"Joy of the Mishkan"

How were the Jewish People feeling upon finishing constructing the Mishkan, the Tabernacle?

In last week's parasha, the Jewish People made a grave error in worshipping the Golden Calf. A great rift was formed between them and G-d. Moshe Rabbeinu had to plead with G-d on their behalf in order for G-d to give them another chance. In the intervening several months, the entire nation has been working to construct a new home for G-d, the Mishkan. They weren't only working on the physical aspects of G-d's new home and mobile Temple, but were also rebuilding their relationship with G-d.

Upon completion of this monumental task, our Sages (Shemot Rabbah 47:1) tell us that this moment was as joyous as a wedding day. In fact, "on the day of his nuptials and on the day of the joy of his heart" in Song of Songs 3:11 refers to the immense feelings of joy and celebration that were felt when G-d dwelled amongst the Jewish People.

May we all merit one day soon to rebuild the Beit Hamikdash, G-d's Temple, and experience this great joy once again.

BAYT COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

The BAYT COVID-19 Committee asks all members to adhere to the following health and safety protocols.

Signing Up for a Minyan at BAYT

All members who wish to attend a minyan at BAYT, must sign up in advance via SignUp Genius. Our minyanim are open to members only. If you are a family member, please only sign up people from your household. You may be denied entrance to BAYT if you have not signed up for a minyan via SignUp Genius.

When you sign up to attend a minyan at BAYT, you expressly agree to strictly follow BAYT's COVID-19 protocols. Other shuls' protocols are not relevant to your decision to attend a minyan at BAYT.

If you no longer satisfy BAYT's COVID-19 protocols after signing up for a minyan, please cancel your sign up and do not attend minyan.

While Attending a Minyan at BAYT

Over Purim and our first re-opened Shabbat, we noted the following items that merit your extra attention when you are at BAYT:

- Do not congregate with others during or after davening. Yes, we all want to catch up with others but the public health situation is still fluid. Come to BAYT to daven and, no offence, please leave quietly.
- Do not crowd when leaving BAYT. Please leave the building single file and socially distanced 2 metres apart. Once outside BAYT, please walk away from the doors so others can leave quickly and safely.
- Avoid touching doors and door handles. Interior doors through which you need to pass are open. Please do not touch the doors, as you may cause them to close. If a door is closed, please let the facilities staff know.
- Sit in designated, distanced seating. In the main shul, sit only in seats marked with green tape. Do not move chairs around in other minyanim.

When Not To Sign Up for or Attend a Minyan at BAYT

Please do not sign up for a minyan or enter the BAYT if:

1. you or a "close contact" are awaiting a COVID test result;
2. you have been in "close contact" with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or who has any symptoms of COVID-19;
3. you have been in "close contact" with anyone who is in self-isolation. This includes anyone (even if asymptomatic) who lives in your household including children who have to self-isolate because of a COVID-19 case in school or a carpool;
4. you have been outside of Canada within the past 14 days;
5. you have been around others (e.g., workplace, other minyan or gathering) and did not practice proper social distancing and/or masking, even once, within the past 14 days; or
6. you are feeling unwell or have any acute illness, even if you or your doctor do not believe you have COVID-19.

Who is a "Close Contact"?

A "close contact" includes someone:

1. with whom you have been within 2 metres for more than 10 minutes;
2. who lives in your household or provides care to you;
3. with whom you have had close physical contact including a handshake, or
4. who accidentally coughed, sneezed or spit on you while talking with you.

If you or a "close contact" have any common symptoms of COVID-19 (see below), please get a COVID test, STAY HOME, self-isolate and advise "close contacts" with whom you were in close physical contact with in the prior 48 hours to monitor their health and to self isolate. Do not sign up for a minyan.

