah for Hagbah place the Torah on the Shulchan and perform Gelilah while the Torah is on the Shulchan.
- The Kel Maleh for Yahrzeits occurring on Shabbat and throughout the month of Tishrei should be recited by the Chazan.
- Recite Tzidkatcha Tzedek.
- Maariv is the regular weekday Maariv with Aseret Yemei Teshuva insertions. Maariv begins at 7:20 PM.
- Shabbat ends 7:30 PM.
- Omit V'he Noam but say V'yeeten Lecha.
- Conclude Maariv with Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem and the Mourner's Kaddish.
- Kiddush Levanah is not said until right after Yom Kippur.
- At home recite a full Havdalah.

Sunday, September 27th - Erev Yom Kippur

- Selichot are recited before Shacharit.
- Do not recite Tachanun at the conclusion of Selichot.
- Regular weekday Shacharit Davening but omit the following:
 - Mizmor LeToda
 - o Tachanun
 - o Avenu Maklenu
 - LaMenatzeach
- Insert Shir HaMa'alot before Yishtabach.
- Recite the Shir Shel Yom for Sunday followed by the Mourner's Kaddish. Then recite Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem followed by the Mourner's Kaddish.
- Complete reciting the last five chapters of Sefer Tehilim.
- Mincha at Shul is at 2:00 PM. Insert Vidui at the end of Amida for Erev Yom Kippur.
- Avenu Malkenu is not said at the end of Mincha.
- It is customary to bless one's children before Yom Kippur.
- If you will be saying Yizkor on Yom Kippur remember to light a Yarzheit candle before lighting Yom Tov candles.
- Everyone, whether saying Yizkor or not, should light a 25-hour candle in order to have a source that has burned all Yom Kippur from which to light the Havdalah candle after Yom Tov ends.
- Candles should be lit no later than 6:24 PM. The *Brakha* is *Lehadlik Ner shel Yom HaKippurim* and *Shehecheyanu*. If you plan on driving to Shul after lighting candles have in mind not to accept *Yom Kippur* with candle lighting. Also do not say *Shehecheyanu* when lighting the candles. Say *Shehecheyanu* when it is recited during the *Kol Nidrei* service.
- Men should put on Talit and Kittel before starting Kol Nidrei.
- Give yourself enough time to recite Tefillat Zakah before Kol Nidrei.
- Kol Nidrei at all of the Minyanim begin at 6:20 PM.
- Men should recite Shehecheyanu after saying Kol Nidrei.

Follow the listing of Tefilot for Kol Nidrei and Maariv compiled by Rabbis Muskin and Proops.

Monday, September 28th – Yom Kippur

Follow the listing of Tefilot for Yom Kippur day compiled by Rabbis Muskin and Proops for Yom Kippur.

- Put on your Talit and Kittel before starting Birkhot HaShachar.
- Yizkor is said even if one is mourning a parent during the 12 months.
- Even if you do not say Yizkor, you should say Av HaRachamim followed by Ashrei and then Mussaf.
- We only do Korim when saying Aleynu and not during the Avodah.
- Mincha is 5:10 PM at all Minyanim.
- Neilah is at 6:15 PM at all Minyanim.
- During Neilah be careful to change the wording of the insertions to reflect it is Neilah.
- During Avenu Malkenu be careful to change the wording to reflect it is Neilah.
- The Shofar is blown after the Chazan concludes Kaddish Shalem. He blows:
 - o Tekiah, Shevarim-Teruah, Tekiah
 - Tekiah, Shevarim, Tekiah

- o Tekiah, Teruah, Tekiah Gedolah
- Keep on your Talit and Kittel until you finish Maariv.
- Recite a regular weekday Maariv while including Atah Chonantanu in the Amida.
- Recite Kiddush Levanah. Look up at the moon and then turn east to say Kiddush Levanah. If you have no family member with you say the phrase Shalom Alechem Alechem Shalom to yourself three times. Say Aleynu at the conclusion of Kiddush Levanah followed by the Mourner's Kaddish.
- At home say Havdalah. Begin with Borei Pri HaGefen. Omit the Brakha for Besamim. Light the
 candle from the Yarzheit candle that has burned throughout Yom Kippur. Recite the concluding
 blessing like every Saturday night.

Tuesday - Thursday, September 29th - October 1st

- Recite a regular weekday Shacharit and Mincha. Remember not to say the insertions of Aseret Yemei Teshuva. If you by accident recite them, even HaMelech HaKadosh, you do not need to repeat the Amida.
- Omit Tachanun at Shacharit and Mincha.
- Say Lamenatzeach between Ashrei and U'va L'Tziyon.
- The last time to say Kiddush Levanah is on Thursday evening.

Friday, October 2nd - Erev Sukkot

- Recite a regular weekday Shacharit but omit Tachanun at Shacharit and Mincha.
- Say Lamenatzeach between Ashrei and U'va L'Tziyon.
- Candles can be lit between 5:22 6:18 PM. The Brakhot on the candles are *Lehadlik Ner shel Shabbat v'shel Yom Tov* and *Shehecheyanu*.
- Mincha and Kabbalat Shabbat at Shul at 6:25 PM.
- An abridged Kabbalat Shabbat is recited. It begins with Mizmor Shir L'yom HaShabbat.
- Bameh Madlikin is omitted.
- Both V'shamru and Vayedaber Moshe are recited before the Amida.
- Recite the Maariv Amida for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shabbat and Sukkot.
- After the Maariv Amida recite Vayechulu, Magen Avot and Elokeinu V'Elokei Avotenu with the conclusion of Mekadesh HaShabbat.
- No Kiddush is said at Shul.
- After Aleynu the Mourner's Kaddish is recited followed by Tehilim chapter 27, L'David Hashem and the Mourner's Kaddish
- Kiddush and the Seuda in the Sukka should not begin before 7:12 PM. Kiddush begins with the passage of Yom HaShishi just like every Friday night but then follows a Yom Tov Kiddush with Shabbat insertions. Brakha of Leshev BaSukka followed by Shehecheyanu.
- Birkhat HaMazon should include Retzeh for Shabbat and Ya'aleh V'Yavo for Sukkot
