How many machzorim are on each bookshelf?

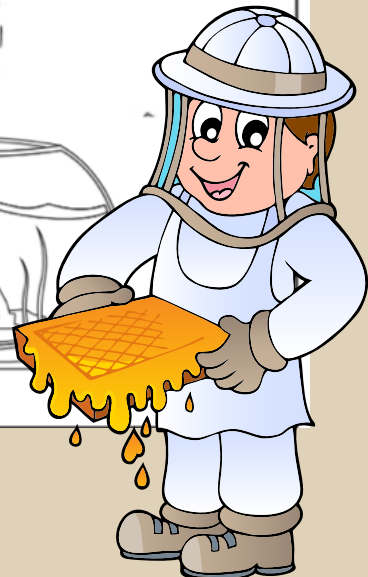
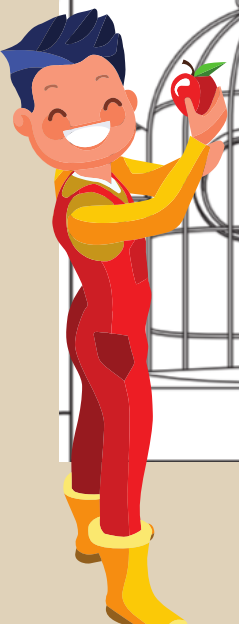
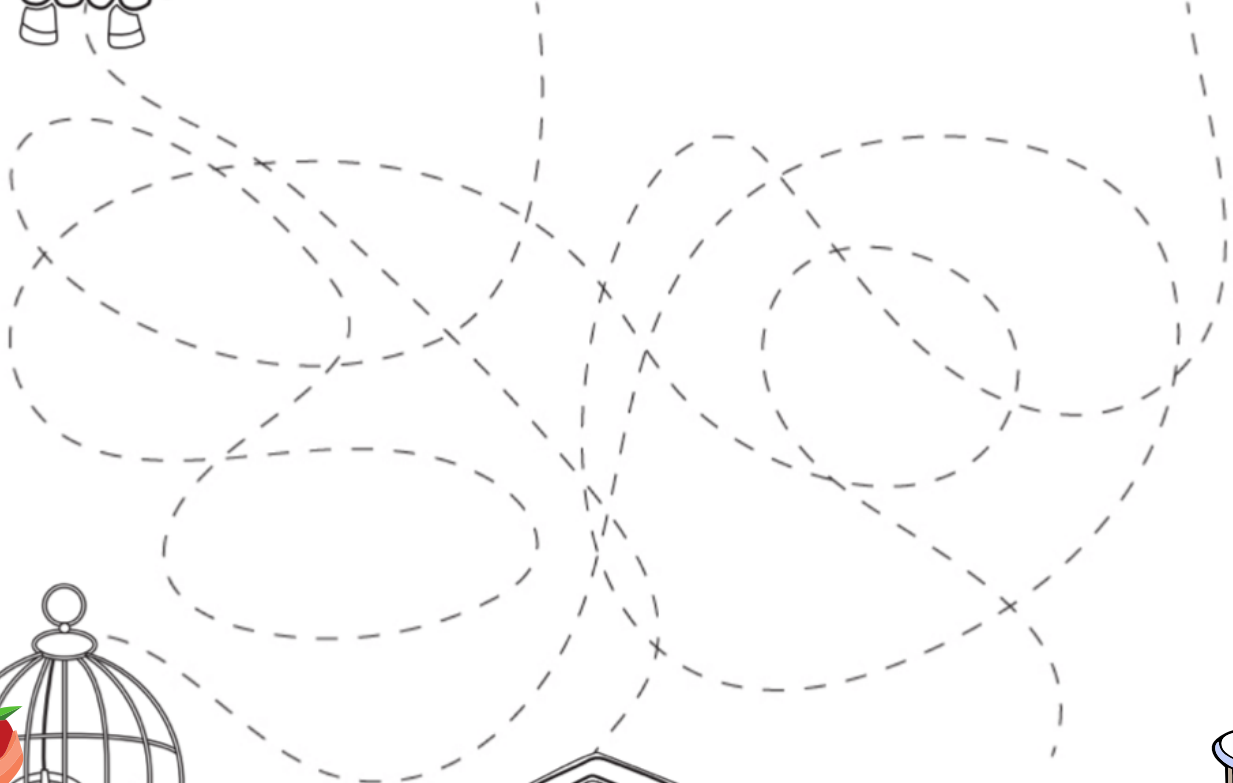


