According to Ramban, constructing the Mishkan was the plan G-d had in mind and how the Mishkan would serve to direct the Jews in their serving G-d.

The Jews have just gone through the awe-inspiring and life-changing experience of Har Sinai and receiving the Ten Commandments from G-d and are eagerly seeking a way to express how they feel towards G-d. This ability to donate items that will be used in the construction of the Mishkan, of G-d's mobile Temple, is more important than the construction itself and therefore comes first. They are given a validating and constructive way to act on their shared revelation and experiences in a way to get closer to G-d.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Parsha Terumah is somewhat mechanical. An instruction manual to build the Mishkan and assemble its accoutrements. Once again, Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, z'l, brought out a hidden lesson. Building the Mishkan required the collaborative and precise efforts of the Jewish people. Moshe's role? Be the good leader. To inspire the people. In this instance, to build the Mishkan.

The Shul Presidency has no instruction manual. And unlike Moshe, a synagogue President has no Bat-phone upstairs, although he calls out to Him often.

This week, a member sent me a heartfelt note surprised I did not attend Shiva or send a note. My respect and admiration for this member is such that had we been able to have shiva minyanim, I would have attended more than once. I saved the announcement in my inbox but it quickly made its way to the bottom before I did anything. I am grateful this member reached out. I blew it and feel terrible.

Perhaps my inaction was subliminal. Back in Boston, my 86 year-old Mom and her wonderful husband Harvey remain independent and in good health, B'H. We chat almost every day but have not seen each other since the end of 2019. Mom and Harvey don't know from Amazon let alone Zoom, FaceTime or Skype.

My Mom taught me how to stand for something. In grade 5 public school, I complained to the teacher if she wanted us to sing Christmas songs, we needed to sing Hanukkah songs as well. She made me stay after school. To sing her Christmas songs. My Mom made sure that never happened again for any kid.

Once the pandemic is over, Gd willing, our first stop will be to Mom and Harvey back in Boston. Each of us have our pandemic awfulness. This is mine. Something I talk about with Rabbi Korobkin; he too has older parents back in LA.

A couple of weeks ago, I promised to share some of my experiences with you about working with Rabbi Korobkin. The relationship between a shul and its Rabbi is inherently complex. A Kehillah counts on its Rabbi to lead, to teach and to inspire. And a Rabbi needs to be able to count on his Kehillah, through its lay leaders, to be open and honest in their interactions.

My parents taught me the value of hard work. I am not exactly lazy. But it can be hard to keep up with our Rav. He sets high expectations. On any given day, I wake up to a message from Rabbi Korobkin, sent before 6AM. Or I go to sleep having hung up the phone with him at 10:30. An issue with a minyan. A member needing life cycle counselling. A community crisis. An adult education program idea. A President who forgot to layn tefillin for the very first time since he started over 20 years ago. Or someone complaining about the President.

Chances are when you do not see Rabbi Korobkin in shul or on-line, he is doing what Rabbis do, working one on one with our members. The best of it includes new babies, engagements, marriages and other nachas. But our community is not immune to the socio-economic and psychological difficulties of the pandemic you see on TV. And our community counts on Rabbi Korobkin.

We know our Kehillah needs an assistant rabbi (or two or three). Our young families need it. Our seniors need it. Rabbi Korobkin needs it. Our search committee is making progress on this front. Until then, please know Rabbi Korobkin is doing his best.

As a not so typical ba'al teshuva, my rabbinic needs likely differ from yours. But as President my needs subordinate to your needs. When I hear from you, regardless of what I may think, it is incumbent for me to share your good and bad feedback with Rabbi Korobkin. And I do. And we talk about it and act if need be. Rabbi Korobkin and I are straight up with one another, well aware our members deserve nothing less. Two strong-minded fifty-somethings don't always see eye to eye. Yet we respectfully take each other's two cents to heart with the best interests of the Kehillah as our common goal.

This job is hard. The pay stinks. But the genuineness of that shiva message and the privilege of working with Rabbi Korobkin day in and day out are just two of many great fringe benefits.

Discuss with your children how important it is to not delay the opportunity to do an act of Chesed or Tzedakah. Does a mourner send or receive Mishloach Manot?

