

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

For the Fruit

As I mentioned over the past few messages, the Rav and I attended the World Orthodox Israel Congress which officially began on the Wednesday night after Yom Ha'azmaut with a beautiful dinner. It was there, that Rabbi Doron Perez, Executive Chairman of World Mizrachi, released his new book The Jewish State: From Opposition to Opportunity.

Rabbi Jacob J. Schacter has said, "Rabbi Doron Perez has authored a powerful and passionate call for civility and unity within the Jewish community. He makes a compelling case for the central role the State of Israel can play and, in particular, the Mizrachi movement which he heads with such distinction can – and must – play in assuring the continued flourishing of the Jewish people. Read this book carefully and be inspired to do your share." I have read the book and it has inspired me to do more. I urge you to do the same. It is well thought out. I would share some passages which inspired me or taught me key information, but I have already passed it along to my children. It will be for sale on amazon.ca July 28, 2023.

Randomly (nothing is really random) sitting down for dinner, we met a lovely woman from Teaneck who introduced herself as Mindy Stein, national past president of Emunah of America. A little Jewish geography later and we realized we were sitting next to one of Sam Silverberg's sisters. Another Silverberg sister is our mishpacha on the Berglas side. So we sat next to BAYT and by marriage family. Aren't we all anyways?

What was clear from this conference is the love of Torah and Eretz Yisrael. And how do we spread that love? On Thursday, there were many sessions and meetings. It was the most exhausting day (8am to past midnight) and certainly not enough time to address the many issues that are on everyone's minds. I was more interested in Lay Leadership meetings, but many other inspiring and critical topics were on the agenda. It was just impossible to be at two places at once.

The one topic that I had circled was the Re-engaging Post-COVID. The Rav and I have had many discussions about this matter. No question, Covid restrictions lingered much longer in Canada, but this is a world-wide common challenge and Orthodoxy has suffered tremendously during the past three years. And it's from all angles. Parents were not allowed to bring their children to shul in the beginning. These are children that were going to shul weekly and suddenly they are being told you can't go to shul. Three years later, "of course you have to go to shul". Flipping the switch on is not as simple as it may seem. A parent at the Lag B'Omer event told me their nine year old is just returning now. Another parent suggested we have a monthly Shabbat candy blitz where all members are urged to bring candies and throw them as the Sefer Torah is being removed from the Aron Kodesh. The kids should be there when the Sefer Torah is taken out. This would be done with a build-up giving parents and kids time to plan a Shabbat metukah (sweet). Certainly, at the BAYT we have seen an improvement in attendance, but we are far from there yet. Keep the suggestions coming.

Then, there is the high school and university young adults who have been the most hurt. No place for them in Shul when it was permitted to have 10 people in a minyan. As the world moved online as a result of Covid, our children suddenly realized that they do not have to go anywhere, and they think that they have all they need at their fingertips. It is very painful to think about. I said right at the beginning of Covid, the kids will be the long-term challenge and while many adults have suffered, the thirty and under age group have a lot to overcome. So many people today need therapy to learn coping skills and in my humble opinion, the therapy is in the siddur. We have to help everyone connect back to tefillah. It is such a powerful tool. But in order to connect to tefillah, we have to teach the meaning of tefillah. It is the one place where we should be able to connect without distraction and get much off our minds and know that Hashem is listening.

And the famous backyard minyanim which are over for the most part. All shuls struggled with that and continue to struggle with getting its members back into shul. A comment made at the session by one of the presenters grabbed my attention when he said - "see people that used to attend shul every day, that would never volunteer in the shul, never sit on the board, but suddenly for a backyard minyan become the gabbai, and will not relinquish the position three years later, instead of returning back to shul." It is a strange phenomenon, but certainly common, as I can attest.

We have a responsibility to inspire people through the Shabbat table, Youth Programs, our drashot and educational programs, our general messages, and of course, through tefillah. One fascinating suggestion that is successful in the UK is the engagement of the grade eleven students with their grade five counterparts. Yeshiva and seminary leaders are engaging the youth leaders. All orchestrated with the Rabbis and lay leaders in the British Jewish community. The UK has shown powerful results with these experiences. I have requested more details and plan to share it with our school professionals and Rabbi.

One common solution mentioned by all is the power of the kiddushes, both youth and adult. It's amazing what food on Shabbat will do. The Rav and I have been a huge proponent of this. We need your support in this category, but it's just the beginning. Last Shabbat was an amazing kiddush sponsored by a non-member. Beautiful.