According to the Ontario Ministry of Health, common symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- fever (feeling hot to the touch, a temperature of 37.8 degrees Celsius or higher)
- Chills
- cough that's new or worsening (continuous, more than usual)
- barking cough, making a whistling noise when breathing (croup)
- shortness of breath (out of breath, unable to breathe deeply)

- sore throat
- difficulty swallowing
- runny, stuffy or congested nose (not related to seasonal allergies or other known causes or conditions)
- lost sense of taste or smell
- pink eye (conjunctivitis)
- headache that's unusual or long lasting
- digestive issues (nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain)
- muscle aches
- extreme tiredness that is unusual (fatigue, lack of energy)
- falling down often
- for young children and infants: sluggishness or lack of appetite.

If you really have to think about it, you should stay home.

Report Illness and Positive COVID Test Results to BAYT Immediately

If you attended a minyan at BAYT, please let us know immediately if you receive a positive COVID-19 test result or if you have symptoms of COVID-19 and are awaiting a test result. Let us know if, after receiving a positive COVID-19 test result, you subsequently receive a positive result for a variant of concern (VOC).

Realistic Expectations

COVID-19 is in our community. Whenever you leave your home, you increase your exposure to COVID-19 and VOCs. That BAYT may advise our members of new COVID cases at BAYT should not come as a surprise.

You could get COVID-19 in a supermarket and won't know from who. If you practice social distancing and are properly masked while at BAYT, you should not be a "close contact" with others while at BAYT. This would include a person who may report a positive COVID test to us. Nevertheless, we ask those who report positive COVID-19 tests to us if they were in "close contact" with others while at BAYT.

BAYT will notify York Public Health of all positive COVID cases brought to our attention. In the event of two or more positive COVID test results among attendees of one minyan at BAYT, York Public Health could declare a legal "outbreak." In such event, York Public Health may mandate ALL persons in attendance self-isolate for 14 days, even those who practiced proper social distancing and masking.

How should we dispose of the dishes after our meals on Shabbat which is Erev Pesach?

One should prepare all of the Shabbat food from Kosher for Pesach materials, with Pesach equipment, and serve it with disposable dishes or on Pesach dishes.

One who is using actual bread for *lechem mishneh* should eat the bread at the start of the meal, appropriately distanced from any Pesach surfaces or utensils, then clean up and destroy all crumbs (as explained in the Weekly Halachah for Parshat Tetzaveh), and only afterward continue the meal.

As we noted last week, Rabbi Korobkin encourages use of egg matzah for *lechem mishneh* this year. This would make matters even easier, as any remains of egg matzah may be kept in the household compost or trash during Pesach.

Note that one may not wash dishes on Shabbat for use after Shabbat.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This Shabbat marks the yahrtzeit of BAYT's first President, Albert Silverman z'l. He was one of the first to welcome me at BAYT. Once, after returning from a consulting project in Malaysia, Albert proudly yet sadly told me the story of how their Israeli supplier had to relabel its state-of-the-art equipment to hide the country of origin. Proud because Albert was a Zionist. Sad because that relabelling was contrary to Albert's very essence.

When Annette and I attended Albert's shiva, we sat with Susan and Jeffrey. I simply lost it. It was not as though Albert was my best friend. But his passing affected me more than I had realized. This was a tzaddik. And it was his bereaved, Susan, who consoled me proving once again that behind every good man is a great woman.

A plaque commemorating Albert's yahrtzeit and service to the very Kehillah he helped establish hangs above the President's shtender. Every Shabbat when I daven my Shemona Esrei, that plaque reminds me to aspire to Albert's high standards of goodness, integrity, and service. More than once, I have quietly teared up right in front of you reflecting on Albert and his innumerable fine virtues.

Perhaps unacknowledged or unknown to many, this past Monday commemorated International Women's Day. Please, take a moment to acknowledge the great women in our lives in merit of Albert's neshama and in honour of Susan Silverman.

Pesach fast approaches, this year a Shabbat and two-day Yom Tov. Lots of work and planning. If you are as useless in the house as me, why not ask your spouse how you can be of greater assistance. And when you do that, ask what else you can do, even beyond Pesach.

Everything I am able to accomplish is only because of my wife, Annette. In proverbial "is the glass is half-full or half-empty" jargon, I am a half empty glass without Annette.

