The second of our two Torah portions this week find G-d commanding us: “*Kedoshim tihyehu*—you shall be holy.” And so, comes the next question. What does that mean ... what does the work “holy” signify?



When you hear the word “holy” what immediately comes to mind? Something spiritual, something sacred, something related to G-d. And that’s what Wikipedia tells us: “Holiness originates in G-d and is communicated to things, places, times and persons engaged in His Service.”

Our Torah portion which begins with the words, “You are holy,” goes on to list a whole series of commandments that relate to our behaviour with each other. That is where holiness must be found.

May we all treat others the way we would wanted to be treated ourselves and hence achieve great levels of holiness.




