MAOS CHITTIN

When selling your Chometz, the custom of providing donations for the purchase of Passover foods for the poor can be fulfilled by making donations to the Shul's Charity Fund. Simply go online and select "Donate" from the menu; indicate "Charity Fund- Maos Chittin" under the Donation Type.

SHAIMOS COLLECTION

BURNING OF CHOMETZ

The City of Vaughan will be providing a special bin for the burning of chometz at the BAYT on Wednesday, April 5. The Vaughan Fire Department will be present to supervise the ceremony.

Please note the following details:

- The bin will be located in the BAYT parking lot
- The bin will be available from 6:30 AM - 12:15 PM.
- Only Chometz in paper bags is accepted and permissible.

Plastic bags are not permitted because they are a pollutant. BAYT will have paper bags available to transfer your chametz from plastic if needed.

PESACH GARBAGE DEPOT

The City of Vaughan is placing a large temporary covered bin in the parking area outside the Garnet A. Williams from Sunday, March 19 to Sunday, April 9 (5:30AM-9PM.) The bin is for regular household waste. Residents should do their best to recycle glass, plastic and cardboard packaging for weekly home pickup. Additionally, there will be double-up days for garbage the weeks of March 21 and 28.

Forgetting To Remember

When we partake in a meaningful Seder, we fulfill no less than five mitzvot. Two of those mitzvot are Torah mandated, and three are rabbinically mandated. The two Torah mandated mitzvot are: (1) Eating matza and (2) Reciting the story of our Exodus from Egypt, as contained in the Haggadah. The three rabbinically mandated mitzvot are: (1) Drinking four cups of wine, (2) Eating maror, and (3) Reciting the Hallel (also in the Haggadah).

What do you normally do before doing a mitzvah? You make a brachah. Here's something curious: For each mitzvah mentioned above, we make a brachah over the mitzvah, except for Maggid, the mitzvah of reciting the Haggadah! Why is that?

Several answers have been offered. One is that we make mention of the Exodus while reciting kiddush -- we say "zecher litzias mitzrayim" -- that this festival is a "remembrance of the Egyptian Exodus." In so doing, we have used the brachah in kiddush to cover the brachah for the mitzvah of relating the Exodus.

Another answer offered is that you never make a brachah on a mitzvah which has no finite amount defined for the fulfillment of the mitzvah. For example, we do not make a brachah on the mitzvah of prayer, because there is no specified amount of prayer that the Torah obligates us to pray (the specific prayers that we have today were mandated by the Sages).

Others suggest that the mitzvah of relating the Exodus is only an extension of the more general mitzvah of remembering the Exodus "every day of your life" (Deut. 16:3). Because of this more general commandment, we mention the Exodus every day, whenever we recite the Shema. The night of the Seder is only different in that we elaborate upon the Exodus in more detail. Since this mitzvah is a constant one, without a beginning and end, we do not recite a brachah.

The Chasan Sofer (grandson of the Chasam Sofer) offers an answer which is quite innovative. There is another mitzvah which we do without saying a brachah, and that is the mitzvah of tzedakah. Why not say a brachah every time we give tzedakah? One answer given by the Abudarham is that we do not make a brachah when it is at the expense of someone else's plight. Since the only way for me to fulfill the mitzvah of tzedakah is when there is someone destitute ready to receive the charity, the rabbis did not deem it appropriate to make a brachah, since the mitzvah can only be done through someone else's misery. More generally stated, whenever a mitzvah is mandated to compensate for a deficiency in the human condition, we do not "bless" Hashem.

In the same vein, we do not make a brachah over the Haggadah. The whole mitzvah of remembering the Exodus only comes as a result of man's fallibility to forgetfulness. If I had a perfect, photographic memory of every event that ever took place, I would not need the mitzvah of remembering the Exodus. It is only because I forget things that G-d had to command me not to forget.

The fact that we can and do forget the miracles that spawned our nationhood is in itself a reflection of our flawed state. Shouldn't something so vitally important as the milestone of our betrothal to Hashem as His people be etched indelibly in our minds? Why should I be commanded to remember it? I might occasionally forget an anniversary (sorry, Karen!), but do I forget that I'm married that I should have to be reminded? Do I forget that I have children, that the school has to call me and remind me? Why, then, do I forget that I have a G-d, who cares for me and saves me?

This is the reason we do not recite a brachah on the Haggadah. Just like the mitzvah of tzedakah, it was only commanded and can only be performed because of the poverty of the human condition, not as a celebration of it.

Our goal, then, is to divest ourselves of this human frailty that makes us forget G-d and His constant miracles. By keeping the experience of the Seder with us throughout the year, by remembering the miracles of Pesach throughout our lives, we will be able to indelibly brand within our hearts and souls the Almighty and His constant providence over us.

As we remember our Exodus this year, let's also take a moment to recall the recent past, when, due to the pandemic, we were not able to celebrate the way we do this year. Let's note both the empty seats of those who are no longer at our Seders, and the full seats of smiling faces with whom we have the pleasure of celebrating the Chag. Let us lift our cups of wine in gratitude for the past and for the future of ourselves and our people!

