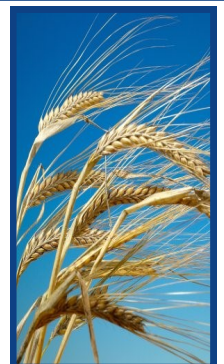

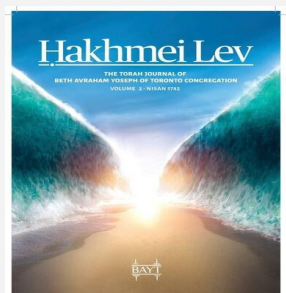

A MESSAGE FROM THE RAV

The last days of Pesach commemorate what happened shortly after we left Egypt. Pharaoh decided that he wasn't done with us and so he amassed his army and pursued us into the desert. Many commentaries note the seemingly gratuitous nature of this postscript to the Exodus story. We'd already won; Hashem brought Egypt to its knees with the Ten Plagues. Why was this post-Exodus miracle of the splitting Sea at all necessary? Why harden Pharaoh's heart yet again, only to bring him to another defeat?

While Bnei Israel were in Egypt, they lived miserable lives as slaves, to be sure. But they never had to encounter their own mortality. Egypt wasn't seeking the Jews' destruction, merely their domination. The Jews knew that as long as they behaved submissively as slaves, they'd be able to live out their full lives, continue having children, and life would go on.

But when they arrived at the Red Sea, they realized that they had no where to escape, the Egyptians were pursuing them from behind, and they were in mortal danger. Pharaoh's objective at this point was NOT to bring the Jews back to Egypt, but it was rather to annihilate them. As they recited later in Az Yashir (15:9):

אָמַר אֱוִיב אֶרְדֵּף אֲשִׁיג אֶחֱלֶק שְׁלָל תִּמְלָאֲמוּ נַפְשֵׁי אֶרִיק חֲרָבִי תוֹרִישְׁמוּ יְדִי:

The enemy said, 'I will pursue, I will overtake them. I will divide the spoils; I will gorge myself on them. **I will draw my sword and my hand will destroy them.**'

Bnei Israel needed to come to a point where they might lose their lives before being able to be counted as Hashem's Chosen People. Because only when one faces their own death do they realize the full meaning of their life. As Martin Luther King Jr. put it: "If a man has not discovered something that he will die for, he isn't fit to live."

Soren Kierkegaard talked about the anxiety we face when we contemplate our own mortality, which is why we tend to block it out of our thoughts. But there are moments in life when we are forced to face mortality, such as when narrowly escaping injury or illness. Sometimes, the aftermath of that experience is extremely cathartic and provides us with a new attitude towards life. As one work paraphrases Kierkegaard's ideas:

It's only when we dare to experience the full anxiety of knowing that life doesn't go on forever that we can experience transcendence and get in touch with the infinite. To use an analogy from gestalt psychology, Non-Being is the necessary ground for the figure of Being to make itself known to us. It's only when we're willing to let go of all of our illusions and admit that we are lost and helpless and terrified that we will be free of ourselves and our false securities and ready for what Kierkegaard calls "the leap of faith."

We can actually trace this "leap of faith" that became embedded within Bnei Israel from scripture. They complained to Moshe (14:11-12): "Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you brought us to the desert to die?"

Moshe responded to them that all would be good. His final words were (14:14): – "יִקְוָה יִלָּחֶם לָכֶם וְאַתֶּם תִּחְרָשׁוּ:" – "Hashem will fight for you, and you will be 'macharish.'" We usually translate that word as "be silent," but that translation is lacking, because being silent is not doing anything at all, but rather the absence of speaking. The verb structure (הפעיל) of the word "macharish," however, is active. How is one actively "silent"?

We note that the shorash of this word is "חרש", which is the same root for the act of plowing and constructive manufacture (a בית in modern Hebrew is a factory). Sometimes, silence is a productive act because it allows a person to cultivate their thoughts before saying what's on their mind. Moshe was essentially telling the people: this encounter with your own mortality is necessary for you to cultivate within yourselves that sense of transcendence, a purpose for being, and an appreciation for life.

One of the traumas of the past two years was encountering the fragility of life. Whether it was personal illness or just the fear of contracting illness, we've all had to look at our own mortality in the mirror more than we've ever had to do as a society in recent memory. Hopefully, it has transformed us into better people who don't take the small things for granted any more. Hopefully, it has made us kinder, more sensitive people. Covid brought out the worst in some people, but it also brought out the best in others. The thoughtful among us have been "plowing", "macharish," over these past two years.

Let's savor these Yom Tov days and use them to "plow" and meditate over how we can live our lives with more meaning. From house to house, Karen and I wish you a chag sameach!

PESACH MESSAGES

A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSISTANT RABBI

For me, one of the most perplexing passages of the Haggadah has always been the wicked son.

