Dear Friends,

As many of you know, I took my second of three months of Sabbatical from December 6th to January 14th. I want to share with you a little bit of what I did during my time away, but before I do, I want to thank the leaders of our congregation for allowing me this sacred time. I also want to thank my incredible partners at Temple — the Clergy and staff — who so ably led the congregation while I was gone.

I focused on three areas during this phase of my Sabbatical:

- Recording a new album of original music
- Writing and composing new music and poetry
- Spending quality time with family



During the first half of my time away, I travelled to Scottsdale, AZ to record with my friend and producer, Scott Leader. Scott may be familiar to many of you as one third of the dynamic musical trio, *Sababa*. (The other two members are Robbi Sherwin and our very own Steve Brodsky.) It has been 18 years since my last album of original music was released. Even though I have not been in the studio, I have not stopped writing. One of the most difficult aspects of this new project was deciding which pieces made the cut. I finally narrowed it down to about 25 songs (from over 50 possibilities)– which in and of itself is a large number. In addition, not all the music I have written is exclusively “Jewish.” There are elements of jazz, rock n’ roll, blues and even a bit of flamenco in the mix. Digital recording is a very complicated process. While in Scottsdale, I recorded most of the guitar and vocal tracks that will form the “bones” of each song. The next step will be adding additional vocals, instruments and fine-tuning the audio mix. I am eagerly looking forward to sharing this new project with all of you when it is finished — hopefully before the High Holy Days.

In addition to recording, I also took advantage of this time to write a few new songs, some poetry and catch up on reading and correspondence.

Sue and I also were able to take some quality time together — skiing, visiting friends and just enjoying each other’s company. As much as I love being a rabbi, the demands of the position often mean that the days are long — leaving little family time. This time away was truly a blessing.

I returned from my Sabbatical refreshed, renewed and eager to get back to the sacred work of my rabbinate and Temple Emanuel. Thank you again for this gift.

Gathering for Laughter

An old Yiddish proverb teaches us that "What soap is to the body, laughter is to the soul." Our Jewish tradition has a healthy history of valuing laughter and play alongside our more serious endeavors. While we feel the weight of the world and the responsibility to engage in its repair, we also understand that levity and joy are necessary interludes — to ease our anxieties, bolster our relationships, and give our minds the space to grow.

Each year, the holiday of Purim pushes us to recognize the important truth of the value of laughter and frivolity. Coming almost exactly six Jewish months after the depths of Yom Kippur — our most serious day — Purim stands as crucial opposite pole in our Jewish liturgical year. Can we muster just as much energy to gather for laughter as we did for our High Holy Days? Can we elevate the need for joyous pause in the midst of all that swirls around us?

This year, we are celebrating Purim in two gatherings — on Sunday, March 13th with our Religious School families and on Wednesday, March 16th (actual Erev Purim) with our Adult Community. We are extraordinarily grateful and excited to gather in person again this year. We will surely laugh and smile together as we watch our children play at our Purim Carnival and enjoy our Disney's Frozen Purim Spiel — featuring our very talented Temple Emanuel Teens! As an Adult Community, we will have the opportunity to gather in community in person — to laugh together as we read from the Megillah and to learn together in a variety of teaching sessions led by the clergy. We cannot wait to simply celebrate each other.

In the middle of an otherwise very serious section of Talmud, the text relates the following story:

Two brothers came to the marketplace. Looking at them, one rabbi said to another, "These two brothers have a share in the world to come." One Rabbi went over to the brothers and said to them, "What is your occupation?" They responded, "We are jesters and we cheer up the depressed. In addition, when we see two people fighting, we strive to make peace between them." It is said that for this behavior, they enjoyed a large reward in the world to come.

As we continue navigate our often heavy world, let us remember to leave room for the laughter.

Temple Emanuel + JFS: Working together to resettle 100 Refugees from Afghanistan

The Denver Jewish Community has begun the process of welcoming hundreds of Afghan refugees. We have a rich history — as Jews and as Temple members — of participating in this work, and again, our country and our tradition are calling on us to reach out our arms in welcome. That tradition teaches us at least 36 times in the Torah that we are to welcome the stranger.

There are many ways to participate in the nationwide effort to resettle hundreds of thousands of Afghans who have fled their homes in search of safety. Colorado has committed to resettling 2,000 of these individuals. Jewish Family Services of Colorado has applied for and been granted temporary Afghan Refugee Resettlement Agency status and will be working to settle 100 individual refugees arriving in Colorado.

Temple Emanuel is ready to help, and has committed to leveraging our considerable network of community members and resources in order to support the JFS effort. Because we know that "welcoming the stranger" means learning and providing what THEY need, rather than giving them what we need to give, we are so grateful to our Afghan Resettlement Project lead volunteers, Deb Herman, Lori Kalata and Sherry Stark, who are deeply invested in understanding the scope of what we can do to be most helpful.

We look forward to sharing in the generosity and creativity of our temple community, and know we can count on you to help.

CONTRIBUTING:

Housing: The most important and pressing need right now is housing. As these families continue to arrive in Denver, we are facing a critical shortage in available and affordable housing, exacerbated by the Marshall fire and the need to temporarily resettle so many families whose homes were destroyed. JFS is seeking landlords or any people with connections in this area to help identify available, affordable housing units. Housing must be individual dwelling units (e.g., apartments, condos, houses) and not space within our homes (i.e., no renting out the spare bedroom or finished basement). If you own properties or have any connections to properties and might be able to help, please contact Rabbi Hyatt immediately at hyatt@emanueldenver.org.

Funds: JFS currently has just over 50 new Afghan people here in transitional housing with more arriving each week, many of whom left Afghanistan without clothes or personal possessions. Thus, money is needed immediately to address these needs. You can donate through Temple Emanuel and 100% of funds will go directly to JFS for resettlement efforts.

By-Law Amendment-Danny Foster

A Bylaw amendment is necessary to maintain leadership of the Cemetery Committee and all the projects they have in the works including cemetery plots, design, water issues and we need Ken Fellman to continue to help us in this process. Thus the Board of Trustees put forth a change to the Bylaws as set before:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the bylaws of the Organization are hereby amended effective immediately as follows:

1. Article IV, Section 3.C.3 is amended in its entirety to read as follows:
3. No elected voting Trustee who has served two (2) consecutive terms shall be eligible for a third consecutive term, except the President and the President elect and any currently serving officer, who shall be eligible for additional consecutive years as necessary to fulfill the ascendancy of office, as delineated in Article V below as long as he or she continues to serve as an officer. Notwithstanding the foregoing, each year, the President of the Board of the Organization may, with the approval of a majority vote of the Board, and majority vote of the Congregation, extend the term of up to two (2) non-officer Trustees serving a critical function of the Organization beyond the two (2) consecutive terms referenced in this Section, for up to three (3) additional one-year terms.
