PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Three Boys

What is the first thing that comes to mind if I say, Three Boys? If my mom were alive, I'm sure her response would be her three boys, but most people would respond about Naftali Frenkel z"l, Gilad Shaer z"l and Eyal Yifrah z"l (may Hashem avenge their blood). Last week, I heard a podcast interview with Gilad's parents conducted shortly after the three boys' yahrzeit.

It brought back a lot of emotions that I experienced back then and it has had a profound impact on my life. I wanted to share some thoughts as we are entering the *bein hazmanim* period when we enjoy the summer holiday season before our children prepare for seminary and yeshiva, university, and schools.

We have overcome a lot with this pandemic and with it a lot of physical and mental stress and challenges. Every Elul gives us an opportunity to completely reset our lives in a very positive way as we prepare ourselves to take stock and renew our spirituality which ultimately is the healthiest medicine, given to us by Hashem.

Which brings me to something that has bothered me since that fateful time when we heard of their kidnapping. The news shook the four corners of the Jewish world. It gripped all spectrums of Judaism. The intensity of prayer and cohesiveness of communities throughout the world was memorable. It's not realistic to maintain that level of intensity and seriousness for any extended period. But still, I ask: How do we, as the BAYT community, take that inner intense energy and transfer it to our commitment to our *yiddishkeit*?

There is so much planning and preparation going on behind the scenes at the BAYT as we prepare for our first "normal" *Yamim Noraim* in three years and it has gotten me thinking. The way to enter into the New Year of 5783 is by preparing with a commitment to how we will return from our summer break and enter into Elul.

One of my goals as President is to ensure that we are providing the tools for our members' spiritual growth. But ultimately that dedication remains with each and every member. I can only assume that my friends are asking the same questions that I'm asking myself: Am I really learning as much Torah as I could be? Am I really going above and beyond in my commitment to *chessed* and *tzedakah* or are am I just getting by. Do I need help? Am I engaged the same way I was when our three boys were taken from us? How can I elevate my Judaism?

The first two months of my presidency have been inspiring. I'm excited about the possibilities of this beautiful community and it's one of the main reasons I stepped forward. I only ask each of you to do what I ask of myself: to step forward, take the plunge, and undertake to attend a new program, a shiur, a social event, or tefillah, that I normally would not have attended. I can't let the excuses cloud my clarity. We are blessed that the pandemic is behind us and we have life in front of us, together with friends and family, who can commit together with us.

The Mizrachi Kollel will start back up in Elul and that Beit Midrash should be full every Monday night and hopefully expand to Thursdays as well. Bring your *chevrutas*, bring your spouses, your children and friends. Bring people who have never stepped into a Beit Midrash. Bring the Beit Midrash alive. Bring your *neshama* alive. Commit to Shacharit and/or Mincha/Maariv everyday. You have no idea what you are missing. I hope women will fill the shul for Kabbalat Shabbat just as you do on Shabbat. I'm frustrated when I go to Israel and both sections of the shul are full on Friday night, men and women. And yet at the BAYT the women's section is empty. Why not at the BAYT? We now have two Daf Yomi shiurim for any morning schedule. We have daily and weekly shiurim from our rabbinic staff. Youth groups and programming are going to be running at full throttle, ready to be full. Overwhelm us with attendance.

The Ray and I want to fill each and every possible seat in our beautiful building. All that remains, is your commitment.

Have an amazing *bein hazmanim* time with your families. Take some time to reflect on your return to the BAYT with fervour. I look forward to greeting you and recapturing the passion of our *yiddishkeit* together.



Community Trustee Program



If I eat an appetizer before washing for bread, should I say a separate berachah acharonah (after-blessing) for the appetizer before washing? (Part 1)

As a general rule, one should not eat food just before a bread meal, if the berachah on bread would have covered the kind of food eaten before the meal. Eating beforehand causes an unnecessary berachah. A pre-bread course is only appropriate where eating beforehand enhances the eating experience.

In terms of a berachah acharonah for such a pre-bread course: Food eaten before a bread meal is not halachically part of the meal, and requires its own berachah acharonah.

However, this is not true if the food is connected with the meal in one of three ways:

- 1) If the food is eaten to build up appetite for the meal;
- 2) If the food is part of the meal for halachic reasons, as in the case of food eaten at a Shabbat meal between kiddush and hamotzi.
- 3) If the berachah recited before eating the pre-meal food is also intended to cover food eaten during the meal;

I intend to bring specific examples next week.

Why does Moshe repeat the Aseret HaDibrot, the Ten Commandments, in this week's Parsha?

Unlike the first time we hear about the revelation at Har Sinai in Parshat Yitro which details all the events leading up to and the preparations for it, this time in chapter 5 it begins very differently. Moshe begins by telling them to listen to the Mitzvot and the Brit, Covenant, that we have with G-d (5:1-2).

Moshe is speaking to the first generation of people who didn't experience Har Sinai personally. Moshe's central point is "not with our ancestors did G-d make this covenant but with us, the living, we who are here today" (Devarim 5:3). G-d spoke to YOU face to face from within the fire (5:4).

The challenge of each successive generation since Har Sinai is how do we connect back to that moment. Moshe anticipates this question telling us that we are going about it all wrong. Each of us was there even if not physically. What do we do today to relive the Har Sinai experience?




