BAYT COVID-19 Update - December 30, 2021

Even before the Province of Ontario update this week concerning potential COVID-19 exposures and when to isolate, many of you made inquiries if you should attend BAYT. This message highlights the isolation requirements announced by the province this week we believe are relevant to our community. For complete and up-to-date information, please visit <u>ontario.ca/exposed</u>. The Province of Ontario COVID-19 self-assessment test is available here: covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment.

Assume you may have COVID-19 and are contagious if you have:

- any one of the following symptoms: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, decreased or loss of taste
 or smell; or
- two or more of the following symptoms: runny nose or nasal congestion, headache, extreme fatigue, sore throat, muscle aches or joint pain, or gastrointestinal symptoms such as vomiting or diarrhea.

You Are Symptomatic of or Tested Positive for COVID-19

If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or tested positive for COVID-19, you, and anyone you live with must isolate for 5 days if fully vaccinated and otherwise healthy or are under 12 years of age. You can end isolation after 5 days only if your symptoms have improved for at least 24 hours and you follow all public health and safety measures such as masking and physical distancing. If your symptoms are not in the list above, stay home until you feel better for at least 24 hours (or 48 hours if the symptoms affect the digestive system).

If you are not fully vaccinated or are immunocompromised, you and anyone you live with must isolate for 10 days.

You Were Exposed to Others Symptomatic of or Who Tested Positive for COVID-19

You may need to isolate from others if you were exposed to someone who has symptoms of COVID-19 or has tested positive for COVID-19. If you are fully vaccinated, have no symptoms, do not live with the positive case and are otherwise healthy:

- self-monitor for symptoms for 10 days after your last exposure,
- wear a mask, practice physical distancing, and follow all other public health measures if leaving home, and
- do not visit any high-risk settings or people who may be at higher risk of illness (such as seniors) for 10 days after your last exposure.

If you are not fully vaccinated or are immunocompromised, isolate for 10 days after your last exposure, regardless of whether you have any symptoms.

You Live with Someone with Symptoms of or Tested Positive for COVID-19

If you are fully vaccinated and otherwise healthy, or under 12 years of age, you must isolate for the same amount of time as the positive case, regardless of your vaccination status.

When to Isolate

If you test positive from a PCR test, rapid molecular test, or a rapid antigen test, you must isolate. If you tested positive on a rapid antigen test, you no longer need to book a PCR test to confirm your results.

If you are fully vaccinated and otherwise healthy, or are under 12 years old, you must isolate for 5 days from when your symptoms began or from the date of your test, whichever came first. You can end isolation after 5 days if your symptoms are improved for at least 24 hours, and all public health and safety measures, such as masking and physical distancing, are followed.

If you are not fully vaccinated or are immunocompromised, you must isolate for 10 days after your symptoms began or your positive test result, whichever came first.

The people you live with must also isolate at the same time as you, whether they are fully vaccinated or not.

If you are work or live in a high risk-health care setting, including hospitals, long-term care, retirement homes, congregate living settings, you must notify your employer and isolate for 10 days from your exposure or symptom onset, or from your date of diagnosis.

Inform Close Contacts

If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or have tested positive on a COVID-19 test, inform your close contacts that they may have been exposed. A "close contact" is anyone you were less than two metres away from for at least 15 minutes, or multiple shorter lengths of time, without personal protective equipment in the 48 hours before your symptoms began or your positive test result, whichever came first. Close contacts in schools should follow the school-based guidance.

Am I obligated to wash my hands before davening?

There are times when we wash our hands to clean them, or to remove impurity associated with death and death -like experiences. However, we also wash our hands before davening to demonstrate preparation for meeting with Hashem, like kohanim entering the Beit haMikdash.

We wash before each davening even if our hands are clean; the sole exception is where one washed for the sake of an earlier davening, and has been careful to keep clean since then.

We wash from a cup, where possible. Ideally we pour water three times on each hand (alternating right and left), but we pour at least once on each hand. There is no berachah for this washing, unless one knows that his hands are dirty, or that he has some other reason (i.e. sleep) to require washing.

One should travel up to 18 minutes in order to find water. If that would mean missing minyan, then one should just wipe his hands on a surface which will clean them.

What is the purpose of the Ten Plagues?

From the verses of the Torah, it seems to be a combination of punishment of the Egyptians for their actions (4:23), forcing Pharaoh to release the Jews (3:19:20), and to teach belief in G-d (7:17).

But who is the target audience?

If the plagues' primary purpose is punishing Pharaoh and the Egyptians or compelling Pharaoh to free the Jewish people, then they are the target audience. Each plague serves to further ensure that the Egyptians fully give up on enslaving the Jews, and receive their just punishment.

However, if the end goal is teaching belief in G-d, then Jews and Egyptians are both being taught. Plagues can simultaneously disprove the Egyptian pagan belief system as explained by Rabbi Avraham Saba in Tzeror Hamor, show the Jewish people how to attain full belief in G-d and later receive the Torah as put forth by Rabbi Levi ben Gershon, and warn the nations of the world about oppressing the Jews (Midrash Sifre).

G-d's Ten Plagues not only override nature but also teach multiple complex messages to different audiences.