From home to home, Karen and I and our entire family wish you a happy and kosher Pesach.

A MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT RABBI

Faith and Facing Our Fears

“Yetziah Bi’Sheilah” is a term that was coined by some to describe those who have left a life of Torah. It is used as a play off the term “Chozar BiTeshuvah -- returning to a life of faith. The word teshuvah can be translated as both repentance as well as an answer to a question. Hence the term “Yetziah Bi’Sheilah” or leaving with questions. I believe this term emerged from a misconception about what faith is and what it is not.

The night of the Seder is referred to as the night of Emunah -- the night of faith. It is a night we are given to impart our beliefs and values to ourselves, our children, and to the next generation. However, Maggid does not start with teaching principles or a set of beliefs. It begins with the Ma Nishtanah -- why is this night different from all other nights?

The Gemara in Pesachim (116a) states that if someone is at the Seder alone with no one else who can ask the Ma Nishtanah, he asks himself the four questions. Even two great Torah scholars should ask each other these same questions? First of all, if there are no children to teach the story to, why are we supposed to ask ourselves these questions? Why not just review the answers, isn't that what is important? Moreover, why do Torah scholars have to ask each other these questions, don't they already know the answers?

People think that in order to be a religious Jew, we have to “have all the answers,” and if someone doesn't, they cannot be frum. This is a mistake. As human beings we will never “have all the answers.” Emunah is not about having all the right answers, it is about having an authentic and living connection with ourselves and with Hashem.

In fact, the very act of questioning testifies to faith. In the words of Rabbi Jonathan Sacks:

To ask is to believe that somewhere there is an answer...Far from faith excluding questions, questions testify to faith - that the world is not random, the universe is not impervious to our understanding, life is not chance... When faith suppresses questions, it dies. When it accepts superficial answers, it withers. Faith is not opposed to doubt. What it is opposed to is the shallow certainty that what we understand is all there is. [1]

If we are honest with ourselves, either we are afraid of our questions of faith or, if we haven't found answers yet, we have surrendered to never getting answers. But in reality, not only do we have nothing to fear from our questions -- we need them. I once heard from Rabbi Yoni Fishcher that the letters F.E.A.R can be used as an acronym for what we usually do when we are afraid, we “forget everything and run.” But Rabbi Fischer prefers a different F.E.A.R. acronym: “face everything and rise.”

In truth, the struggle of questions is the birthplace of faith. Questions are the way we engage with something in a real way. When we challenge Torah or Judaism, we are attempting to make sense of our own experience and how it fits into Torah and Hashem's plan for us. Starting this form of dialogue with Hashem and engaging in this search for meaning is exactly what it means to be a frum Jew.

For those struggling with questions of faith: know that your questions themselves are acts of faith and the path towards a life of meaning. For those without questions: find some! The moment we have no questions, the moment we think we have arrived (or think we will never get there), when we think our search is over and we have no more questions, that is the moment our faith withers and dies.

Precisely because the Seder is the night of faith, it is a night of questions. Questions, challenges, and struggles are what allows us to genuinely and authentically engage with our relationship with Hashem.

May we all be zocheh to asking some questions at Seder night and the rest of the year!

Two Shields

The Jewish nation is guarded by two shields – the shield of Avraham (מגן אברהם) and the shield of Dovid (מגן דוד). What is the significance of these two armaments?

Rav Tzadok (Likutei Ma'amarim) explains that the Jewish people have two different connections to Hashem. The first bond comes from our being descendants of the Avos. Every member of the Jewish nation has a relationship to his Creator through the collective attachment of the entire Jewish people. But we do not only have a national connection with Hashem. Each Jewish person has a personal relationship with Him as well.

The first connection is described as Magen Avraham. It is the guarantee that we were given as descendants of Avraham, that Hashem will forever protect the bond that He has with us. Every Jew, simply because he is a member of the Jewish people, has an unbreakable attachment to his Creator. And even if he has sunken into the abyss – ישראל הוא.



The personal relationship we have Hashem is represented by Dovid – the king who symbolizes the heart of the Jewish people; the person whose role it is to understand each individual Jew. Each Jewish person has an intimate attachment unrelated to other members of the nation. It is about this unique connection that we recite Magen Dovid – the shield of Dovid. Not only is it impossible for a Jew to give up his status of being a descendent of Avraham, a Jew is also unable to undermine his own unique holiness.

The Zohar (Vaeira) writes that Galus Mitzrayim was an exile of speech – not sound. Indeed, the Jewish nation did not express their pain in words. They cried out; they moaned; but they did not speak. Moshe, who led the nation, struggled with his ability to speak. But how can we understand this?

