## BAYT COVID-19 Update - January 3, 2022

The Province of Ontario announced a modified return to Step Two of the Roadmap to Reopen effective 12:01AM Wednesday January 5 through January 26. This message highlights provisions relevant to BAYT (excluding changes regarding outdoor venues).

## **Capacity Limitations**

Indoor weddings, funerals, religious services, rites, and ceremonies are limited to 50% of the capacity of the room. BAYT has been operating at 50% of the capacity of each room as posted outside each room. We are pleased to announce no changes to our davening capacities. Rules regarding masks and social distancing remain unchanged and in effect.

## Organized Public Events and Social Gatherings Including Kiddushes at BAYT

All indoor food service has been suspended in Ontario. As well, indoor organized public events and social gatherings are limited to 5 or fewer people. Accordingly, BAYT must suspend all Congregational Kiddushes at least through January 22 (Parshat Yitro).

## In Person Learning at BAYT

BAYT believes provincial rules applicable to religious services, rites, and ceremonies apply to in-person learning (e.g., daf yomi). In person learning will continue at BAYT. However, no food or drink may be served or consumed at in person learning events at BAYT at least through January 26. Rules regarding room capacity, wearing of masks, and social distancing remain unchanged and in effect.

## **BAYT Youth**

Out of an abundance of caution, in person BAYT Youth programming will remain suspended as long as Ontario schools remain closed, currently through January 17. Stay tuned for details on remote BAYT Youth programming including Thursday night Mishmar and Motzei Shabbos parent-child learning.

## **Smachot at BAYT**

BAYT catering falls under provincial rules applicable to meeting and event spaces. As announced by Premier Ford, no indoor food service is permitted in meeting and event spaces at least until January 26. BAYT has no weddings scheduled for January and February due to the renovations in the main shul. BAYT must suspend all indoor catering at least through January 26.

## **BAYT Vaccination Policy Unchanged**

Ontario's proof of vaccination mandate exemption for houses of worship remains unchanged. Some members have asked us to voluntarily comply with the mandate, which we have considered. BAYT will continue to take an honour-based approach regarding vaccinations.

BAYT strongly encourages all age-eligible members to obtain two COVID-19 vaccine doses and a booster. We ask age-eligible members who choose not to vaccinate to not attend BAYT. Unvaccinated persons who are not BAYT members or guests of a BAYT member may not attend BAYT.

## Exposures or Possible Exposures to COVID-19 – Updated Isolation Requirements

The Province of Ontario advises to assume you have COVID-19 and are contagious if you have:

- any one of the following symptoms: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, decreased or loss of taste or smell; or
- <u>two or more of the following symptoms</u>: runny nose or nasal congestion, headache, extreme fatigue, sore throat, muscle aches or joint pain, or gastrointestinal symptoms such as vomiting or diarrhea.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19 or tested positive for COVID-19, <u>you</u>, <u>and anyone you live with must isolate as follows:</u>

- <u>12 years of age or older and fully vaccinated</u> Self-isolate for at least 5 days from symptom onset until symptoms have improved for 24 hours (or 48 hours if gastrointestinal symptoms) whichever is longer in duration.
- <u>Under 12 years of age regardless of vaccination status</u> Self-isolate for at least 5 days from symptom onset until symptoms have improved for 24 hours (or 48 hours if gastrointestinal symptoms) whichever is longer in duration.
- <u>12 years of age or older and partially vaccinated or unvaccinated</u> Self-isolate for 10 days from symptom onset or date of test (whichever came sooner).
- <u>Immune compromised persons (regardless of age and vaccination status)</u> Self-isolate for 10 days from symptom onset or date of test (whichever came sooner).

If you were exposed to others symptomatic of or who tested positive for COVID-19 and are fully vaccinated, have no symptoms, do not live with the positive case and are otherwise healthy:

- self-monitor for symptoms for 10 days after last exposure,
- wear a mask, practice physical distancing, and follow all public health measures, and
- do not visit any high-risk settings or people who may be at higher risk of illness (such as seniors) for 10 days after last exposure.

## President's Message:

Hopefully you and your loved ones had some well-deserved time off over the past couple of weeks (while others have something to look forward to over Yeshiva week). In my professional life, busy season comes to an end on December 15. Annette and I had a three-week holiday planned for Israel, to visit our boys, family, good friends, and a couple of business meetings. You all know what happened with that. Our staycation was nevertheless relaxing; two weeks of very little work or presidential duties.

The back to work whistle came Monday morning with Premier Ford's announcement of a modified roll back to Phase two of Ontario's reopening plan. While the changes do not affect our minyanim, Smachot and catering are once again on hold and, as you know, we decided to curtail Youth groups on Shabbat for a couple of weeks much to the chagrin of, well, everybody. One of several concerns raised was the federal requirement that children under 12 returning from outside of Canada who are not fully vaccinated have a 14-day isolation period.

