On Motzaei Shabbat leading into Yom Tov, what sort of candle do ${\sf I}$ use for havdalah?

When Shabbat leads into Yom Tov, as it does on the first and eighth nights of Pesach this year, we recite havdalah as part of kiddush.

Most people don't light a special Havdalah candle, for two reasons:

- 1. On Yom Tov we may light candles from an existing flame for our personal use, but this candle would only be used for the mitzvah, not for our physical pleasure, and
- 2. We may not extinguish fire on Yom Tov, and leaving a standard havdalah candle burning would be inconvenient.

Instead, most people use the light of the Yom Tov candles. [Note that one must either daven maariv or recite "Baruch HaMavdil bein kodesh l'kodesh" before lighting these candles, and we light them from an existing flame.]

Some people join two of their Yom Tov candles to create a multi-wicked flame for Havdalah, but this may create halachic problems. Therefore, most people leave the candles as they are, and simply recite the berachah beside them and make use of their light that way. One should follow one's family custom.

BAYT COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

The BAYT COVID-19 Committee asks all members to adhere to the following health and safety protocols.

Signing Up for a Minyan at BAYT

All members who wish to attend a minyan at BAYT, must sign up in advance via SignUp Genius. Minyanim are open to members only. Please only sign up people from your household. You may be denied entrance to BAYT if you have not signed up for a minyan via SignUp Genius.

When you sign up to attend a minyan at BAYT, <u>you expressly agree to strictly follow BAYT's COVID-19 protocols</u>. Other shuls' protocols are not relevant to your decision to attend a minyan at BAYT. If you no longer satisfy BAYT's COVID-19 protocols after signing up for a minyan, please cancel your sign up and do not attend minyan.

While Attending a Minyan at BAYT

- <u>Do not congregate with others during or after davening</u>. Yes, we all want to catch up with others but the public health situation is still fluid. Come to BAYT to daven and, no offence, please leave quietly. Kiddush Clubs are not allowed.
- <u>Do not crowd when leaving BAYT</u>. Please leave the building single file and socially distanced 2 metres apart. Once outside BAYT, please walk away from the doors so others can leave quickly and safely.
- <u>Avoid touching doors and door handles</u>. Interior doors through which you need to pass are open. Please do not touch the doors, as you may cause them to close. If a door is closed, please let the facilities staff know.
- <u>Sit in designated, distanced seating</u>. In the main shul, sit only in seats marked with green tape. Do not move chairs around in other minyanim.

When Not To Sign Up for or Attend a Minyan at BAYT

- 1. You or a "close contact" are awaiting a COVID test result;
- 2. you have been in "close contact" with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or who has any symptoms of COVID-19;
- 3. you have been in "close contact" with anyone who is in self-isolation. This includes anyone (even if asymptomatic) who lives in your household including children who have to self-isolate because of a COVID-19 case in school or a carpool;
- 4. you have been outside of Canada within the past 14 days;
- 5. you have been around others (e.g., workplace, other minyan or gathering) and did not practice proper social distancing and/or masking, even once, within the past 14 days; or
- 6. you are feeling unwell or have any acute illness, even if you or your doctor do not believe you have COVID-19.

"Close Contacts" Include

- 1. Someone with whom you have been within 2 metres for more than 10 minutes;
- 2. Someone who lives in your household or provides care to you;
- 3. Someone with whom you have had close physical contact including a handshake, or
- 4. Someone who accidently coughed, sneezed or spit on you while talking with you.

If you or a "close contact" have any common symptoms of COVID-19 (see below), please get a COVID test, STAY HOME, self-isolate and advise "close contacts" with whom you were in close physical contact with in the prior 48 hours to monitor their health and to self isolate. <u>Do not sign up for a minyan</u>.

Common Symptoms of COVID-19 Per the Ontario Ministry of Health

- fever (feeling hot to the touch, a temperature of 37.8 degrees Celsius or higher) or chills
- cough that's new or worsening (continuous, more than usual)
- barking cough, making a whistling noise when breathing (croup)
- shortness of breath (out of breath, unable to breathe deeply)

- sore throat, difficulty swallowing
- runny, stuffy or congested nose (not related to seasonal allergies or other known causes or conditions)
- lost sense of taste or smell
- pink eye (conjunctivitis)
- headache that's unusual or long lasting
- digestive issues (nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain)
- muscle aches
- extreme tiredness that is unusual (fatigue, lack of energy)
- falling down often
- for young children and infants: sluggishness or lack of appetite.

