PRESIDENT MESSAGE:

Your BAYT today is stronger, more stable, and dare I say happier than two years ago. And this week, the Nominations Committee published its slate to maintain the momentum. The slate represents a diverse cross section of members, both hashkafic and experiential, each willing to sacrifice of themselves (and their families) to serve our community. To those who accepted a nomination, thank you. For those of you 'retiring,' thank you.

At any given moment, the past two years seemed like an eternity. We had much to accomplish, fix and manage. It took a huge collective effort. Our Rabbis and employees, our Board, our Executive Committee and the many (needs to be more) members who gave generously of their time and finances. I am grateful for sage advice I sought out from a few past presidents, a few old codgers, and a handful of lawyers, CPAs, community leaders, educators, and health care workers (physicians, nurses and at least one paramedic) in our membership ranks.

A few ensuing highlights:

- We are back. Our minyanim and shiurim are well-attended with something for just about everyone.
- Our short to mid-term financial situation has stabilized (but never take it for granted).
- Just this week, we sat and ironed out details of our agreement with Jacobs Catering.
- We are working to ensure our long-term financial stability, for your children and grandchildren, as we evaluate development alternatives compatible with who we are as an Orthodox community.
- Our relationship with Mizrahi Canada is creating engagement with our members and neighbors.
- We repaired the ceiling and painted the main shul, updating the lighting and improving air circulation. We replaced most of the original, leaky roof (as well as some old, leaky plumbing in the kitchen).
- We made it through the worst of COVID, mostly unified.
- The next generation of your leadership is emerging from our active and engaged Young Family and Young Adult members. The future is now!

What lays ahead?

- Continue to grow our membership and capitalize on our relationship with Mizrahi Canada. Adopt formal kiruv program to attract more neighbors to our BAYT and Orthodoxy. This needs to be a priority.
- Finish main shul roof this summer and main shul renovations early in 2023.
- Renovate the office including carpet replacement, painting, and update furniture. I ask the incoming slate to make this a priority for 2022, for the sake of our employees.
- Brighten and freshen Perlis Hall carpet and paint.
- Seal cracks in parking lot and paint new lines (what lines?). I asked our team to find a way to open the Clark Avenue gate while preventing use of our lot as a short cut while ensuring security and fire access.
- Update by-laws with addition of conflict-of-interest provision (as will required by Ontario law) removal of obsolete provisions, clarification of membership rights and responsibilities including burial privileges. Personally, I believe we should reduce the size of the Board to no more than twenty-five and shift around some Executive committee responsibilities.
- Update membership categories and rates.
- Adopt board training on governance matters.
- Finish documentation of key functions and processes so we do not have to start from scratch with every new face.

DIVREI TORAH & NOTICE BOARD

K'riat haTorah in Israel will be one parshah ahead of the Diaspora until July 30. Why don't we catch up with Israel sooner?

K'riat haTorah was created to ensure that communities would have a weekly public reading of the Torah. Authorities debate whether the mitzvah is purely communal (such that individuals are not obligated to hear it personally), or whether there is an obligation for each individual to hear the Torah read communally. Either way, the original mitzvah did not require reading a particular parshah on a particular Shabbat; the mitzvah was just to continue reading where the community stopped on the previous week. (Megillah 29b; Tosafot Succah 52a v'keivan; Or Zarua II 45; Chatam Sofer Orach Chaim 1:69; Pitchei Teshuvah Orach Chaim 135:2; Igrot Moshe Orach Chaim 2:72)

The Talmud and early authorities record preferences for holding certain readings on particular Shabbatot. We maintain at least one parshah between Parshat Bechukotai and Shavuot and at least one parshah between Ki Tavo and Rosh HaShanah, because Bechukotai and Ki Tavo contain severe warnings of Divine punishment. We also read Parshat Vaetchanan on the Shabbat following Tishah b'Av. (Megillah 31b; Teshuvot haGaonim (Emanuel) 25; Shulchan Aruch Orach Chaim 428:4)

Halachic authorities were never concerned about making sure that the same Torah portion would be read throughout the Jewish world on a given Shabbat. This may be because mass travel between Israel and the Diaspora is a relatively modern phenomenon, or because the Sages always expected our stay in the Diaspora to end shortly. Regardless of the reason, the discrepancy is only resolved when we need to double a parshah outside Israel in order to put Bamidbar before Shavuot, or to have Vaetchanan after Tishah b'Av. This year, it is the latter; Matot and Masei will be read separately in Israel, and together outside of Israel.

We are commanded 'Kedoshim Tihiyu', be holy, because Hashem is our G-d. But how can we be holy?

Bnei Yisrael are given 51 different Mitzvot this week. One would expect all of them to be between man and G-d but only about a third are. People often expect some magical moment, but creating one of those disingenuously with the sorcery runs afoul of several Mitzvot from our Parshah.

So what can we do? As the Parsha continues we see eight Mitzvot relate to gifts to the poor from the produce of the land of Israel – such as Peah, leaving a corner of the field for the poor. In fact these 8 are 4 that are given positive and negative commandments. Why the extra reinforcement?

When gathering crops it is easy to become overcome with greed. By taking that opportunity to take care of those less fortunate, we in turn sanctify G-d's name.

This week we celebrated Yom Haatzmaut. With our return to Israel and the founding of the State of Israel we have merited to once again fulfill the Mitzvot contingent on the land. May we continue to remember

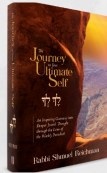