# פסוקי דזמרה

*Can you match each animal to its correct home?*



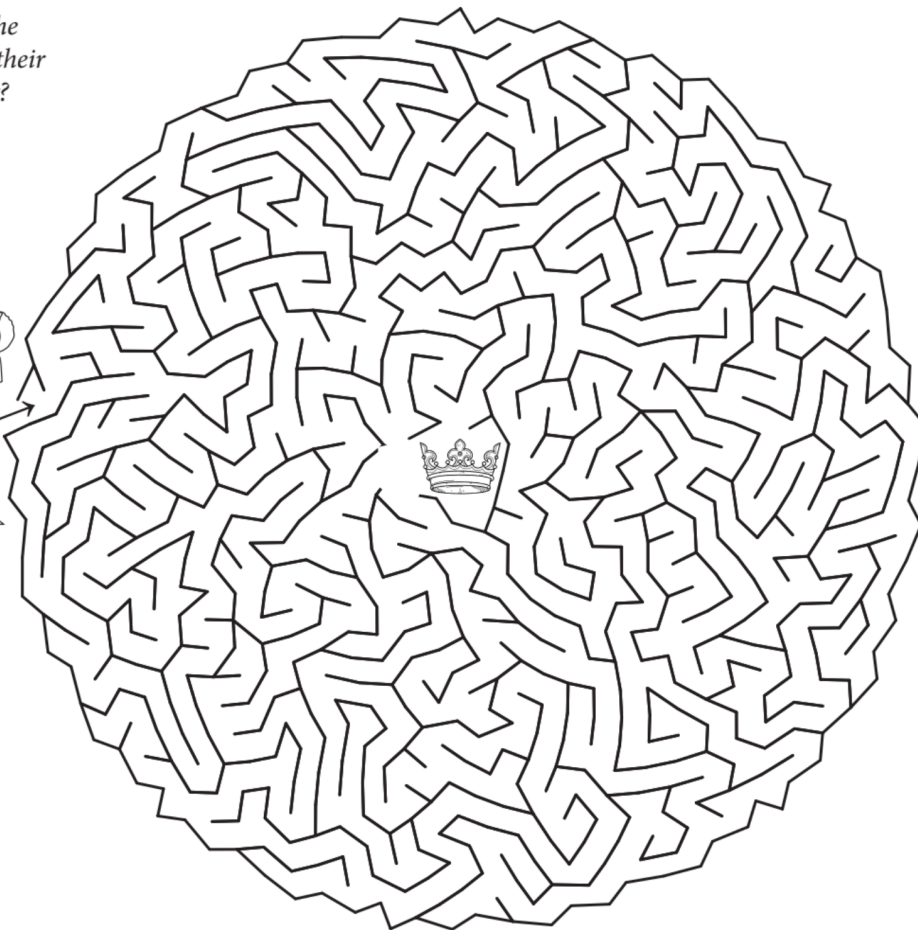


# המלך

The holy Rabbi Aharon of Karlin was one of the top students of the Mezritcher Maggid. One Rosh Hashanah, he suddenly fainted as he had begun to recite the word HaMelech. The Chassidim around him asked "Why did he suddenly faint?" He explained that he had remembered the Gemorah discussing the story of the churban of the Beis Hamikdosh. It describes Rabbi Yochanan ben Zakkai's meeting with Vespasian. Rabbi Yochanan had himself smuggled out of the city of Yerushalayim in order to plead with the Roman general to spare the Torah center of Yavneh. When Rabbi Yochanan entered Vespasian's tent, he addressed him as "Your Majesty, only His Majesty's general." (In fact, a messenger