

Erev Shavuot- Thursday, May 28th

- Eruv Tavshilin
- Candle lighting is at 8:32pm
- Mincha should be recited before Shkia (sunset), which is at 8:50pm

First Night of Shavuot- Thursday Night, May 28th

- Maariv for Yom Tov with Shavuot insertions
- Maariv should not be recited before Tzeis HaKochavim, which is at 9:33pm
- Kiddush for Yom Tov with Shehechyanu
- Tikkun Leil Shavuot- Shavuot Night Learning

First Day of Shavuot- Friday, May 29th

- Earliest time for Tallis is Misheyakir: 4:41am
- One who stayed up the entire night should reach Shemoneh Esrei at Sunrise: 5:40am
- Berachos for one who stayed up entire night:
 - The beracha of Netillas Yadayim may be said when washing one's hands (with a cup) after using the washroom, provided that it's after Alos HaShachar (4:10am)
 - The beracha on Tallis may be said. If someone does not wear a tallis and wants to fulfill the beracha on tzitzis, he can hear the beracha from someone who wears a tallis *or* can switch to a different pair of tzitzis and recite the beracha.
 - The berachos of Elokai Neshama and Hama'avir Sheina are usually recited by someone who slept on behalf of those who did not sleep. If nobody is available to recite those berachos, they are omitted. In such a situation, one should have in mind to fulfill the beracha of Elokai Neshama when reciting the

beracha of Mechaye HaMeisim in Shemoneh Esrei. If a member of the house wakes up before the learner who stayed up the whole night goes to sleep, that person can recite these two berachos for the learner

- If one slept on Thursday afternoon, one may recite Birchos HaTorah. If not, one can listen to the berachos from someone who slept. If nobody is available to recite these berachos, one should have in mind to fulfill these berachos when reciting Ahavah Rabbah. If one fulfills these berachos with Ahavah Rabbah, one should learn some Torah after davening (reading the Torah portion after Hallel would count).

- If one slept for a half hour at night, even in the course of learning, one may recite all of the berachos.

- Birchos Kerias Shema begin with המאיר לארץ
- Latest time to recite Shema: 9:27am
- Latest Shacharis Shemoneh Esrei: 10:43am
- Shacharis Shemoneh Esrei for Yom Tov with insertions for Shavuot, followed by full Hallel
- Laining: בחדש השלישי - Shemos 19:1-20:23
Maftir: וביום הבכורים - Bamidbar 28:26-31
Haftarah: Yechezkel 1:1-28, 3:12.
- While there is no requirement to recite Akdamos when davening at home, one is permitted to do so.
- Kah Keli is not recited without a minyan
- Mussaf Shemoneh Esrei for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Shavuot
- Shir Shel Yom for Friday

5780/2020 BAYT SHAVUOS ZMANIM & DAVENING OVER SHAVUOS



- Earliest time to daven Mincha: 1:54pm
- Mincha Shemoneh Esrei for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shavuos.
- *For those making early Shabbos:*
 - Mincha should be recited before Plag HaMincha, which is at 7:16pm. One may not accept Shabbos before this time.
 - After 7:16pm, the candles may be lit and davening for the Second Night of Shavuos/Shabbos may begin (see below)
- *For those making regular Shabbos:*
 - Candle lighting must take place no later than 8:33pm. After this time, all of the Shabbos laws are in effect.
 - Mincha should be recited before Shkia (sunset), which is at 8:51pm.
- The beracha for candle lighting is להדליק נר של שבת ויום טוב

Second Night of Shavuos- Friday Night, May 29th

- Abridged *קבלת שבת* is recited- begin with *מזמור שיר ליום השבת*. We omit *מדליקין*.
- We recite both *ושמרו* and *וידבר*
- Maariv Shemoneh Esrei for Yom Tov, with proper insertions for Shavuos and Shabbos.
- Vayechulu is recited after Shemoneh Esrei, followed by Aleinu.
- Kiddush for Yom Tov with proper Shabbos insertions. Kiddush begins with *יום הששי*. Shehechyanu is recited.



Second Day of Shavuos- Shabbos, May 30th

- Birchos Kerias Shema begin with *הכל יודוך* followed by *ק-ל אדון*.
- Latest time for reciting Shema: 9:27am
- Latest Shacharis Shemoneh Esrei: 10:43am
- Shacharis Shemoneh Esrei for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Shavuos and Shabbos, followed by full Hallel
- Megillas Rus is traditionally recited at this point. The custom to read Megillas Rus was instituted for a congregation. Nonetheless, one may read Rus without a congregation.
- Laining: *עשר תעשר* (Devarim 14:22-16:17) Maftir: *וביום הבכורים* (Bamidbar 28:26-31) Haftarah: Chabakuk 2:20-3:19. One may recite Yetziv Pisgam (though not required).
- Kah Keli is not recited without a minyan
- Yizkor may be recited without a minyan.
- Av HaRachamim should be recited (even if one does not recite Yizkor).
- Mussaf for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shavuos and Shabbos.
- Shir Shel Yom for Shabbos
- Earliest time to daven Mincha: 1:54pm
- Mincha for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shavuos and Shabbos.
- Shkia (sunset) is at 8:52pm. Mincha should be recited before Shkia.
- Shalosh Seudos should begin before Shkia.