Another shul started a halahkic garden. How novel is that? While we didn't start a halahkic garden per se, we are bringing our community together by seeding, nurturing and ultimately growing food for our community in the BAYT garden. Another shul is organizing more social gatherings. I think we have done a good job of that, but like anything, we can do better. I love our Friday night dinners, but that may not work for the younger families, and we have to come up with a young family meal on Shabbat as well, maybe seudat shlishit. The Rav is also working on new plans as well.

A big thank you to Rabbi Lesher, the Stein's, Richie Idels, Moishe Posner, Matee Moshkovits, Avi Katz and Andy Gelberger and the Brotherhood for organizing the Lag B'Omer bonfire on Monday night. It was quite beautiful with food (of course), music and a warm fire to sit around and sing.

Officer Robert Li of the York Regional Police joined us as well. He works in the Diversity & Cultural Resource Unit connecting officers to the community. We look forward to seeing Officer Li around more often and getting to know a familiar face in our police force.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE CONT'D

A little over a month ago, the board passed a budget for the BAYT allowing us to buy a scissor forklift. This enables the Facilities team to carry out critical maintenance in and around our beautiful building. One recent example is the Perlis Hall. Have you been into the Perlis Hall recently? Please look up. After twenty years, the chandelier bulbs have been replaced and cleaned. They are gleaming. The hall is so much brighter. What a difference! Thank you, Jesse!

The Or Ha'Chaim gives forty-two explanations to the first pasuk in Bechukotai. While I have not completed all 42 of his ideas yet, I am struck by the word "Im". Translated as "If", if you will go in My statutes. Statutes which we do not necessarily understand why we are commanded to perform, but we do - like tefillin and tzitzit, because we have complete and absolute trust in the ways of Hashem. That is the essence of returning to shul and Torah. We always want answers, at the push of a button, the swipe of a screen, but while we do not know why we perform these statutes, we do know that Hashem "will provide for us rains in their time and the land will give its produce and the tree of the field will give its fruit". Children are our fruit. We are promised fruit as a reward, IF we are with Hashem carrying out His statutes. It is incumbent upon each and every one of us as a community to achieve these goals. It is the essence of the BAYT.



Why do we customarily eat dairy on Shavuot?

Numerous reasons are suggested for this practice, including: Because we will then have separate meat and dairy meals, we will necessarily eat from at least two distinct loaves of bread. These two loaves of bread represent the two loaves of bread brought as a korban on Shavuot. (Rama Orach Chaim 494:3, and see Igrot Moshe Orach Chaim 1:160)

On Shavuot we celebrate the presentation of the Torah. After the Torah was given, the Jews would have needed many steps to make a meat meal, both in preparing the meat and in preparing new utensils. Therefore, they made a dairy meal, which required fewer steps. (Mishneh Berurah 494:12)

Commentators explain the verse, "Honey and milk are beneath your tongue (Shir haShirim 4:11)", to refer to Torah, which we celebrate on Shavuot. (Mishneh Berurah 494:13; and see Devarim Rabbah 7:3)

To ensure that we eat two distinct cooked foods, constituting a feast. (See Beitzah 17b) We eat a meat meal for the general mitzvah of eating meat on Yom Tov, and having a separate dairy meal will introduce a second cooked food.

According to Rama (Yoreh Deah 97:1), some people actually bake dairy bread for the dairy meal of Shavuot. Even though we are normally prohibited from having dairy bread [lest one eat it with meat], this is not a concern at the dairy meal of Shavuot, since a limited quantity is prepared, and it is consumed at a prescribed time.

D'VAR TORAH BY RABBI METZGER

Why does the positive side of the Tochacha, our covenant with G-d, begin with the verb "walk"? (Vayikra 26:3) Why does the negative side begin with "not listening"? (Vayikra 26:14)

Rabbi Shimshon Raphael Hirsch explains that walking denotes movement towards a goal. To walk is to strive towards meriting more possessions and benefits to fulfill the needs of man. A person's moral integrity depends on the purity of this effort. G-d's laws are the limits set by G-d according to His moral character and our moral destiny. Within these limits, the effort to achieve satisfaction is pure and even obligatory; but beyond these limits, it is a corruption and a crime.

Rav Hirsch continues that the absence of listening and hearing the word of God leads to leaving the Torah in action. Neglecting the study and knowledge of the Torah, leads to sin. Midrash Torat Kohanim interprets similarly, "Anyone who doesn't learn doesn't do."

There are bountiful fruit and mitzvot there for the taking. The question is how do we orient ourselves. By properly setting our goals and heading in the right direction, combined with listening to G-d's words we can reap the ultimate benefits.




