Our Torah portion this week is called *Shemini*.

Our *sedra* describes the untimely death of Aaron's two sons Nadav and Avihu. Tradition holds that they lost their lives after intentionally becoming inebriated while officiating as religious leaders offering sacrifices on behalf of the Jewish people. Our sages take special note of Aaron's response in recording:



"*vayidom Aharon, and Aaron was silent*"

Silence is one way in dealing with loss.

As I write these words on Yom Hashoah v"n Hagvurah on Holocaust Remembrance Day, I am reminded that for far too long we have emulated Aaron's silence when combatting injustices and atrocities that have befallen our people. Enough is enough.

How thankful we are that we live in a time and place where we no longer are required to be silent in the face of an inhumane world.

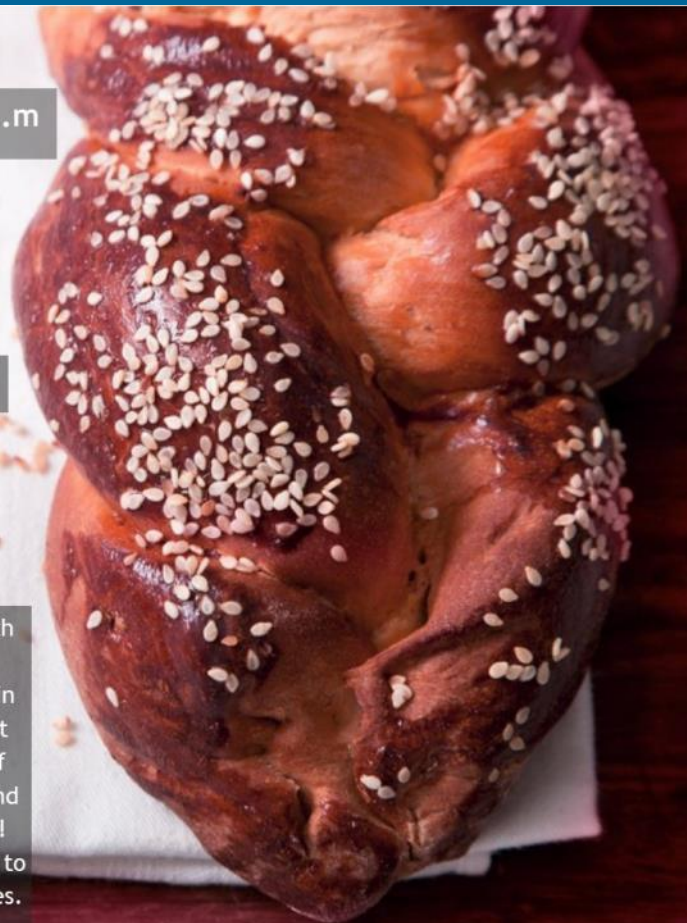

Parking for Beit Rayim congregants is free on Shabbat and Yom Tov.