Motzei Shabbos

- Weekday Shemoneh Esrei (Ata Chonantanu)
- *ויהי נועם* is recited.
- Kiddush Levanah (weather permitting)
- Shabbos/Shavuos ends at 9:37pm
- Standard Havdalah for Motzei Shabbos

Weekly Halachah - R' Mordechai Torczyner – torczyner@torontotorah.com

When minyanim resume, will we be obligated to make up all of the Torah readings we have missed? There has been great disagreement about this question. Aside from the shortcomings of the human attention span and the safety of being in close proximity to other people for an extended time, it is unclear that such a make-up is even necessary.

Four reasons are offered for exemption from all or part of the missed readings:

- 1) The weekly Torah reading may be considered a communal obligation, and not a personal one. Therefore, if no minyan met on Shabbat, then there was no obligation to read.
- 2) Each Shabbat is linked to a designated reading, so that when a minyan is restored, we do not have any obligation to read the missed readings.
- 3) The weekly Torah reading was designed for only one or two Torah portions. Therefore, the maximum number of portions to be read on a given Shabbat is two.
- 4) The Torah reading for a particular Shabbat is linked to just one chumash, and not the entire Torah. Therefore, one may not read from more than one chumash of a particular Sefer Torah.

Classically, all four of these points have been debated. Today's halachic authorities continue this debate, and so:

- ♦ Sephardi Chief Rabbi Yitzchak Yosef, and Kollel Eretz Hemdah, believe that we reject all of the aforementioned exemptions and limitations. Shuls are obligated to make up the missed readings, even across chumashim.
- ♦ Rabbi Yosef Zvi Rimon, Rav of Alon Shvut South, contends that we are obligated to make up missed readings, and that we may read more than two portions on a Shabbat. However, he supports the fourth point, that we may not read from more than one chumash.
- ♦ Rabbi Hershel Schachter states that shuls may rely on the lenient views and not make up the missed readings, but those who wish to make them up may do so – even by spreading them out over multiple Shabbatot. The rule which permits adding aliyot on Shabbat also permits adding unnecessary readings. However, we may not read from more than one chumash of a particular Sefer Torah.
- ♦ Rabbi Asher Weiss believes that shuls must rely on the lenient views and not make up the readings; he contends that a minyan may not perform unnecessary readings.

On behalf of the outgoing Executive and Board of Governors I want to wish you and your families a safe and healthy Shavuot. It is hard to believe that we have been in lock down since just after Purim, and it is amazing what our Rabbis and office team as well as many volunteers have done in terms of online classes, shiurim, programs as well as volunteering to do shopping and calling members in particular our seniors.

The shul throughout these weeks has exemplified an important message of Shavuot, that of Chesed - of loving kindness which is very much the theme of Megillat Ruth, and we have to thank Rabbi Korobkin for his leadership, who together with Rabbi Spitz have spearheaded this amazing response. Sadly we remain closed for Shavuot, even for services in the parking lot, and will do so until the Emergency Regulations are lifted. Currently they are in place until June 9. We ask you to pay attention to the continuing requirements set down by the Government, in particular that no large gatherings are permitted, and that groups are limited to a maximum of FIVE people only, and of course continue to practice social distancing when out and about.

At our last Board Meeting in April, the Board approved the establishment of a task force to advise the Executive and the Board on the measures that will be needed to deal with the financial challenges facing the shul. The task force under the leadership of Chuck English comprised nine shul members with deep financial, legal management and communal experience. They have recommended a number of proposals that are being reviewed by the Executive and the Board, and the steps that will need to be taken in the coming months that will set the priorities for the incoming Board and Executive who will take office on June 7. I want to thank Chuck and the members of the Task Force for their diligence and devotion in producing such a comprehensive and detailed document in 3 weeks that will be the blueprint for securing the long term sustainability of the shul. Full details of the plan will be shared with the Kehilla in the coming weeks.

I want to thank the outgoing members of the Executive and Board who will be stepping down after giving of their time and energy to the many facets of shul life they have been involved with. A new Board and Executive will take office on June 7 at the AGM, and with the many challenges facing the world in general and the Jewish Community in particular, I am sure you will join me in wishing them well in their deliberations, and in taking the actions needed to secure the long term future of the shul.

The shul has risen to the many challenges posed by the pandemic, and going forward, as I have indicated, we have major decisions to make, but this is no different to any shul or Jewish Communal organisation in Canada and elsewhere. Together as a Kehilla and the wider Jewish Community we can meet the challenges facing us, and hopefully soon we can look forward to being together in Shul to celebrate simchas, as well as being able to comfort each other in times of sadness.