from Rome was already approaching the general's camp to inform him that he had been appointed leader of the empire.) "Secondly, if I am indeed king, why did you not come to me until now?" "I thought to myself," said the Rebbe of Karlin, "if we prepare to say HAMELECH and refer to Hashem as 'King,' shouldn't we ask the same question, 'If I am indeed your king, why did you not come to me until now?' What can we answer to that?"

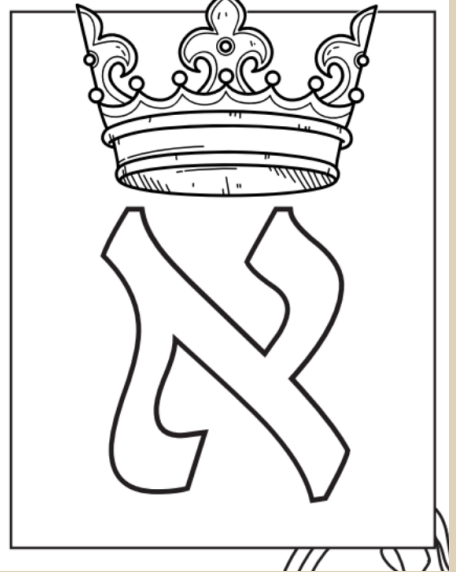
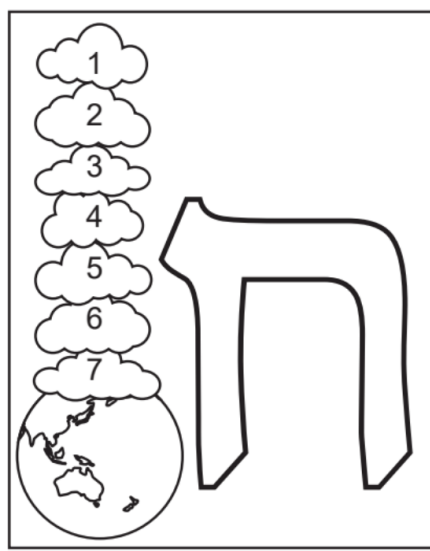
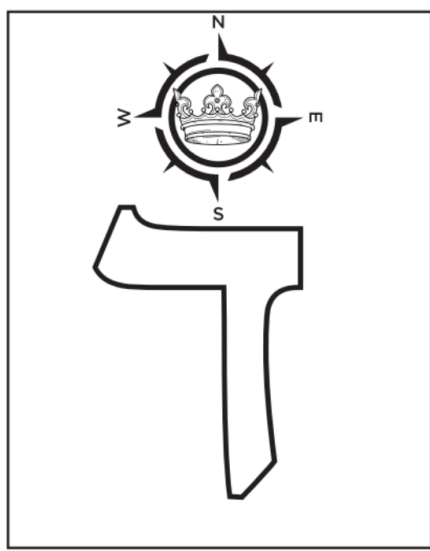

**The Waiting King:**  
The main theme of Rosh Hashanah davening, is crowning Hashem as King and accepting to be His people, and follow his Mitzvos. As you daven, the first word HAMELECH is read aloud, usually in a very special tune.

