Dear Friends,

As Shavuot rolls around this year and we prepare to celebrate the receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai yet again, it occurs to me that we sure do spend a lot of time celebrating the Torah. We make a big deal about receiving the Torah on Shavuot. We do it all again in the fall when Simchat Torah comes and we take the Torah out of the ark, roll the scroll all the way back to the front and start



the annual cycle of the weekly Torah portions again from the beginning. We march the Torah around every Shabbat and we pass the Torah down physically at every B'nai Mitzvah celebration.

And with good reason. The Torah Scroll itself contains only five books, but the torah-at-large, the collection of our “teachings” (that’s the translation of the Hebrew word “torah”) is an enormous, unofficial collection of... everything. All of the stories, histories, commentaries, experiences and laws that make up 4,000 years of history. If it were truly all written down and put into an actual collection, it would fill cavernous libraries.

It isn't just the quantity of information that makes us want to take the Torah out of the ark and dance around — it is the beauty within that magnificent tradition. The power of knowing the stories of our people that have lasted so many thousands of years and have been compelling enough to make us WANT to pass them down to the next generation.

That's just it — that's what makes the Torah (the original scroll that we carry in our arms)

and the torah (the entirety of our tradition that we carry in our memories, minds and hearts) so worth celebrating. It's the fact that our tradition has something WORTH saying — that those millenia are filled with stories and histories that teach us what it means to build a beautiful world that is full of spirituality, meaning and hope.

At the end of the book of Deuteronomy, God reiterates the covenant and says “I make this covenant not with you alone, but also with those who are standing here today — and those who are not yet here.” This is the beauty of Torah — what makes it worth celebrating so often and so passionately. The beauty is that the Torah and all it holds makes up an anthology of everything that has come before us and it is given to us and everyone that will come after us.

So this Shavuot, as we celebrate the moment that we received the Torah at Mount Sinai so many generations ago, we remember that this gift was not just a scroll. It was a core value — to remember our stories, to pass them down, to teach our children. We celebrate Shavuot for all those who preserved our tradition for us, and we celebrate Shavuot for all those who will be the recipients of our own wisdom. May each of us, this Shavuot, learn something - and teach something - for all those who have taught us, and for all those who are not yet here.

Yom HaAtzma'ut: Celebrate Israel

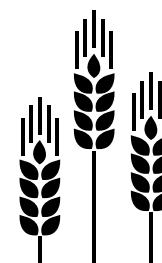
May 2nd from 10:00 am – 1:00 pm

Reopening for our Community



It is with relief and excitement that we prepare for the beginning stages of reopening our building and grounds to our community for select worship and learning experiences in May. As you know, we have used Jewish values to help us navigate through the last year, making choices that lifted up the values of keeping our community safe and united. We keep those same values in the forefront now as we share with you the details of this measured reopening and participation instructions for those who feel ready to access our in-person programming. We also reassure you that all services and regular learning opportunities will continue to be streamed.

Starting in the first part of May (details below), we will begin reopening Temple Emanuel on a controlled and limited basis to ensure safety and compliance with the health guidelines set out by our national, state, and local regulatory bodies. We are asking that masks are worn at all times in all instances when attending events at Temple, whether inside or outside on the grounds for events, and that the guidelines of social distancing are always observed. We also recommend that only people that are immunized (2 weeks past their second vaccination) attend. We ask that you have mindful social interactions and refrain from hugging or shaking hands.

With that, please pay close attention the following details, as there are some changes to the normal Shabbat schedule to accommodate safe transitions.

- **Saturday, May 8th:** Torah Study and Shabbat Community Service will open with a limited registration for in-person gathering in the Social Hall. Advance registration will be required and capped each week.
- **Saturday, May 15th:** B'nai Mitzvah ceremonies will open for in-person gatherings outside. More information on how to attend and size limits to come.
- **Friday, June 4th:** Shabbat Evening Service will open with a limited registration for in-person gathering outside. Advance registration will be required and capped each week.

Shabbat Morning Schedule

New Times — Beginning May 8, 2021

- **9:30 am** Torah Study (North Social Hall)
- **11:00 am** Shabbat Community Service (North Social Hall)

All Torah Study and Worship Experiences will continue to be streamed live at **Temple Emanuel Channel 1** and the **Temple Emanuel Denver Facebook Page**.

NOTE: Young Family Shabbat will no longer occur weekly. Stay tuned for more information about our exciting Young Family Shabbat summer experiences.

Shabbat Morning Attendance and Registration

- Shabbat Morning Torah Study and Community Service will take place in the North Social Hall.
- We will start with an in-person capacity limit of 40 people for both Torah Study and the Shabbat Morning Community service.
- Registration will be required, and registration requests can be submitted through an online form. The link will be available in eNotes each week.
- Every individual must submit a separate registration request for each service or experience. Only one person can be included on each registration submission. (For example, if you are a two person household and both want to attend an event, you will need to fill out the form twice, once for each person).
- The links to the registration forms will be included weekly in the eNotes for the following four weeks.
- If you are observing a *yahrzeit*, you will be able to note that on the Community Service Registration Request form.
- **Submitting a registration request is not a confirmation.** You will receive an email once your registration has been confirmed (generally Friday before that particular Shabbat).
- Please limit your registration requests to two Shabbat mornings in May so that we may accommodate different people each week.

Torah Study and the Shabbat Community Service are two distinct and different experiences that require separate registration requests. We know that these experiences attract different populations and that many people will choose one or the other. If you would like to attend both, that means you need to fill out **TWO separate registration requests**. And, for example - if you are submitting a registration request for a spouse/another person, and you would like to attend both, you should be filling out **FOUR** separate registration requests.



All services will continue to be streamed virtually. Please stay tuned for more detailed information on how and when to register, what to know when you come, and more updates on future openings.

We are incredibly appreciative of the support and connection that has gotten us through this year together and we look forward with gratitude and excitement to being together in person again.

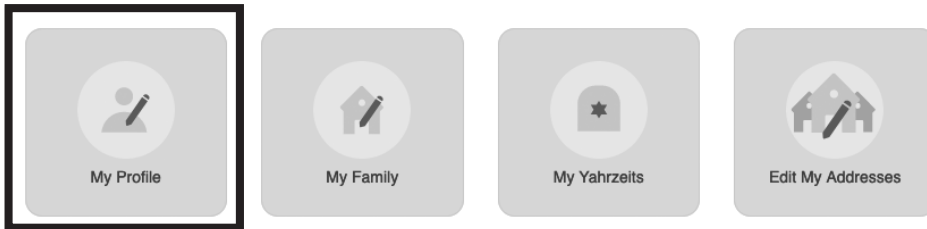
Click the temporary Set Password link to set your new personal Temple Emanuel member password in the email you received.

After setting your new password, you will be taken to your Account page. Click on the "My Profile" tile to view the information on file.

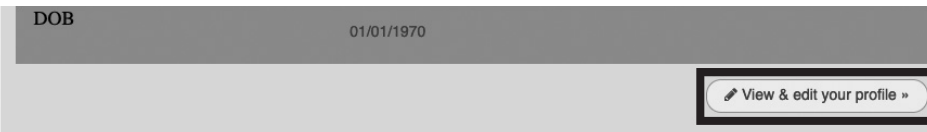

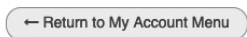