Sending: Even though the mitzvah of sending mishloach manot is joyous, a mourner is still obligated to send them, and even during shivah. However, the mourner should not send items like wine and special delicacies, which involve extra joy.

Receiving: One should not send to someone who is within the periods of required mourning for a parent or other relative r"l. However, a mourner who receives mishloach manot is not required to refuse them. One may send to a mourner's immediate family members, where the sender has a relationship with them.

One may send to a needy mourner as a form of tzedakah. Also, one may send to a mourner who holds a professional position in which it is expected that people will send mishloach manot as a means of support.

May we know happy occasions.

Assistant Rabbi Search Committee: Status Report #2

The Assistant Rabbi Search Committee (ARSC) is pleased to provide the Kehila an update on the search process. We have had a very significant interest from a broad spectrum of candidates for this position.

- ⇒ We have reviewed 18 resumes to date.
- ⇒ We have completed 1st interviews with 6 candidates.
- ⇒ We have completed 2nd interviews with 4 of these candidates.
- ⇒ We will bring 3 finalists to the Shul for "Probahs" – see below

Timeline:

- March – Probah – 3 candidates
- April- June – selection of the finalist
- High Holidays 2021 - The successful candidate will begin his tenure

Probah:

What's a Probah?

- ⇒ A Yiddish term for "tryout", often used in searches for Rabbis. Traditionally, the candidates are invited to the Shul and spend a Shabbat as Scholar in Residence while getting to meet members of the Kehila. Due to the Covid -19 pandemic, we will be hosting the 3 finalists in 'virtual Probahs'.

When will we have these Probahs?

- ⇒ The Probahs will take place on March 8, 9,10

What will a virtual Probah look like?

- ⇒ The candidate Rabbi will spend various parts of the day and evening giving shiurim, lectures, and a Drasha. There will also be a "meet the Rabbi & family" session.
- ⇒ A full schedule will be provided as we get closer to the Probahs. For now, **please reserve the evenings of March 8, 9, 10 for these important events.**

Sweet & Sour Safe Haven:

The WWII Jewish Refugees Experience in Shanghai

Unlike many other places throughout the world, Shanghai kept its port open to Jewish refugees escaping Nazi persecution. 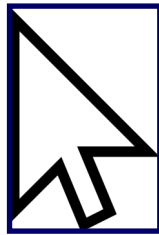

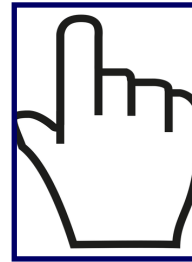

D'VAR TORAH FOR PARSHAS TERUMAH

In this week's Parshah, Moshe Rabenu gets instructions on how to build a special sort of "house" for Hashem. This building was called the mishkan. This is where Hashem settled and where the Jews were able to perform korbanot to Hashem.

In the mishkan they had a shulchan (a special table) a mizbayach and a menorah. In the kodesh Kedoshim there was an ahron.

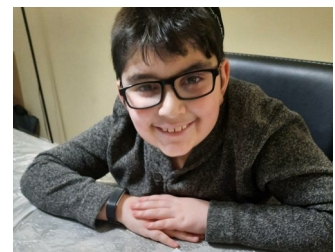
The Mishkan traveled with Beni Yisroel in the dessert. Everything in the mishkan had rings attached to it so they can add poles to it to carry.

Now-a-days we don't have korbanot, and the house of Hashem is our shuls. The Mishkan was very important and had to be taken care of well.

It's important to know how special it is that we have a shul. A shul is called a, בֵּית־כְּנֶסֶת (Beit Knesset), the , בֵּית־הַמִּקְדָּשׁ (Beit HaMikdash) has the name beit in it. A place to learn torah is called a , בֵּית־מִדְרָשׁ (Beit Midrash.) They all have Beit in it. We see the key to all of them is Bayt, בַּיִת home.

So when we go to shul we are going home to our Bayt. We learn from here how important our shuls are.

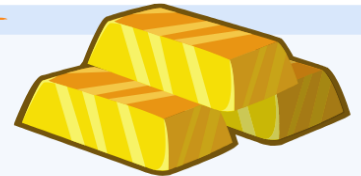