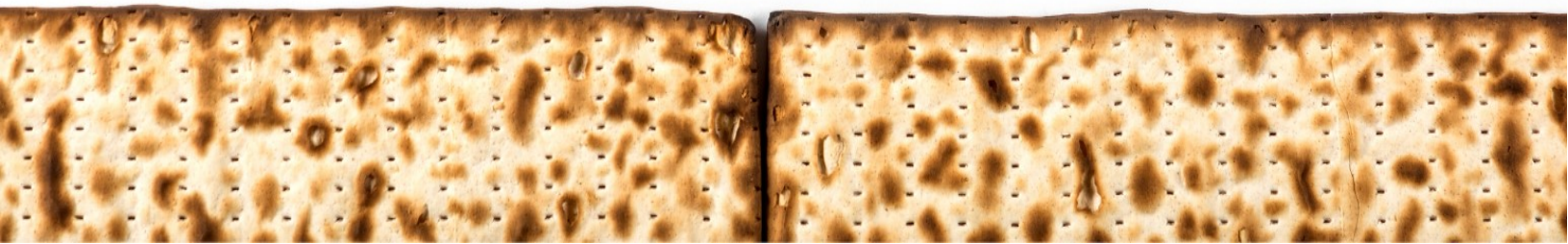
Sound is a general reality which has unlimited potential. Speech breaks down the sound into parts and gives it meaning. Rav Tzadok explains that sound represents the holiness and unique relationship of the collective Jewish people. That relationship was never in Galus. The Jewish people always felt a connection to Hashem due to their being descendants of the Avos. But they discounted their own individual relationship with their Creator. The speech, which symbolized the individual connections, was in exile. The Jewish nation did not believe in their own individual holiness and connection to Hashem. This was the Galus of Mitzrayim. Indeed, the Galus began only after the Shevatim left the world and the Jewish people felt undeserving without the spiritual bulwark of their parents and grandparents. Only then did they succumb to slavery, feeling undeserving of any rights.

But then the nation was redeemed. They were taken out of exile and shown how besides the national relationship, each Jew, as well, enjoys a personal bond with Hashem. They were brought to Har Sinai where each Jew was given his part of Torah; his portion that only he could reveal, and this awareness was concretized.

Perhaps it could be said that this is why the Aseres Hadibros was said in the singular. Hashem was highlighting the individual attachment that each Jewish person has. He turned to every single Jew with the words “I took you out of Mitzrayim.” Not only as a member of the collective nation, but as an individual. For I have a unique relationship with each and every one of you.

May I shave my beard or have a haircut on chol hamoed?

We honour Yom Tov by improving our appearance. Therefore, one might assume that we could shave and have haircuts on chol hamoed; even though these acts involve melachah, they are for the sake of Yom Tov. Nonetheless, there is a competing value: ensuring that people groom themselves for Yom Tov in advance.

Therefore, Halachah prohibits men and women from cutting the hair of the head or beard on chol hamoed, lest people push off proper grooming to chol hamoed. However, this only applies to the head; women may remove hair from other parts of the body. [The question of whether men may remove hair from other parts of the body is beyond the scope of this column.]

The Shulchan Aruch explicitly prohibits shaving on chol hamoed even if one shaved on the day before Yom Tov; not everyone will know that this person shaved in advance. [For a similar prohibition against doing most laundry on chol hamoed, see Shulchan Aruch Orach Chaim 534.]

Many halachic authorities maintain that this prohibition remains in force today, even though it is now standard to shave daily. However, three arguments are advanced to permit shaving on chol hamoed in limited circumstances: The prohibition does not apply in cases of great need, such as to prevent financial loss or significant pain; Everyone knows that one could not have shaved the newly grown facial hair before Yom Tov; There is a mitzvah of looking good for chol hamoed and Yom Tov.

Rabbi Korobkin's position is to abide by the ruling of the Shulchan Aruch, and thus one should not shave during chol hamoed. The only exception would be if one would incur financial loss due to his unkempt appearance in the workplace. In that case, one may shave.

Why do we split Hallel in half on Seder night? By the time we get the second half after eating the main meal, Shulchan Orech, and the Afikoman, the first part is almost forgotten. Why not simply say it all at once?

The Ramban (Pesachim 117b) explains that Hallel's institution on Seder night and it's being split in half is deliberate. When our Sages arranged the Hallel in two parts on the Seder night, it was in order to be said on the Korban Pesach and the festive meal that accompanies it. We sing the Hallel as part and parcel of the night, encompassing the meal with joyous music.

Back in the times of the Beit Hamikdash, when it finally came time to eat the Korban Pesach it had to be eaten indoors (Yerushalmi Pesachim 7:13). Due to the large number of people there was not enough room in the houses for all of the Jews. As a result, after eating the Korban and doing most of the Seder, people would head up to the rooftops to sing Hallel and free up space in their house for the next group. The sound of the Hallel was so loud that it would shake the roofs in Jerusalem.

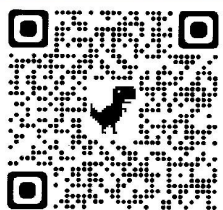

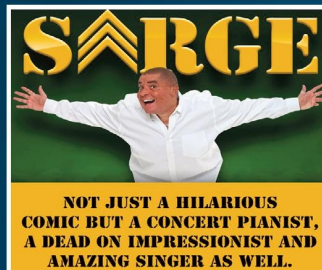