**Shema is a very special moment that we say every day, declaring that Hashem is our king, and king of the entire universe!  
When you say the word ECHAD of Shema, you should remember:**



**DALED:** Hashem is the **ONE** and only **ONE** in all four corners of the world

**CHES:** Hashem is the **One** in charge of the **7** heavens and **one** earth.

**ALEF:** Hashem is **One**.

# Yom Kippur

ON YOM KIPPUR, YOU ENTER HASHEM'S PALACE, AND THE WHOLE DAY YOU ARE AS CLOSE TO HASHEM AS YOU CAN GET. YOUR PRAYERS AND WISHES REACH HIS THRONE DIRECTLY AND YOU CAN ASK FOR WHATEVER BLESSINGS YOU WANT FOR THE COMING YEAR. WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO PRAY AND ASK HASHEM FOR ON YOM KIPPUR? BELOW ARE A FEW EXCERPTS FROM SOME SPECIAL YOM KIPPUR PRAYERS.

For all these (sins), Hashem who forgives, pardon us, forgive us, atone for us.

The Al Chet prayer is said ten times throughout the Yom Kippur services. Each time we say the words we admit to the things we may have done wrong in the past, and plan to improve ourselves for the future. Take a few minutes to think about some not great choices you may have made this past year and think about some ways you can be better in the coming year. Know that there is always a second chance. No matter how many mistakes we have made, there is always an opportunity to start afresh.

AND IF SOMEONE HAS UPSET YOU AND THEY SAY SORRY...

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU FORGIVE THEM – LIKE YOU WOULD WANT TO BE FORGIVEN.

CHILDREN LOOK AT YOUR MUMMY/DADDY/ GRANDPARENT/GUARDIAN AND SAY 'I'M SORRY'.