For some of us, our wives are the ones that have kept our families above-water during the pandemic. Sacrificing her aspirations to manage new responsibilities you and I shy away from or just cannot do as well. Home school teacher and lunch lady. Home summer camp counsellor and kitchen staff. And throughout the pandemic, when only men could participate in a minyan, our wives stayed behind with another new responsibility, home youth group leader.

Women are often the unsung heroes of our careers, our homes, and our community. Let us all sing Aishes Chayil and follow up with gratitude and deeds that would make Albert proud.

Have a safe and still (i.e., do not stop) socially distant Shabbat.

BAYT COVID-19 Committee

Dear Members:

Some of you have made clear, and we understand, your displeasure with our protocol for households with children and/or family members returning to or entering Canada from abroad. Today, we spent a lot of time voicing your concerns to our contacts at York Public Health and Toronto's Kol HaCovid committee. This is a synopsis of what they told us.

Federal law is clear. Every traveller returning to Canada must quarantine for 14 days whether arriving by air or road, whether they have been vaccinated, had a COVID infection or a negative COVID test result. Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) advises all travellers upon entry to Canada that they must completely isolate during their 14 day quarantine period from anybody else in their household. If complete isolation is not possible, they are advised that other household members must also quarantine for the entire 14 days.

It may seem absurd that 14 day self isolation applies to travellers returning to Canada from Israel (of all places) or the United States who are fully vaccinated. Yes, a vaccinated individual has a lower risk of contracting COVID. But public health studies are inconclusive that vaccinated individuals cannot transmit COVID. As well, significant uncertainty exists over the effectiveness of approved vaccines against a growing number of variants of concern (VOC). 40% of all positive COVID cases in Ontario today were VOCs. From a public health perspective, risks remain definite and with significant consequences. Indeed, Kol HaCovid told us a number of students in the Jewish community returning to Ontario from the United States carried a VOC that has already spread to others in our community. In summary:

- No approved vaccine is 100% effective at this time.
- Ontario and Canada are long ways away from herd immunity.
- Whether approved vaccines actually prevent transmission of COVID or VOCs is not yet confirmed.
- Real uncertainties remain as to the effectiveness of approved vaccines against VOCs.

BAYT would be contravening public health guidelines to adjust our protocol for households with children and/or family members returning to or entering Canada from abroad at this time. Until further notice, it remains as follows:

If you have children or family members returning to or entering Canada from abroad who are or will be in mandatory 14 day self-isolation in your household, please do not sign up for or attend a minyan at BAYT unless those children and/or family members are completely isolated from the rest of your household for the entirety of the 14 days quarantine period. This applies even if he/she has been vaccinated, had a COVID infection or a negative COVID test.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

KAREN'S KORNER : PARSHAS HACHODESH – PREPARING FOR PESACH: TRUE TEAMWORK

How can we make Pesach cleaning fun and enjoyable? One idea is to set the tone with upbeat music in the background. Moreover, assign age-appropriate cleaning assignments, and have a family meeting and explain to the children: We are all a TEAM and if we work together we'll accomplish more than if we work apart.

Here are some ways to make the experience more enjoyable for you AND your children:

- Take before and after pictures of the area to be cleaned, so that your children will feel a sense of accomplishment for a job well done.
- In one room, hide some loonies and toonies and let them know the total amount of coins you've hidden for them.
- In another room, you can hide lottery ticket scratchers and do the same.
- In another room, find some cute jokes, print them out on small slips of paper, and hide them.
- In another room, write small notes to your children letting them know how much you appreciate their hard work and how much you love them.
- In another room, hide new toothbrushes that will be theirs to use for Pesach. You can also hide little toys: slinkies, action figures, dolls, etc.
- Ask everyone in your family to guess how long it will take to clean a particular room. Then, set a timer and say, "Go!" Whoever gets the closest time to how long it actually took will win the bigger prize.

Keep in mind that our energy as parents is contagious; the more excitement and enthusiasm we display about the Pesach prep experience, the more our children will share in that excitement and enthusiasm.