If you really have to think about it, you should stay home.

Report Illness and Positive COVID Test Results to BAYT Immediately

If you attended a minyan at BAYT, please let us know immediately if you receive a positive COVID-19 test result or if you have symptoms of COVID-19 and are awaiting a test result. Let us know if, after receiving a positive COVID-19 test result, you subsequently receive a positive result for a variant of concern (VOC).

Realistic Expectations

COVID-19 is in our community. Whenever you leave your home, you increase your exposure to COVID-19 and VOCs. That BAYT may advise our members of new COVID cases at BAYT should not come as a surprise.

BAYT will notify York Public Health of all positive COVID cases brought to our attention. In the event of two or more positive COVID test results among attendees of one minyan at BAYT, York Public Health could declare a legal "outbreak." In such event, York Public Health may mandate ALL persons in attendance self-isolate for 14 days, even those who practiced proper social distancing and masking.

"Why does only Pesach get a Seder?"

What is a Seder and why do we have one for Pesach night?

Seder of literally means organize or make an order of events, telling you what to do and how. So why do we have one for the night of Pesach?

Passover night has many different Mitzvot to perform such as the Matzah, Marror, Korban Pesach (the Paschal Lamb offered at the Beit Hamikdash), telling the story of leaving Egypt, and singing Hallel. In order to make sure we are able to cover everything, we need to be organized about what to do so that we can properly enjoy the holiday and observe all of the laws.

This Pesach, we must not forget that in addition to organizing and cleaning our homes, to also make *Seder*, an order, out of your thoughts and goals for Pesach to properly feel our freedom.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Your President gets a lot of complaints and an occasional compliment. Complaints can matter if presented constructively or coming as a result of something done wrong. Compliments are nice; they are even nicer with a donation, which does happen. Thank you!

Complaints come in different flavours. Some one has a problem. Something did not get done. We need to hear these types of complaints, particularly if they are coming from more than one person. We investigate each one and act if necessary. When it turns out we made a mistake, we try to fix it. If we can, great. If we can not, we let you know. Some complaints can be worthy of an apology, as I have done in this weekly message from time to time.

Examples of constructive complaints include a couple of notes from members that we missed their birthday in the Bulletin or that a yahrzeit notification came late. In following up with the office, I learned our office extracts this information from ShulCloud, our member management platform. Using English dates works fine in ShulCloud but using Hebrew dates produced inconsistent results. We let ShulCloud know. These issues still exist but we now run the reports using English dates. For those of you who have been affected by these errors, please accept my apologies.

In the process of investigating a complaint, I may find out it did not give the entire story. A few complaints manifest obvious displeasure or the occasional threat (non-violent of course). For these, often someone did not get the answer they wanted to hear even though they were given the correct answer. While I may be sorry you may feel that way, I cannot be sorry if the outcome provided was the right one.

Over the past year, we received a steady stream of inquiries concerning BAYT's COVID-19 protocols. Stuff like bringing an out-of-town family member to shul. Or concern when we broadcast that some one who attended a minyan tested positive for COVID. We get the occasional not-so-constructive complaint or rant expressing displeasure with BAYT's COVID-19 protocols. BAYT's COVID-19 committee includes three Executive officers, Rabbi Korobkin, BAYT operations director Karen Zilberberg, facilities manager Noel Fernandes and two physicians. All COVID-19 protocols and ensuing decisions are made collaboratively by the committee. The committee interacts regularly with both the City of Vaughan bylaw enforcement and York Region Public Health as well as Toronto's Kol HaCovid committee. On occasion, we will consult with legal counsel.

I am sorry that some of you may not like our COVID-19 protocols. BAYT'S COVID-19 protocols comply with Provincial emergency regulations. And they work in large part because you, our members, follow them. Bli ayin hora, <u>BAYT has not had one COVID-19 outbreak (essentially two or more persons in one room) since the beginning of the pandemic</u>. And your fellow members feel comfortable coming to BAYT because of our protocols. I am NOT sorry for that.