The wicked son asks, "What is this worship to you?" (Shemos 12:26)" The Haggadah instructs us to respond to him, "[The wicked son said], 'To you and not 'to him.' Since he excluded himself from the Jewish people, he denied a fundamental principle [of the Jewish faith]. Accordingly, you should blunt his teeth and say to him, "'For the sake of this, did the Hashem do [this] for me in my going out of Egypt' (Shemos 13:8)." 'For me' and not 'for him.' If he had been there, he would not have been saved. What is so terrible about what the wicked son asked that he denied a fundamental principle of our faith? Furthermore, why do we blunt his teeth? Is this how we are to act when our children ask us questions?

To answer this, I would like to focus on the curious phrase, "blunt his teeth." Why the emphasis on teeth? Rabbi Avraham Schorr (Ha-Iekach Ve-Halibuv, 88) highlights a Midrash Tanchuma at the beginning of Parshas Tazria that teaches that while every fetus is in the womb of its mother, Hashem teaches it the laws of Kosher. R. Schorr theorizes that the reason for this is that somehow the laws of Kosher symbolize the entirety of Torah. But how?

Rabbi Tzadok HaKohen of Lublin explains that, at the core, being aware of what we eat is the first step in Avodas Hashem, in the service of G-d. The first commandment G-d gave human beings is to not eat from the Eitz Ha-Das, the Tree of Knowledge. Because eating, when done right, symbolizes everything that Judaism is about. Judaism is about using the physical world and our physical bodies and imbuing them with kedusha, with holiness.

Now, let's return to the wicked son at the Seder. He asks, "What is this worship to you -- lechem?"

The Gemara in Pesachim (68b) states that all agree that Yom Tov requires some element of "for you -- lechem," some level of personal and human enjoyment. In fact, for this reason, it is forbidden to fast on Yom Tov.

Rabbi Shalom Rosner (Shalom Rav, Vol. 2, p. 56-57) suggests that perhaps this is what the wicked son is challenging, "What is this worship to you -- lechem?"

In other words, he is asking, "What is this idea that you claim is holy, that you can elevate your eating? Eating is physical and animalistic! It has nothing to do with the service of G-d, or with Avodas Hashem!

Therefore, we respond to him that this is a denial of a foundational principle of our faith because it denies the ability we have as human beings to live sanctified our lives even when we partake in the physical world. Perhaps this is why we figuratively "blunt his teeth." We do not punch him in the mouth, we rather we educate him. We tell him, "You have a physical body, you have a mouth, and you have teeth. G-d created you as a human being for a reason. Use your teeth and use them well! Use them in the service of G-d."

May we merit, this year at our Pesach Seder and throughout Yom Tov, to enjoy our food, to elevate it with kedusha, and to use our teeth and use them well.

Have a wonderful Yom Tov!

A MESSAGE FROM OUR YOUTH DIRECTOR

The mitzvahs of Erev Pesach, we conduct a search for chametz, followed by a burning/purging of Chametz from our possession. The removal of Chametz has a number of meanings and points of understanding. While we might understand it to be the literal sense of any leavened product that is Biblically forbidden during Pesach, there is also a personal parallel as well. We as humans all have a need to feel a sense of pride, of self esteem and confidence. Over our formative years we develop an ego that facilitates our social growth throughout life and dictates how we interact with other people. The nullification of Chametz essentially teaches us that every now and then we need to be reminded of who we really are in this world. Do I really embody the person that I truly wish to be. Yes, you might be thinking that this is starting to sound like Yom Kippur, but in reality it is very different. What is Chametz? It is the by-product of yeast and any sugar/fuel creating a gas. That "hot air" is exactly that, just "hot air", our ego, our pride is just hot air, and we need to be humbled to remind ourselves of who is really in charge. We have just witnessed that in the span of a week, Hashem has forced all of our machinations of life to come to a grinding halt. That everyone has been equalized to be confined to our homes, no one is greater than the virus, and one step further, that everyone wants to preserve our most vulnerable friends and family, thus teaching us that Hashem is the only one that we can attribute all things in our life. In life, when we succeed we often exclaim, "I did it" or "I am so great", yet when we fail we quickly shirk the blame to someone or something else not wanting to take the responsibility, have you ever wondered why? It is because it would be a blow to our ego to admit defeat, not wanting to feel the defeatedness. This is what Hashem is teaching us these days, Hashem is the one who is at the helm, and all of my success and failures are because He wills it to be such. Sometimes I may not understand, or may not agree, but it is our duty to have Emunah to trust that it is for our own good. In Egypt, the Jewish people faced incredible hardship, but never let go of their faith. It is clear to me that the message today is that Hashem is teaching us not to rely on our own securities, for in a heartbeat, it can all be taken away.

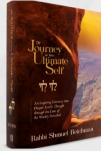