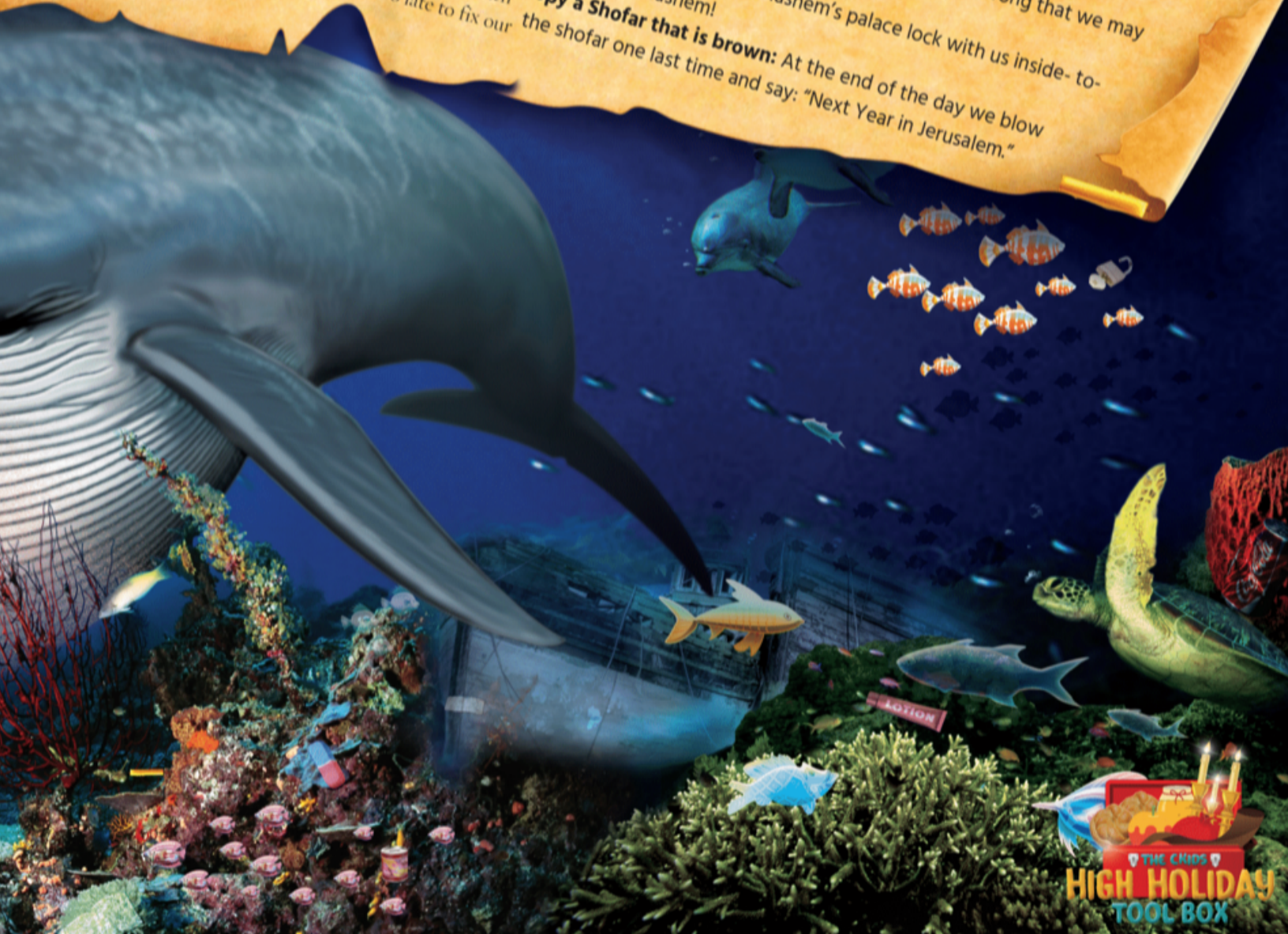


YONAH was

prophet. He was such a righteous man that Hashem spoke to him in a special way. Hashem chose Yonah to go to the city of Ninveh and warn the people there that they will be destroyed if they do not do Teshuvah, and change their bad ways. Yonah was afraid to talk to the people so he ran away on a ship. The ship was sailing calmly on the water when all of a sudden the sky became dark and it began to storm. The waves crashed against the ship and frightened all the passengers aboard. The people on the ship decided that someone on board must have done something wrong to cause the terrible storm. They drew lots to see who it could be. Yonah was chosen from the lottery, and was thrown overboard. As soon as Yonah was off the ship, the storm miraculously stopped and the sun came out again. An enormous fish came along and swallowed Yonah alive! Inside the belly of the fish, Yonah davened to Hashem and asked for forgiveness. He promised to do exactly what Hashem told him to. After 3 days, the fish spit Yonah out onto dry land and Yonah went to Ninveh to tell the people Hashem's message. They did Teshuvah and Hashem saved them. We read the story of Yonah on Yom Kippur to teach us the power of doing Teshuvah. It's never too late to fix our mistakes!

# Yom Kippur I Spy

- iSpy a Tzedakah box:** Before Yom Kippur we give extra charity to show Hashem how we care about others even before we care about ourselves.
- iSpy 3 candles:** We welcome Yom Kippur by lighting candles and reciting the special blessing.
- iSpy a white shirt:** We dress in white because we are like angels who are clear from any mistakes.
- iSpy yummy cake & Coke:** On Yom Kippur Adults don't eat or drink, like angels who don't need food or drink.
- iSpy a black shoe:** On Yom Kippur we don't wear leather shoes.
- iSpy lotion:** We don't apply creams, makeup, or ointments.
- iSpy a bathtub:** We don't shower or bathe.
- iSpy 5 Machzors:** We spend time praying, there are 5 prayers total throughout the day.
- iSpy a gavel:** It is a Day of Judgement, when Hashem determines our year ahead.
- iSpy an eraser:** Hashem forgives us for anything wrong that we may have done, and erases it.
- iSpy a lock:** The gates of Hashem's palace lock with us inside-together with Hashem!
- iSpy a Shofar that is brown:** At the end of the day we blow the shofar one last time and say: "Next Year in Jerusalem."