At the end of a jog near dusk last week, a couple on their evening walk flagged me to stop for a second. I laughingly told them the complaint department was closed for the night. They actually wanted to compliment my weekly messages and our COVID -19 protocols. (I am flattered that many of you seem to enjoy these messages. They take time and thought.)

Every communication you see with my name at the bottom has been seen and edited by at least one other person, if not a committee. Not everyone is going to agree with any given message. I may be sorry you may not agree, but I am not sorry when conveying the message is the right thing. And when it does not, you know I will apologize.

Whether a complement or a complaint, both generally give me too much credit. It is the President's job to take the heat. And to give kudos. Things get done at BAYT not because of any one person but rather through the collective and collaborative efforts of our employees and volunteers. Complaints come with the territory but the blessings of serving as your President make it all worth it.

From my family to yours, have a sunny, kosher and socially distant Pesach.

BAYT COVID-19 Committee

Dear Members:

Some of you have made clear, and we understand, your displeasure with our protocol for households with children and/or family members returning to or entering Canada from abroad. Today, we spent a lot of time voicing your concerns to our contacts at York Public Health and Toronto's Kol HaCovid committee. This is a synopsis of what they told us.

Federal law is clear. Every traveller returning to Canada must quarantine for 14 days whether arriving by air or road, whether they have been vaccinated, had a COVID infection or a negative COVID test result. Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) advises all travellers upon entry to Canada that they must <u>completely</u> isolate during their 14 day quarantine period from anybody else in their household. If complete isolation is not possible, they are advised that other household members <u>must</u> also quarantine for the entire 14 days.

It may seem absurd that 14 day self isolation applies to travellers returning to Canada from Israel (of all places) or the United States who are fully vaccinated. Yes, a vaccinated individual has a lower risk of contracting COVID. But public health studies are inconclusive that vaccinated individuals cannot transmit COVID. As well, significant uncertainty exists over the effectiveness of approved vaccines against a growing number of variants of concern (VOC). 40% of all positive COVID cases in Ontario today were VOCs. From a public health perspective, risks remain definite and with significant consequences. Indeed, Kol HaCovid told us a number of students in the Jewish community returning to Ontario from the United States carried a VOC that has already spread to others in our community. In summary:

- No approved vaccine is 100% effective at this time.
- Ontario and Canada are long ways away from herd immunity.
- Whether approved vaccines actually prevent transmission of COVID or VOCs is not yet confirmed.
- Real uncertainties remain as to the effectiveness of approved vaccines against VOCs.

BAYT would be contravening public health guidelines to adjust our protocol for households with children and/or family members returning to or entering Canada from abroad at this time. Until further notice, it remains as follows:

If you have children or family members returning to or entering Canada from abroad who are or will be in mandatory 14 day self-isolation in your household, please do not sign up for or attend a minyan at BAYT <u>unless those children and/or family</u> <u>members are completely isolated from the rest of your household for the entirety of the 14 days quarantine period</u>. This applies even if he/she has been vaccinated, had a COVID infection or a negative COVID test.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.





D'VAR TORAH FOR PARSHAS TZAV

In Parshat Tzav, we learn about the mitzvah called Terumat Hadeshen, which is the mitzvah the kohanim had to lift some ashes from the burned korbanot with a shovel and put the ashes on the floor. Chazal actually tell us that after the kohen put the ashes down, a neis happened and the floor swallowed them!

We don't know the reason why Hashem commended the kohanim to do this mitzvah every day. Maybe it was so that the mizbeach could stay clean, but that's just a guess.

In the Little Midrash Says, we read an idea that we can learn an important point from this mitzvah. Kohanim probably felt very important and special because they were chosen by Hashem to do the avoda, wear the bigdei kehuna, and more! But the mitzvah of Terumat Hadeshen taught the kohanim that it's important to be humble. Instead of thinking that cleaning ashes is too lowly of a job for them, they did it.


We can learn from this that no matter how important someone is, they should still not think they're too important to do smaller jobs or jobs that seem like they're not important enough.