While we will not have in person Youth programming this Shabbat, we are working on limited in-person Youth groups for next Shabbat. Stay tuned.

COVID means different things to different people. Some are better protected than others. Some shrug it off. Some are extremely fearful. Most are feeling a bit down and blue. While it's fair to be critical of federal, provincial, local or BAYT decisions regarding COVID, the key is to do so respectfully and constructively. No matter what the subject, someone will always object to a decision. I've written it before, there is a reason why Supreme Court opinions and even the Talmud document dissenting views. Please, more than ever, a little civility toward one another would go a long way to assuage the collective stress we all feel from COVID.

The cold weather has slowed down the roofing work but renovations in our main shul are well underway. We are waiting for our trades to begin some fairly significant plumbing work from the second-floor kitchen. We cannot clean up the Milevsky Beit Medrash until the work is complete.

We are working with RBC on our financing needs for the roof, other overdue improvement projects and to match our current leaseback payments with the life of the projects funded. Ultimately, our goal is better managed cash flows which will be reflected in our 2022 budget and our previously non-existent planned capital expenditure budget.

In 2021, we made significant progress with our internal financial management processes. Terry Rubenstein oversaw migration to QuickBooks Online (QBO) and to an online payroll processing service. We linked our ShulCloud member management software (think dues and donations) into QBO, something that was done manually in the past. We also linked our bank accounts with QBO, to better manage real time cash positions and save time on monthly reconciliations. We are going paperless shortly, scanning invoices into QBO for secure storage in the cloud rather than a filing cabinet. Thank you, Terry and Jonathan Hames, for your dedication.

Our new phone system is 99% ready to roll; just waiting for our phone number to be migrated from traditional wire to our new VOIP system. We will make our directory a regular feature in our weekly bulletin.

Well before the latest child predator scandal became headlines, Avital Sandler had been spearheading our new (and mandatory) abuse policy. It will be presented to the Board for approval later this month.

Roberta Newman has agreed to act as liaison between BAYT and Mizrachi Canada. Our Monday night Beit Medrash has been attracting well over 40 people each week with more learning in the works.

Rabbi Neil Cohen helped orchestrate two well-attended breakfast shiurim in the Simcha Suite this past Monday led by Rabbi Scheiner and Rabbi Rothbart of Kollel Ohr Yoseph. Stay tuned for our next joint program.



## **WEEKLY HALACHAH BY RABBI TORCZYNER**

Tu b'Shevat is Monday January 17. There is a custom of eating fruit, and particularly fruit associated with Israel, on this day. Here are some of the laws of reciting Shehechiyanu for new fruit:

One who sees a seasonal, newly available fruit, and feels great joy at seeing it, recites the berachah of Shehechiyanu. One whose personal joy is not that great should not recite Shehechiyanu.

## Which fruit?

Fruit which is available via import all year still warrants a Shehechiyanu when it begins to grow locally and one eats it for the first time, if the local fruit is fresher or better, inducing joy.

Fruit which is available during two distinct times of the year, with at least one month of non-availability between them, warrants Shehechiyanu when the fruit becomes available and its presence induces joy. One should avoid reciting Shehechiyanu on fruit produced via a prohibited cross-species graft. One does not recite Shehechiyanu on underripe fruit, even if it is somewhat edible. One does recite Shehechiyanu on cooked fruit.

## When?

Technically, one recites Shehechiyanu even when seeing newly available fruit. However, we generally recite Shehechiyanu only upon eating; this is when most people feel the greatest joy. We recite Shehechiyanu before reciting borei pri ha'eitz. One who eats many types of new fruit at the same sitting should recite one collective Shehechiyanu.

Note: Pre-shemitah fruit coming from Israel may require proper tithing. Shemitah fruit has rules of its own. Please consult Rabbi Korobkin for detailed information.

Why is the first commandment given to Bnei Yisrael in Egypt the commandment of the new month, Rosh Chodesh?

Rabbi Obadiah Sforno, a 16th century Italian Rabbi and physician, explains that until now Bnei Yisrael had been slaves, unable to control their own time, always being at the whim of their masters, the Egyptians. Now they are finally becoming free and able to control their own time, they are finally fully given the power to choose.

Why does the Mitzvah of Rosh Chodesh go right into the preparations for Korban Pesach?

It is not enough simply to control one's time but each person must learn how to productively use their newfound freedom. Korban Pesach and its leadup includes everyone - man, woman, and child of every age. It's not simply eating the paschal lamb, it is the effort to ensure everyone is signed up in advance, has enough meat, the animal is properly guarded from the tenth of Nissan, slaughtered, roasted, blood placed on the doorpost, and getting ready for the night of Exodus.

Each and every detail teaches us something new about how to properly utilize our freedom and time to serve G-d. Free to use our newfound time to the fullest.