# Story Time

ONCE UPON A TIME, THERE WAS A SHEPHERD BOY CALLED COLIN NIDREI. IT WAS COLIN'S JOB TO LOOK AFTER ALL OF THE SHEEP IN SHOFARVILLE. COLIN FELT VERY LUCKY – HE COULD SPEND HIS WHOLE DAY OUTSIDE IN THE FIELDS AND HILLS. SOMETIMES, HE WOULD SEE AN ESPECIALLY BEAUTIFUL FLOWER, AND HE WANTED TO THANK HASHEM FOR MAKING SUCH A BEAUTIFUL WORLD. THE PROBLEM WAS, HE WAS JUST A POOR SHEPHERD AND DIDN'T KNOW HOW TO READ THE SIDDUR. SO COLIN DECIDED TO CLAP AS A 'THANK YOU' TO HASHEM.

ANOTHER TIME, COLIN SAW THE MOST BEAUTIFUL SUNSET. HE REALLY, REALLY WANTED TO SAY THANK YOU TO HASHEM FOR SUCH A BEAUTIFUL WORLD. BUT HE JUST DIDN'T KNOW HOW! SO THIS TIME, COLIN DECIDED TO DO A DANCE AS A THANK YOU TO HASHEM. ONE ROSH HASHANA, A FAMILY WAS WALKING IN THE FIELDS WHEN THEY SAW COLIN. "WOULD YOU LIKE TO COME TO SYNAGOGUE WITH US?" THEY ASKED HIM. COLIN WAS VERY NERVOUS. HE HAD NEVER BEEN TO SYNAGOGUE BEFORE. BUT HE WAS ALSO VERY CURIOUS TO SEE WHAT IT WAS LIKE. AND THE FAMILY SEEMED NICE – SO HE AGREED TO GO WITH THEM.

WHEN HE CAME IN, IT WAS PACKED! HIGH CEILING, COLOURFUL WINDOWS, A CHOIR – SO MUCH GOING ON!

HE SAT DOWN AND SAW EVERYONE READING FROM A SIDDUR. HE WANTED TO JOIN IN TOO – BUT HE DID NOT KNOW HOW TO READ! HE WANTED TO THANK HASHEM FOR SUCH A BEAUTIFUL SYNAGOGUE AND SUCH A FRIENDLY COMMUNITY, BUT HE DIDN'T KNOW HOW! AND SO, COLIN THE SHEPHERD BOY THANKED HASHEM THE ONLY WAY HE KNEW HOW. SUDDENLY, HE GOT UP AND STARTED DANCING AND CLAPPING! THE PEOPLE IN THE SHUL WERE SHOCKED! SOME SHUSHED HIM, OTHERS POINTED TO THE DOOR. ONE PERSON EVEN STARTED SHOUTING AT HIM TO SIT DOWN AND BE QUIET!

COLIN WAS SO EMBARRASSED AND SAD. ALL HE WANTED TO DO WAS THANK HASHEM! THE RABBI, WHO WAS A VERY WISE PERSON, STEPPED IN TO CALM EVERYONE DOWN. HE SPOKE TO THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY:

"DO YOU KNOW, OUT OF ALL THE PRAYERS SAID IN SHUL TODAY, HASHEM LOVES THIS BOY'S 'PRAYERS' THE MOST! TRUE – HE DOESN'T KNOW HOW TO FOLLOW ALONG IN THE SIDDUR. BUT THAT ISN'T HIS FAULT. HE DOESN'T KNOW HOW TO READ. BUT WHEN HE WANTS TO SAY THANK YOU TO HASHEM, HE DOES IT FROM THE BOTTOM OF HIS HEART, WITH A SMILE ON HIS FACE AND WITH REAL LOVE!"

EVERYONE WAS SHOCKED. THE RABBI WAS RIGHT (AS HE OFTEN WAS)! THEY ASKED COLIN FOR FORGIVENESS AND PROMISED TO TEACH HIM HOW TO READ THE SIDDUR. BUT ON ONE CONDITION: ONLY IF HE WOULD TEACH THEM HOW TO PRAY!
