HALAKHIC CORNER

Question: Must the Shabbat candles be placed on the table where the Shabbat meal will take place, or may they be positioned on aside table or buffet?

Answer: Many Halakhic authorities, including the late Rabbi Yosef Soloveitchik (The Rav) and Rabbi Moshe Feinstein, instructed that one should place the Shabbat candles directly on the table where the Shabbat meals are served. They noted that the entire purpose for the institution of Shabbat candles was in order to illuminate the table on which one eats. If, however, there are extenuating circumstances that do not allow one to place the candles directly on the table, then the candles should be placed as close to the table as possible. The above refers to the householder, who can kindle the candles at the table. A guest, however, who is staying in a hotel, should kindle lights in their hotel room and not where the Shabbat meals will be eaten (see Mishna Brurah 263: 45-46)

FROM OUR SEMICHAS CHAVER PROGRAM

Question For the Week by Adam Lewis

Q: If there are two or more aveilim (mourners) at minyan, who gets precedence to be the chazzan?

A: For simplicity, we'll assume that both *aveilim* are local and are capable of *davening* properly on behalf of the congregation. With those considerations in mind, the order of priority is as follows:

- 1. An avel during shiva (this is uncommon because an avel during shiva would typically daven in their home)
- 2. An avel during shloshim (days 8 through 30 of mourning)
- 3. Someone with a *yahrtzeit* (anniversary of the passing)
- 4. An avel on the last day of the 11th month
- 5. An avel during the 12 months (any time after shloshim)

What should one do if there is a disagreement regarding who should be the *chazzan*? Above all else, the most important thing is to make sure that the *aveilim* respect each other and do not bicker. As Jews, we must always be mindful of how we can avoid desecrating *Hashem's* name. One of the worst things we can do as Jews is to fight with each other (especially over something like being *chazzan* and saying *kaddish* which are both intended to sanctify *Hashem's* name). When we keep that in mind, we will always be able to find a peaceful way to resolve our differences of opinions.

We are all united in supporting our *chayalim* and the Jews living in Israel right now. It's important for us to remember that our support and unity is not limited to our overseas brethren; we must also continuously find ways to love and support the Jews in our local communities. In wartime and in peace, we need to actively help a fellow Jew find a job, meet their future spouse, visit them when they're sick, inquire about their wellbeing, and generally do everything we can to bolster another Jew. A quick look at the media shows that Jews already have more than enough detractors. We can be the antidote to their hateful words. And in the merit of our acts of lovingkindness toward each other, may *Hashem* usher in an era of unending peace for all Jews everywhere.

After leading three successful and very meaningful solidarity missions to Israel, we are pleased to announce that Rabbi & Ruhama Muskin are planning another mission from February 4 - 8 together with Rabbi Daniel Goldberg and Rabbi Mordy & Myriam Kuesous of Cong. Ahavath Torah of Engelwood, NJ. A very special itinerary is being planned for the trip, and we will update you as soon as we have more information. This experience is sure to be a transformative one and is open to anyone who is interested. Space is limited!

Accommodations: Three nights at The David Citadel Hotel in Jerusalem (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday).

Cost Per Person (including hotel accommodations):

Between 15 -19 participants - \$2230 double occupancy (single supplement \$600)

For those staying in the hotel, 3 meals a day are included. (Dinner on Thursday is not included.)

Cost Per Person (for those not staying in the hotel):

Between 15 - 19 participants - \$1610

For those NOT staying in the hotel, lunch and dinner is included daily. (Dinner on Thursday is not included.)

Airfare:

Each participant is responsible for arranging and purchasing their own airplane ticket. The best flight is Sunday February 4th, El Al #6. Please arrange for your flight to arrive in Israel on Monday afternoon February 5th.

Friday, January 26th

- Recite regular Shacharit with Tachanun.
- After *Kaddish Shalem* and before *Aleinu*, recite Chapter 121 of *Tehilim*, followed by the *Mi Sheberach* for the IDF and the *Mi Sheberach* for the hostages.
- At Mincha omit Tachanun.
- Shabbat candles should be lit by 4:59 PM.
- Mincha & Kabbalat Shabbat is at 5:05 PM.
- Shkiah is at 5:17 PM.
- Recite a regular Kabbalat Shabbat and Maariv.

Shabbat, January 27 - Parashat Beshalach

- Davening begins with Anim Zemirot followed by the Mourner's Kaddish.
- Shacharit is a regular Shabbat Shacharit.
- The *Torah* reading is *Beshalach*. Seven *Aliyot* are distributed plus *Maftir*.
- Recite the *Mi Sheberach* for the sick, followed by the *Tefilah* for the American Government, the *Mi Sheberach* for the IDF, the *Mi Sheberach* for the hostages, and the *Tefilah* for *Medinat Yisrael*.
- The *Haftorah* is Judges (4:4-5:31).
- Say the two chapters of Y'kum Purkan and the Mi Sheberach.
- Recite Av HaRachamim.
- Mincha is a regular Shabbat afternoon Mincha. Mincha at Shul begins at 4:35 PM.
- Recite Tzidkatcha Tzedek and the Kel Maleh at Mincha.
- After Kaddish Shalem and before Aleinu, recite Chapter 121 of Tehilim, followed by the Mi Sheberach for the IDF and the Mi Sheberach for the hostages.
- *Maariv* is the regular weekday *Maariv*. *Maariv* begins at 5:48 PM.
- Right after the Amida the Chazan recites Chatzi Kaddish followed by V'he Noam.
- After V'he Noam the Chazan recites Kaddish Shalem.
- V'yeeten Lecha is said, followed by a complete Havdalah, Aleinu and the Mourner's Kaddish.
- Shabbat ends at 5:58 PM.

Sunday, January 28

- Recite regular Shacharit with Tachanun.
- Both at *Shacharit* and after *Kaddish Shalem* and before *Aleinu*, recite Chapter 121 of *Tehilim*, followed by the *Mi Sheberach* for the IDF and the *Mi Sheberach* for the hostages.


