

Our world is constantly changing. One of the changes is that people that are Trans or Non Binary are now comfortable being recognized. Conservative Judaism changes as well to the needs of their members while still being true to Halacha (Jewish Laws). The Conservative movement has introduced non-binary liturgy for Torah honors.

The wording has been lightly tweaked in a 12 page responsum to accommodate those who do not identify as male or female.

Usually we use the term ya'amod or ta'amod for a male or female being called to the Torah. And then ben or bat before the person's parents' names. The neutral terms will be na la'amod, which in Modern Hebrew means 'please stand'. The ben/bat could be replaced with 'mibeit' (from the house of) or l'veit (of the house of).

For the person chanting the Haftarah, we have used Maftir, or Maftira. This could be replaced with 'likri'at hahaftarah' (for the reading of the Haftarah).

There are a few other changes, but this gives the basics of changes adopted so as not to embarrass or diminish anyone.

The Ritual Committee is an agreement with these changes and will adopt as necessary. If there is anyone who wishes to have these new designations apply to them, please contact the Rabbi or the Ritual Committee.

## Zoom Gabbaim Needed

The duties of a traditional Gabbai vary from synagogue to synagogue. Typically, a Gabbai ensures the Torah service runs smoothly and is available to quickly correct any mishap. The term Zoom Gabbai is to describe the person who hosts the Zoom service. They manage the behind-the-scenes mechanics so that a service or program leader can focus on an event.

It is a sacred job that could be done from home without needing to put on your shoes. Zoom allowed COA members or guests to remain deeply rooted to our Jewish traditions. To assuage your fear, you learned by the side of dedicated and skillful technology savvy folks. In preparation for our services, there were many questions. What if the connection was lost? What if unwanted noises or comments interfered with the service? What if I accidentally blocked people from participating? Many of these "what if's" happened but we addressed the issue quickly. Each week became easier, and more people joined the team.
