What changes should I make in Selichot if I say them without a minyan?

We recite Selichot in the days leading up to Rosh haShanah and Yom Kippur, as well as on fast days. This year, Ashkenazim begin on the night after Shabbat August 28. One may recite these prayers in private, although prayer in a group is always preferable.

One who prays alone should omit the Aramaic portions. Also, an individual is not eligible to recite the portions of Selichot which list the 13 attributes of Divine mercy (Shemot 34:6-7), but many authorities rule that an individual may recite them with the notes of the *trop*, as though reading a verse from the Torah rather than a prayer.

On the first night of Selichot, we try to recite Selichot midway through the night (1:18 AM this year), in order to link them with the merit of the preceding Shabbat. However, for the rest of Selichot some suggest it is better not to recite them midway through the night, but instead to recite them early in the morning, before first light (72 minutes before sunrise, according to BAYT). One who did not recite them that early may still recite them after dawn. Note that one who recites Selichot after sunrise should alter the wording of those lines which claim to be reciting Selichot "at night".

Don't Just Stand By

Parshat Ki Tetzei contains 74 different Mitzvoth, more than any other Parshah in the Torah. Some of them seem too obvious to be called a mitzvah, such as Hashavat Aveidah, returning a lost object, or helping your friend or his animal when it is overloaded. Aren't these just common sense? And why is each of them doubled? And not only that, they are seemingly repeats from Parshat Mishpatim in Sefer Shemot?

It is far too easy to fall into the lull of the bystander effect, simply assuming that someone else will take care of someone's needs when in fact no one ends up doing anything. By repeating and reinforcing this several times with interpersonal mitzvot, mitzvoth bayn Adam liChaveiro, G-d is impressing upon us that we cannot simply sit by and watch.

We need to notice what goes on around us and take action. It can start with the smallest of steps - taking responsibility for someone else's lost object; not turning a blind eye but actively taking it to the nearest lost and found. Or noticing the person behind you or in front of you might need help with the door or unloading whatever they are carrying. We can't simply walk straight home, rather we must take a look around and see who needs help and only then are we walking the right path

When "Thank-you" Seem Impossible

In a post-Holocaust world, how should we feel towards the country of Germany? This question undoubtedly will -- and should -- evoke a good deal of emotions. However, one feeling which certainly is *not* present is the feeling of gratitude.

However, the Torah tells us something not to be believed. The Egyptians, who like the Nazis, enslaved us, persecuted us, and murdered our children, are not to be rejected completely. "You shall not abhor an Egyptian, for you were a stranger in his land." (*Devarim* 23:8) Rashi, noting the absurdity, writes, "What is the reason that you should not completely reject him? Because his ancestors were your hosts in your time of need." Therefore, there is a *mitzvah* to accept third generation Egyptians to marry into the Jewish people (once converted).

During Yosef's reign in Egypt, when neighbouring countries were suffering from famine, the Egyptians gave refuge to Yosef's family. Therefore, we must have *hakarat hatov* to them for the kindness they performed to our ancestors.

Granted, there is a major difference between accepting an indivual Egyptian convert into our community and having gratitude towards Germany after their unthinkable genocide. However, according to Rashi, at the root of this *mitzvah*, is the sense of gratitude towards Egypt. How can the Torah ask us to have *hakarat hatov* towards Egypt after all that they did to us? It seems just as illogical and inappropriate as having *hakarat hatov* towards Germany?

However, the Egyptians did something that the Germans did not. They hosted us in our time of need. This requires *hakarat hatov* -- recognition of the good they did for us -- regardless of what they did to us subsequently. The Torah demands that we recognize the good others do for us even when they have also wronged us.

We may not know any prospective Egyptians converts, but we can certainly look around at our friends, family, and loved ones and appreciate the things they do for us every single day. By doing so, we can better cultivate our *middah* of *hakarat hatov* for others and for *Hakodosh Baruch Hu*. Everything we have is ultimately "goodness" given to us by others. We are here in this world because of our parents. We are alive today because of God. How can we not be thankful?


